BONANZA GOLD GRADES (Avg 93.8g/t) CONTINUE FROM EDIE CREEK VEIN

Niuminco Group Limited (“Niuminco” or “the Company”) is pleased to announce that further **bonanza grades of 93.8g/t gold (average) have continued from the sampling of the recently discovered vein** in the Ingopae area of Edie Creek, approximately 200metres south of the camp compound (see Figure1 below).

Niuminco’s team have continued to bulk-sample this narrow, northeast-southwest trending vein in both directions along strike and deeper down strike over the past week.

Additionally, **another parallel vein has been discovered approximately 10metres to the south-east of this vein**, and is currently being sampled, despite heavy rain interrupting sampling operations over the past two days.

Over the five days from 13 to 17 September, 2018:

- **a further 10 tonnes of the vein material has produced 938.6g (30.2 ounces) of gold and 765.9g (24.6ounces) of silver from 3,3814g of wet amalgam.**

Waste material from immediately beside the vein was also run through the ball mill on 16 September (38 tonnes) and 17 September (50 tonnes) for testing purposes, producing only 5.9g and 7.9g gold respectively.

Managing Director, Tracey Lake commented;

“Processing of the material from this narrow vein over the past week has produced very encouraging, high-grade gold results as well as increasing our knowledge and confidence in this area of the Edie Creek valley floor.

We look forward to further high-grade gold results from this and the nearby parallel vein, in the days ahead, which will supplement the development work currently being undertaken at the Edie Lode and Surmans vein systems.”
