 - o Net investing cash inflows for the December quarter were \$1.906m.
 - o Nil financing cash flows for the December quarter.

The Company continues to strategically deploy its capital in its property portfolio including its Double Bay project in Sydney, Currie Street project in Adelaide and Butler Central project in Perth, as well as investigating new opportunities expected to generate superior returns.
