Appendix 4C Release – Quarter to 31 December 2019

- 254% increase in like-for-like Net Operating Cash Flow on prior quarter
- 148% increase in Free Cash Flow on prior quarter
- Annualised FY20 run-rate EBITDA as at Dec 2019 above stated \$32M (pro forma)
- Cash reserves increased by 22% on prior quarter to \$33.6M

28 January **2020**: Uniti Group Limited (ASX: UWL) ("Company") is pleased to provide an overview of its December 2019 quarter cash flow and cash position, as reflected in the Appendix 4C which accompanies this announcement.

Highlights;

- Positive Net Operating Cash Flow of \$3.8M in the December quarter, before \$1.3M of restructuring costs, a 254% increase on the prior quarter, on a like for like basis.
- Free Cash Flow (Net Operating Cash Flow less Capital Expenditure) increased by 148% on the prior quarter, illustrating the strong cash generation credentials of LBNCo, acquired on 30 September 2019, and OPENetworks and 1300 Australia (part-period contributions only), acquired by UWL in the December quarter.
- Growth-related capital expenditure in the Wholesale & Infrastructure business unit was higher than forecast in the December quarter, due to a particularly active period of fibre network deployments in contracted green-field developments.
- The acquisitions of LBN Co, OPENetworks and 1300 Australia contributed positively to Net
 Operating Cash Flow in the December quarter, with each performing at or above
 management forecast levels. Notably, the OPENetworks and 1300 Australia acquisitions
 were completed during the period and contributed to UWL's operating cash flows for two
 months and one month, only, respectively.
- The strong operating performance of the consolidated UWL group during the period is evidenced by the December 2019 run-rate EBITDA (excluding the one-off restructuring costs noted above), annualised, being above the \$32M (pro-forma) FY20 EBITDA stated at UWL's Investor Day on 4 December 2019.
- An oversubscribed placement and rights issue of new UWL shares was completed in the December quarter, raising \$85M (before costs) at \$1.62 per new share issued. The funds raised were applied principally to finance the cash component of the 1300 Australia acquisition (net cash paid of \$58M) and transaction-related expenses.
- Surplus funds from the December capital raising were added to UWL's cash reserves, to enable it to continue to actively pursue its inorganic growth strategy, via acquisition of businesses which align with the Company's stated strategic agenda.
- The Company ended the December quarter with \$33.6M in cash, an increase of 22% over the prior quarter, providing further financial capacity to pursue its aggressive growth agenda.





Summary;

In the December 2019 quarter, UWL generated a 254% increase in Net Operating Cash Flows, through its existing operations and from (only part-period) contributions from the new acquisitions completed during the quarter. The addition of LBNCo, OPENetworks and 1300 Australia to the UWL Group has delivered a step-change in both operating cash flow and earnings. This, combined with its now larger and more diversified income streams, significant cash reserves and strong executive leadership team, places UWL in an enviable position to continue its current organic growth and growth-by-acquisition momentum in 2020.

UWL wishes to advises shareholders that its FY20 Half Year results are scheduled to be released on 24 February 2020.
