Operating earnings is a financial measure which represents profit under Australian Accounting Standards adjusted for net fair value movements, non-cash accounting adjustments such as straight lining of rental income and amortisations and other unrealised or one-off items that are not in the ordinary course of business or are capital in nature. Operating earnings includes the rental revenue recognised in respect of tenants who have been (or will be) provided with rent free incentives as a result of COVID-19. This approach is consistent with the REIT's treatment of rent free incentives provided in the ordinary course of its operations which are amortised over the term of the lease. The inclusion of operating earnings as a measure of the REIT's profitability provides investors with the same basis that is used internally for evaluating operating segment performance. Operating earnings is used by the Board to make strategic decisions and as a guide to assessing an appropriate distribution to declare. A reconciliation of the REIT's statutory profit to operating earnings is provided in Note A1 of the consolidated interim financial statements.

The REIT recorded a statutory profit of \$198.6 million on for the period ended 31 December 2020 (31 December 2019: \$80.5 million). Operating earnings amounted to \$73.6 million for the period ended 31 December 2020 (31 December 2019: \$52.2 million).

The REIT's statutory accounting profit of \$198.6 million includes a number of unrealised, non-cash and capital items including:

- \$125.6 million of net fair value gain on investment properties;
- \$3.6 million of straight lining of rental income, amortisation of lease fees and incentives;
- (\$1.6) million of unrealised gains and realised losses on derivative financial instruments;
- (\$2.0) million of acquisition related costs;
- (\$0.3) million of provision for rent relief relating to COVID-19;
- (\$0.2) million of income support and development rebate; and
- (\$0.2) million of fair value movements on investments at fair value through profit or loss.

Details of Distribution Reinvestment Plan

The REIT has established a Distribution Reinvestment Plan (DRP) under which unitholders may elect to have all or part of their distribution entitlements satisfied by the issues of new securities rather than being paid in cash.

The DRP issue price is determined at a discount of 1.0% to the daily volume weighted average price of all securities traded on the ASX during the 10 business days commencing on the third business day following the distribution record date. During the period, the REIT raised \$5.1 million from the DRP for the quarter ended 30 June 2020 allotted on 14 August 2020. The REIT raised a further \$6.3 million from the DRP for the quarter ended 30 September 2020 allotted on 13 November 2020 (2019: \$5.8 million from the DRP for 30 September 2019 allotted on 14 November 2019). An additional \$4.5 million is expected to be raised from the DRP for the 31 December 2020 distribution to be allotted on 12 February 2021 (2019: \$4.6 million from the DRP for the 31 December 2019 allotted on 14 February 2020).
