

Union Extended Environmental Studies Now Complete

Sydney, 30 April 2018: The board of Ark Mines Ltd (**ASX:AHK**) is pleased to announce the company has now completed the final environmental work required at the Union Extended (**UE**) project, to complete the UE mining management plan (**MMP**) (see AHK's 03/10/2017 announcement).

The UE environmental work was undertaken over the last few weeks by Northern Resource Consultants Group (NRCG), on site at the UE project. The work undertaken included a comprehensive:

- groundwater study;
- soils study;
- flora study; and
- fauna study.

AHK's Managing Director, Roger Jackson said:

"It is pleasing to have finally completed the environmental study which has been delayed by unprecedented rains. This is the last critical component of the Union Extended Mine Management Plan. We will now focus on getting the MMP finalised and submitted as soon as possible".

The recently completed studies will support previous work undertaken by NRCG at UE including:

- Groundwater modelling of the UE gold processing project;
- tailings management;
- calibration of the site water balance;
- water monitoring program;
- gold plant design;
- tailings characterisation;
- tailings dam design; and
- infrastructure design.
