8.6.1	Does the entity expect that it will continue to have the current level of net operating cash flows for the time being and, if not, why not?	
	Answer: In April 2024, BlueBet announced a transformational acquisition of NTD Pty Ltd (betr) which will create a leading Australian online wagering company. This will deliver to BlueBet increased scale, market share, significant operational synergies and a platform for further organic and inorganic growth. Completion is subject to a number of conditions precedent which were outlined in the Company's ASX announcement on 11 April 2024. Post the transition of betr onto BlueBet technology in H1-25, the company expects to be EBITDA positive in FY25.	

8.6.2 Has the entity taken any steps, or does it propose to take any steps, to raise further cash to fund its operations and, if so, what are those steps and how likely does it believe that they will be successful?

Answer: In addition to the merger outlined above in 8.6.1, BlueBet announced it was also undertaking a fully underwritten two-tranche conditional placement to raise gross proceeds of approximately \$20.0 million to fund operational and strategic growth initiatives of the combined business and one-off synergy realisation and transaction costs. The placement was successfully completed on 12 April 2024, with strong support from existing and new shareholders.

8.6.3 Does the entity expect to be able to continue its operations and to meet its business objectives and, if so, on what basis?

Answer: Yes. The additional funding, together with the acquisition of betr, will further the company's ability to continue operations profitably and meet its business objectives.
