Your Directors present their report on the consolidated entity consisting of PTB Group Limited ("the Company") and the entities it controlled at the end of, or during, the half year ended 31 December 2019.

Review and Results of Operations

PTB Group Limited's profit before tax, excluding FX gains/losses and acquisition related costs (NPBTFX), for the period to 31 December 2019 was \$3.289 million (Dec 2018: \$2.940 million). This result exceeded the top end of the previously provided NPBTFX guidance of \$2.9 to \$3.1 million for the half year by 6.1%.

Net profit after tax for the half year was \$1.481 million (Dec 2018: \$2.270 million) after the inclusion of \$0.612 million of acquisition costs and \$0.137 million of net foreign exchange losses (Dec 2018: \$0.257 million net gain). Total revenue was \$26.096 million (Dec 2018: \$23.767 million). At period end, net assets for the group were \$52.441 million (Jun 2019: \$50.966 million).

On 31 January 2020, the Group entered into a binding agreement to acquire Prime Turbines LLC, an established US based MRO provider for US\$21 million (approx. \$31.204 million), and inventory from CT Aerospace, a provider of aviation spare parts and inventory, for carrying value, estimated at US\$8.5 million (approx.. \$12.630 million). Prime Turbines is an established US based independent aircraft engine maintenance, repair and overhaul company and is expected to expand on PTB's existing presence in the US aviation services market.

Dividends

A 2.5 cents per share interim dividend has been declared for the 30 June 2020 financial year. The dividend will be paid on 2 March 2020. A dividend of 7 cents per share was paid during the June 2019 year.

1. Basis of Preparation of Half Year Report

This general purpose consolidated interim financial report for the half year reporting period ended 31 December 2019 has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standard AASB 134: *Interim Financial Reporting* and the *Corporations Act 2001*.

This interim financial report is intended to provide users with an update on the latest annual financial statements of PTB Group Limited and its controlled entities (referred to as the "Consolidated Group" or "Group"). As such, it does not contain information that represents relatively insignificant changes occurring during the half year within the Group. It is therefore recommended that this financial report be read in conjunction with the annual financial statements of the Group for the year ended 30 June 2019, together with any public announcements made during the half year.

The interim financial report was authorised for issue on 26 February 2020.

The financial report is presented in Australian dollars and all values are rounded to the nearest thousand dollars (\$000) unless otherwise stated under the option available in ASIC Corporations (Rounding in Financial/Directors' Reports) Instrument 2016/191.

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

a) New and Amended Standards Adopted by the Group

AASB 16 Leases

The Group has adopted AASB 16 Leases from 1 July 2019. The standard replaces existing accounting requirements under AASB 117 Leases and eliminates the classification between operating and finance leases, introducing a single lessee accounting model.

Previously, leases were classified based on their nature as either finance leases or operating leases. Finance leases were recognised in the Consolidated Statement of Financial Position and operating leases were recognised on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

Under AASB 16, the Group's accounting for operating leases as a lessee will now result in the recognition of a right-of-use (ROU) asset and a corresponding lease liability, with the exception of short term leases under 12 months and where the underlying ROU asset is of a low value. The lease liability will represent the present value of future lease payments. There will be a separate recognition of the depreciation charge on the ROU asset and interest expense on the lease liability.

The Group adopted AASB 16 using the modified retrospective method of adoption. The reclassifications and adjustments arising from the new leasing standard are therefore recognised in the opening statement of financial position on 1 July 2019. As the Group adopted this approach, there was no restatement of previous financial statements required. When applying this modified approach, the Group has elected to apply practical expedients allowed under the standard, including the use of hindsight in determining the lease term where the contract contains options to extend the lease. The group has also elected not to reassess whether a contract is, or contains a lease at the date of initial application. Instead, for contracts entered into before the transition date the group relied on its assessment made applying AASB 117.

On adoption of AASB 16, the Group recognised lease liabilities in relation to leases which had previously been classified as an operating lease under AASB 117 Leases. These liabilities were measured at the present value of the remaining lease payments, discounted using the incremental borrowing rate at date of transition.

On 29 June 2007, PTB Group Limited and all of its subsidiaries, excluding PTB Finance Limited and Pacific Turbine Inc, entered into an arrangement as parties to a deed of cross guarantee under which each company guarantees the debts of the others. By entering into the deed, the wholly owned entities have been relieved from the requirements to prepare a financial report and Directors' Report under ASIC legislative instrument 2016/785 (as amended) issued by the Australian Securities and Investments Commission.

9. Deferred Tax Assets

A deferred tax asset of \$1.085 million (30 June 2019: \$1.618 million) has been recognised at 31 December 2019. This includes \$0.002 million attributable to prior years' income tax losses carried forward (30 June 2019: \$0.530 million). Based on management forecast of expected future taxable profits and the reversal of the temporary differences, it is considered probable that these deferred tax assets will be recovered in the future.

10. Segment Information

a) Description of Segments

The Group has four reportable segments:

- **PTB:** Covering the operations of the holding company PTB Group Limited, specialising in PT6 and TPE331 Turboprop engines. The business repairs and sells PT6 and TPE331 engines, maintains related engines under contract, and trades in related engine and airframe parts.
- **PT USA**: This covers the operations of Pacific Turbine USA, LLC specialising in PT6 Turboprop engines. The business repairs and sells PT6 engines, maintains related engines under contract, and trades in related engine parts.
- **PT Leasing:** Covers the operation of Pacific Turbine Leasing Pty Ltd. This business is an aircraft and engine owner and leases aircraft and engines to operators under both operating and finance leases.
- IAP: Covering the operations of IAP Group Australia Pty Ltd, trading in aircraft, jet aircraft engines, airframes and related parts.

b) Geographical Segments (Secondary Reporting)

The Group's management and operations are based in: Brisbane, Australia for PTB and PT Leasing; Sydney, Australia for IAP; and Miami, Florida, USA for PT USA. Its customers, however, are located in six main geographical markets – Australia/PNG/New Zealand, Pacific Islands, America, Asia, Africa and Europe.

Segment assets include rental engines and aircraft which are attributed either to the geographic market in which the customer who rents the engine or aircraft at year-end is based or, for non-rented engines and aircraft, where they are physically located.

The following tables outline the distribution of the Group's sales, adjusted EBITDA, assets and liabilities by those geographical markets by business segment.

13. Events after the Balance Date

On 31 January 2020, the Group entered into a binding agreement to acquire Prime Turbines LLC, an established US based MRO provider for US\$21 million (approx.. \$31.204 million), and inventory from CT Aerospace, a provider of aviation spare parts and inventory, for carrying value, estimated at US\$8.5 million (approx. \$12.630 million). Prime Turbines is an established US based independent aircraft engine maintenance, repair and overhaul company and is expected to expand on PTB's existing presence in the US aviation services market.

To fund the acquisition, the Group raised \$34.9 million, comprising a fully committed placement and a fully underwritten 1 for 2.35 pro-rata non-renounceable entitlement offer of fully paid ordinary shares in PTB to eligible shareholders. Proceeds of the equity raising will also help fund associated acquisition and equity raising costs and provide additional working capital for the acquired business.

As at 31 December 2019, the Group had incurred \$620k of acquisition related costs. \$8k of these costs were associated with the capital raising and have been capitalised accordingly in the Statement of Financial Position.

Subject to certain contractual conditions, the acquisitions are expected to be completed by the end of February 2020. For further details, please refer to the Group's related market announcements on 31 January 2020.

There are no other matters or circumstances that have arisen since the end of the interim reporting period which have significantly affected or may significantly affect the operations of the consolidated entity, the results of those operations, or the state of affairs of the consolidated entity in future years.
