Commentary on Activities for June 2021 Quarter

Vectus' Phase I/IB trial has received approval from the Human Research Ethics Committee of the Alfred Hospital, Melbourne. The trial has been registered on the Clinical Trials Protocol Registration and Results Systems (ClinicalTrials.gov), and been provided with the identifier NCT04925050. The trial may be tracked using this number on the ClinicalTrials.gov public website.

As this is a first-in-human trial, the usual protocol in SAD studies is to dose a sentinel group comprising one placebo and one active on day 1, and, if there are no adverse events, to then proceed on the subsequent day(s) to dose the remaining six members of a cohort. The sentinel subjects have now been dosed and dosing of the remainder of the cohort will be completed within a week.

Patents

The Company has received notices of grant of the patent covering both compositions and methods of use for VB4-A32 and its related group of compounds from Israel. These compounds have shown efficacy in treating liver fibrosis in animal models. The patents covering VB0002, VB0003, VB0005 and their associated libraries have been received, and, in total, more than 700 unique compounds have now been validated in the major European jurisdictions. The patent covering the VB4-P5 and its related compounds, which selectively treat interstitial kidneys, has been granted by both Indonesia and the Russian Federation. The patent covering compositions and methods of use for VB0004 has been granted by India.

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Finance and Corporate

The funds expended during the recent quarter were largely in connection with the Phase I clinical trials for VB0004. Payments for research, patents, staff costs and Directors' fees for the quarter amounted to \$1,031,000. Payments to related parties during the quarter were the Chief Executive Officer's salary of \$64,000 and Non-Executive Directors' fees of \$33,000. Interest of \$18,000 on the \$957,000 loan from Non-Executive Director Maurie Stang was paid and the loan was reduced to \$442,000 in June 2021. During the quarter, fees of \$59,000 (for corporate services, including cost re-imbursment for information technology, human resources and accounting services, in line with budget) were paid to Regional Healthcare Group Pty Ltd and Aeris Environmental Ltd, both of which Non-Executive Director Maurie Stang is a director. Vectus' Research and Development Cash-Back refund of \$515,000 for the June 2020 year was received in June 2021.

General

Numerous studies continue to elucidate the longer-term damage effects of COVID-19, which have now been reported to include fibrosis affecting the heart, lungs and kidneys. For both the lung and the kidney the damage has been sufficient to require transplantation in some instances. As a consequence, demand for effective anti-fibrotic treatments is expected to increase.

The terms of the original loan facility made available of \$2,500,000 by Director M Stang (current advance balance of \$442,000 after the last repayment of \$515,000 in June 2021) include an interest rate of 8% per annum, and security over all of the assets of the Company to secure past and future advances pursuant to the Director loan. The loan terms included a contractual obligation on the Company to utilise its future R&D tax offset payments from the ATO to repay the loan. The Company expects to repay the balance of the loan in the June 2022 quarter when the June 2021 financial year R&D tax offset refund is received from the ATO. The security will be discharged when the loan is repaid.
