Kyckr Limited (ASX: KYK) Change of Auditor

Kyckr Limited (ASX: KYK) ("Kyckr" or the "Company") advises that it has received resignation of Auditor from Nexia Sydney Partnership on 9 February 2021.

At the Annual General Meeting of Kyckr shareholders on 16 November 2020 it was resolved to appoint Nexia Sydney Audit Pty Limited as auditor of the Company subject to the consent of ASIC to the resignation of Nexia Sydney Partnership.

Kyckr received confirmation of ASIC's consent to the resignation of Nexia Sydney Partnership on 5 February 2021 and written resignation was received on 9 February 2021.

The reason for the change in Auditor arises from the corporate restructure of Nexia requiring all Nexia Sydney Partnership clients to be transferred to Nexia Sydney Audit Pty Limited.

Additional information

An auditor holds office until death, disqualification, resignation or removal from office. Therefore if an auditor retires and cancels his/her registration then they are automatically disqualified from office under section 324. If they retire and retain their registration they hold office until they resign or are removed in accordance with s329 - in these circumstances the auditor needs ASIC's consent to resign if they are the auditor of a public company.

For removal of auditors:

All companies must have lodged with ASIC, a copy of the special notice of intent to propose a resolution to remove the auditor, (s329(2)).

For proprietary companies that hold an Australian financial services licence ASIC consent to the removal is required (s.990F) using Form FS07 *Application for consent from ASIC to remove an auditor of an Australian financial services licensee*. Refer to Regulatory Guide 26 *Resignation, removal and replacement of auditors* (RG 26) for full details (paragraphs RG 26.77 to RG 26.82 specifically relate to requirements for AFS licensees).

If the company is a credit licensee and maintains one or more trust accounts, the credit licensee should apply for approval to replace the trust account auditor using Form CL17 *Australian Credit Licence - Application for approval from ASIC to replace a trust account auditor.*

For resignation of auditors:

If the company is a public company, the auditor must first obtain ASIC consent to their resignation. Once consent has been granted, ASIC will advise both the auditor and the company in writing.

A resignation that does not take effect at the public company's next AGM, will only take effect on the day, following ASIC's consent, when the matters in RG 26.17 are addressed and the following disclosure requirements are made by the public company:

- if the company is a disclosing entity, the company must give a continuous disclosure notice, that would not deal with other matters, to ASIC and any relevant market operator for the company (RG 26.59 and RG 26.60); and
- if the company is <u>not</u> a disclosing entity, the company must give notice to the company's members (RG 26.61):
 - by a public notice displayed prominently on the company's website where the notice can reasonably be readily located and accessed by members of the company;
 - · by email; or
 - in writing.

In both instances, the notice must contain:

- · details of the outgoing auditor,
- · details of the proposed incoming auditor, and
- the reason for the change in auditor.

For proprietary companies that hold an Australian financial services licence, separate ASIC consent to the resignation is required, (s990G) using Form FS08 *Application for consent from ASIC to resign as an auditor of an Australian financial services licensee.* Refer to Regulatory Guide 26 *Resignation, removal and replacement of auditors* (RG 26) for full details (paragraphs RG 26.77 to RG 26.82 specifically relate to requirements for AFS licensees).

If the company is a credit licensee and maintains one or more trust accounts, the trust account auditor should apply for approval to resign using Form CL18 *Australian Credit Licence - Application for approval from ASIC to resign as a trust account auditor.*
