#### **CONVERTIBLE LOAN FACILITY**

The Convertible Note Facility (CNF) initially taken out with Jun Moon Limited for \$1,000,000 was assigned during the year to various new investors. The CNF is fully drawn and contains the following conditions;

- Repayable within 36 months of execution date (07 January 2017) or any other date as agreed (subsequently agreed to defer to 7 January 2022),
- Interest shall accrue at a rate of 8% per annum,
- At the lender's discretion, all or a proportion of the advance, and any or all accrued interest thereon shall be applied to the subscription of shares by the lender at a price of \$0.05 per share.

### Standby Subscription Agreement

The Facility Arrangement with LKC Technology Pty Limited is a five year agreement for \$250,000. Announced on 29 April 2020.

 The facility investor agrees to subscribe to shares if requested by the company subject to the terms and conditions of the Facility agreement. A drawdown will have fully paid ordinary shares issued at the value of the drawdown notice at a price of 80% of the 5 day VWAP prior to issue.
