

# MARINER CORPORATION LIMITED MARCH 2020 QUARTERLY ACTIVITIES REPORT AND APPENDIX 4C

Mariner Corporation Limited (ASX: MCX) (**Company**) is pleased to provide an Activities Report and Appendix 4C for the quarter ending 31 March 2020.

### Details of its business activities in the quarter

As shareholders would be aware, the Company completed a \$2.4m placement (before costs) in late 2019. The completion of this capital raising was important for the Company, as it allowed the Company to fully discharge and/or restructure its existing debt. As a result, the Company's financial position has significantly improved, and provided the Company and its management the flexibility to focus on identifying and exploring growth opportunities.

This was the first full quarter that the Company's refreshed Board has worked together, which is an exciting milestone for the Company.

#### During the quarter:

- (a) Operations review and investments strategy: The Board and its management undertook a review of the Company's operations, which sets the strategy for the Company moving forward. As part of this review, the Company identified and considered diversified investment opportunities, primarily in the financial services sector. The Board remains cognisant of the challenges presented by COVID-19, however, remains focussed on identifying growth opportunities for the Company and its shareholders.
  - At this stage, the Company is considering opening an overseas subsidiary office in Asia, which will allow the Company to positively leverage on the Board's significant local and international experience in the financial services and investments sector, and take steps, to build on the Company's future as a diversified investments company.
  - The Board will continue to progress its operations review and investments strategy this quarter.
- (b) Measures to address COVID-19 risks: The Board and its management has taken steps to mitigate against any potential impact of COVID-19 on its operations and work practices. At this stage, the Company does not consider that COVID-19 will have a material impact on its operations.
- (c) Other quarterly activity report requirements: The quarter was not included in a period covered by a "use of funds". The Company made Director fee payments to its Directors, which are captured in section 6 of the Appendix 4C.
