Completion of previously announced acquisition

Propel Funeral Partners Limited (ASX: PFP) (**Propel**) confirms that, further to its ASX announcement dated 18 October 2019, it has:

- completed the acquisition of the business trading as Grahams Funeral Services, and certain freehold properties, in the North Island of New Zealand; and
- issued 227,510 ordinary shares to a related entity of the vendors, all of which are subject to voluntary escrow arrangements for up to 36 months from today. Further information in relation to the issue of these escrowed shares are provided in the Appendix 3B and the Cleansing Statements released to the ASX today.

Following the issue of the above ordinary shares, Propel has 98,735,427 ordinary shares on issue.
