Quarterly Activities & Cash Flow Report Quarter ended 31 March 2019

Sydney, Australia, 30 April 2019: OncoSil Medical Ltd (ASX: OSL) (**OncoSil** or the **Company**), a medical device company focused on localised treatments for patients with pancreatic and liver cancer, today released its Appendix 4C – Quarterly Cashflow report for the quarter ended 31 March 2019 (the **Quarter** or **3Q19**). All financial results are in Australian dollars and are unaudited.

CE Marking Update

Meeting with BSI and COC

As previously announced to the market, at this stage, a final determination with respect to the Company's CE Marking application has yet to be made. BSI has put the CE Marking File on hold pending a meeting between the Company, the Clinical Oversight Committee (**COC**) and BSI. This meeting is currently being organised.

The Company has a clear understanding of the issues with respect to its CE Marking application and is in the process of preparing a detailed response to the COC's initial assessment and a revised Clinical Evaluation Report (**CER**). The Company is working with its regulatory and clinical experts ahead of the meeting with the COC and BSI.

Leading international experts, including pre-eminent European oncologists are providing guidance and support for OncoSil's COC response and revision to the CER. Several of whom will attend on behalf of the Company at the upcoming COC meeting.

The Company is pleased and encouraged to have the support of these leading experts, and continues to believe that its application meets all requirements for CE Mark certification per BSI directives, AIMDD regulations and MEDDEV requirements.

The Company will keep the market informed of developments with respect to the COC meeting and response process and final CE Marking decision.

Corporate and Financial

During the Quarter, the Company had cash outflows from operations of \$2.8m, resulting in a cash balance as at 31 March 2019 of A\$10.2m.

As a precaution, OncoSil will be operating under a revised business plan while it awaits the outcome of the CE Marking decision. The Company is targeting a reduction in the Company's annualised cash cost base through reductions to operating expenditure, R&D expenditures and a pause on any new clinical trial and study activities until certainty around the CE Marking is achieved.

The Company has decided to pursue this course of action, with the aim of strengthening its position and maximising long-term shareholder value with respect to the road ahead.

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About OncoSil

OncoSil Medical is a medical device company seeking to advance radiation for cancer patients. OncoSil Medical's lead product, OncoSil™ is a targeted radioactive isotope (Phosphorous-32), implanted directly into a patient's pancreatic tumours via an endoscopic ultrasound.

Treatment with OncoSil™ is intended to deliver more concentrated and localised beta radiation compared to external beam radiation. OncoSil Medical has conducted four clinical studies with encouraging results on tolerability, safety and efficacy. A CE Mark application to commercially sell OncoSil™ in the European Union (EU) is under review with commercial launch, subject to approval.

An Investigational Device Exemption (IDE) has been granted by the United States Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to conduct a clinical study of the OncoSil™ device aimed at supporting a PMA approval. Pancreatic cancer is typically diagnosed at a later stage, when there is a poor prognosis for long-term survival. The World Cancer Research Fund estimated that in 2012, 338,000 people globally were diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. The prognosis for patients diagnosed with pancreatic cancer, regardless of stage, is generally poor; the relative five-year survival rate for all stages combined is approximately 5%. The estimated world-wide market opportunity for OncoSil™ in pancreatic cancer exceeds \$1b.

Hepatocellular carcinoma (HCC) or liver cancer, is the 6th most common cancer in the world with 782,000 new cases diagnosed in 2012. While hepatocellular carcinoma can be treated by surgery or transplantation, the majority of patients with HCC have disease which is too advanced for surgery and their survival ranges from a few months to two or more years. The value of the hepatocellular cancer market is expected to triple in size to \$1.4b by 2019.
