Tarcoola drilling program commences

WPG Resources Ltd (ASX:WPG) is pleased to advise that it has commenced a program of RC drilling at the Warrigal prospect, a high priority exploration area on the Tarcoola mining lease in close proximity to the Tarcoola gold mine.

A large RC drill target (chargeability anomaly) was identified during an IP (Induced Polarisation) survey and soil sampling survey completed in the March 2017 quarter (detailed in the Company's March 2017 Quarterly Activities Report released on ASX on 28 April 2017).

The drilling program, which was planned for the September quarter has been brought forward due to the timely availability of a drill rig.




Figure 1 – Warrigal untested IP anomaly (3D chargeability shells) and historical drill hole traces

The RC target, located within close proximity of the Tarcoola gold mine is shown in Figure 1.




Figure 2 – Warrigal Prospect conceptual model for mineralisation
