Pacific Current Group Limited - Request for Trading Halt

Pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 17.1, Pacific Current Group Limited (**PAC**) (ASX Code: PAC) requests an immediate trading halt be granted by ASX in respect of PAC's ordinary shares from commencement of trading on Friday, 6 December 2019.

In accordance with ASX Listing Rule 17.1, PAC provides the following information:

- (a) **Reason for trading halt:** the trading halt is requested in order to allow PAC to undertake a proposed capital raising.
- (b) **Duration of the trading halt:** PAC requests that the trading halt continue until the earlier of such time as it makes an announcement to the market in relation to the outcome of the capital raising (**Announcement**) or the commencement of trading on Tuesday, 10 December 2019.
- (c) **Termination of the trading halt:** PAC anticipates that the trading halt will cease upon it making an Announcement to the market.
- (d) **No reason:** PAC is not aware of any reason why the trading halt should not be granted by ASX.
- (e) **Further information:** PAC is not aware of any further information which needs to be disclosed to the market at the time of seeking the trading halt.
