Aus Tin Mining Ltd entered into a Convertible Security Funding Agreement (CFSA) with The Australian Special Opportunity Fund LP for an aggregate of \$3.5 million that had a face value of \$4.2 million. The Convertible Notes issued under the CFSA are secured by a General Security Agreement over the Company and guarantee and indemnities from its wholly owned subsidiaries. Since the series of drawdowns, the CFSA has been partially repaid via the allotment of shares. As at 31 March 2020, the balance outstanding on the facility was \$2.5 million.

Pursuant to a letter of financial support dated 12 March 2020, the Company's major shareholder, DGR Global Ltd has agreed to provide conditional financial support up to a maximum of \$500,000 if required until such time the Company completes a capital raising. The financial support is provided on an unsecured basis, but any advances or payments provided are subject to approvals processes by DGR Global Ltd.

 - Does the entity expect that it will continue to have the current level of net operating cash flows for the time being and, if not, why not?

Answer: No, the Company has announced the proposed sale of the Granville Tin Mine which is anticipated to settle on or around 31 May 2020, and which has accounted for the majority of the Company's expenditure during the past three years, but which will not be further incurred upon completion. Furthermore, the Company has implemented a range of measures in light of its treasury and as a response to the COVID-19 situation to reduce its cash expenditures.

From 1 March 2020, the Board and Management of the Company agreed to a 25% reduction of their remuneration through to 30 September, and continue to accrue the balance to be met by way of share issue from time to time as part of the Company's strategy to preserve its treasury. Administrative fees for back-office management also continue to be accrued.

2. Has the entity taken any steps, or does it propose to take any steps, to raise further cash to fund its operations and, if so, what are those steps and how likely does it believe that they will be successful?

Answer: As announced on 23 April 2020, the Company has executed a Term Sheet to effect the disposal of the Granville Tin Mine which will result in the Company receiving \$1m in cash in the next Quarter.

3. Does the entity expect to be able to continue its operations and to meet its business objectives and, if so, on what basis?

Answer: Yes, for the reasons outlined in Questions 1 and 2, the Company expects to have further working capital in due course via the sale of Granville and any potential future equity raisings sufficient to continue to fund its operations and meet its business objectives. In the interim, the Company has a letter of financial support (as described above in Section 7) for any necessary expenditures.
