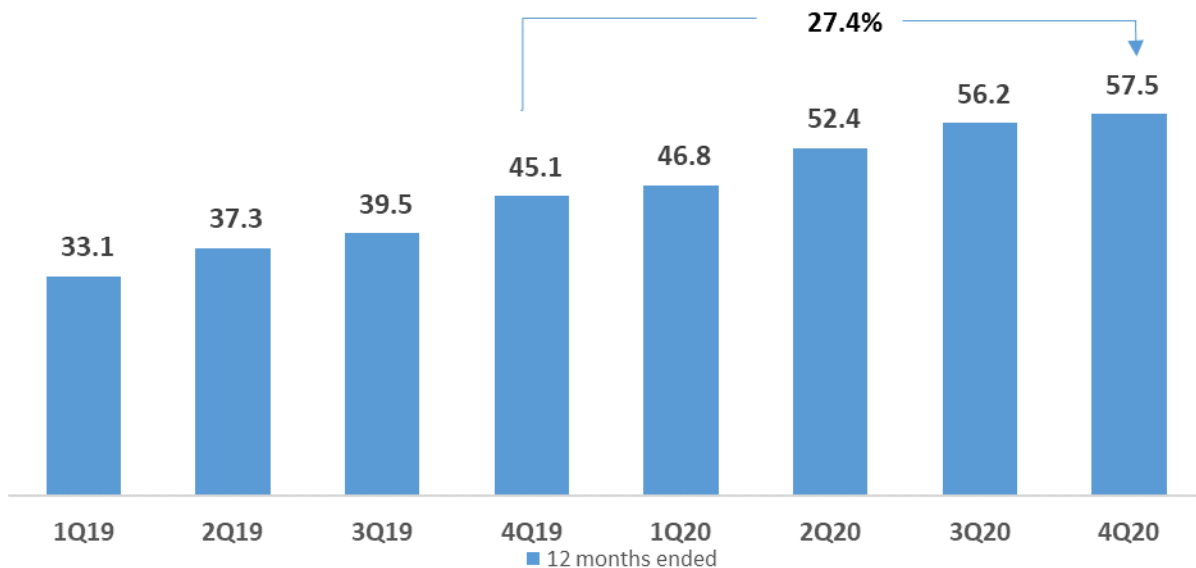

Fourth Quarter Cash Report – Record annual cash receipts and well capitalised for growth

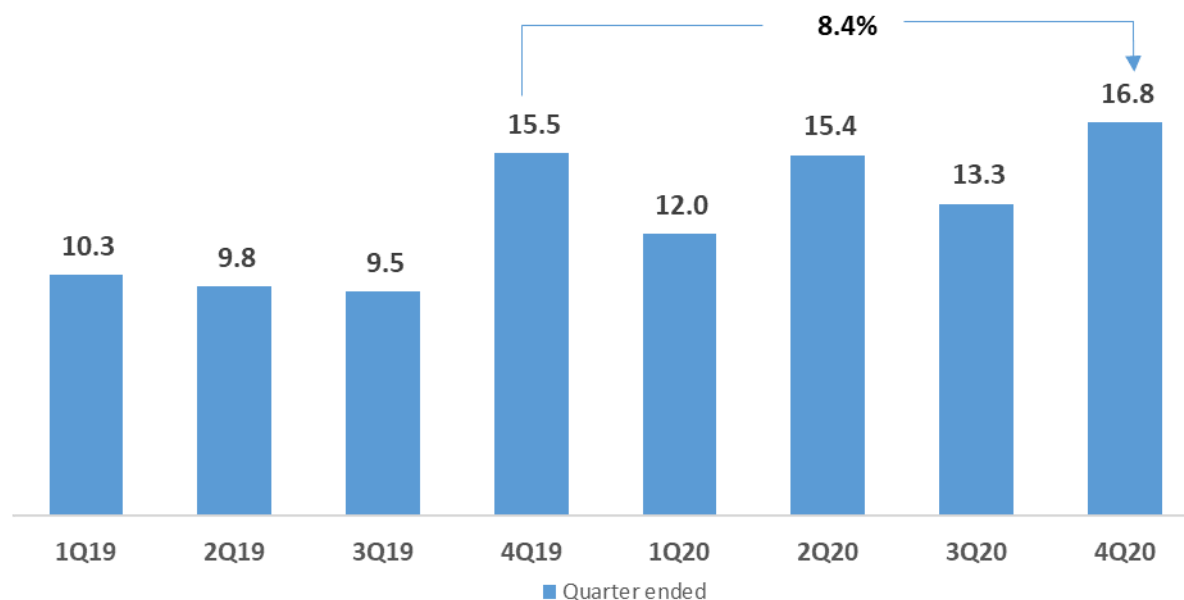
Highlights

- Record level of annual cash receipts of **\$57.5m** through FY20, up **27.4%** on FY19
- Cash receipts of **\$16.8m** for Q4FY20, up **26.2%** on the previous quarter and **8.4%** above Q4FY19
- Closing cash balance of **\$139.9m** with no debt at 30 June 2020 ensuring ELMO remains well capitalised to continue investing in organic growth and execute strategic acquisitions
- Release of new module - ELMO Connect
- Successful capital raise, consisting of \$70m institutional placement and \$2.8m Share Purchase Plan
- Inclusion in S&P/ASX300 Index

ELMO Software Limited (“ELMO”) CEO, Danny Lessem said, “Despite the challenges associated with COVID-19, ELMO continued its growth trajectory in the fourth quarter.

Cash receipts for the full year FY20 reached a record \$57.5m, up 27.4% on FY19. Cash collection of \$16.8m in Q4FY20 reflected an increase of 26.2% on the previous quarter and 8.4% on Q4FY19.

During the quarter, ELMO announced the launch of ELMO Connect, a new communications module allowing businesses to instant message and initiate Zoom Conference calls from within ELMO’s cloud-based platform.

In May, we announced the successful completion of a fully underwritten A\$70m institutional placement, followed by the completion of a \$2.8m Share Purchase Plan in June. These new funds leave ELMO well placed to strengthen our competitive position and continue our growth trajectory. We have an active acquisition pipeline and remain well capitalised, with a closing cash balance of \$139.9m.

On June 22, ELMO reached an important milestone, being admitted to the S&P/ASX300 Index. The index inclusion is an important step in ELMO’s evolution as a listed company.

We continue to actively manage COVID-19 related risks to our workforce and community, with an appropriate mix of remote and office-based working depending on the location.

ELMO's focus remains on delivering organic growth supplemented with strategic acquisitions, continuing our growth trajectory into FY21 and beyond. We are well placed to benefit from the acceleration in the adoption of cloud-based business tools, including HR technology."

ELMO advises that it will release its FY20 full year results pre-market open on **6 August 2020**, and details of the webcast will be released to the ASX on 20<sup>th</sup> of July.

Established in 2002, ELMO is a cloud-based HR & Payroll software provider. The Company offers customers a unified platform to streamline processes for HR, and also manage payroll and rostering / time & attendance. ELMO operates on a Software as a Service ("SaaS") business model based on recurrent subscription revenues. Fees paid to directors totalled \$248,000 for the period.
