Toll Revenue and Traffic Statistics Update for Q3 2021

Atlas Arteria (**ASX:ALX**) today released toll revenue and traffic statistics for the September quarter 2021 (Q3 2021). Strong summer holiday travel in France resulted in the highest total third quarter traffic since 2018.

The tables below show the change in traffic and revenue with respect to the same periods in 2019 and 2020.


APRR and ADELAC

Traffic in Q3 2021 was 9.2% higher than Q3 2020 and 6.3% higher than Q3 2019. Light vehicle traffic was particularly strong, up 9.8% higher than Q3 2020 and 7.0% above Q3 2019.

The summer period at APRR is typically characterised by a strong increase in leisure travel during July and August. This year, traffic remained high into September, with strong demand from French domestic travelers.

The EU Digital COVID Certificate (vaccine passport) was launched on 1 July and from 9 August the French 'Pass Sanitaire' was required for access to all public services, hospitality venues and for any travel by plane, train or bus in France. As of 10 October, around 80% of the French adult (18+) population were fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and France has begun administering booster vaccinations to extend immunity into the European winter.

Heavy vehicle traffic also continued to remain strong during the quarter, ending Q3 2021 4.8% higher than Q3 2020 and 1.2% higher than Q3 2019.



ADELAC's traffic benefited from the return of economic activity on the back of EU and French vaccine passports, but as a commuter road did not experience the same increase in leisure traffic as the wider APRR network. Traffic at ADELAC in Q3 2021 was 8.3% higher than Q3 2020, but 4.1% lower than Q3 2019.


Dulles Greenway

Traffic in Q3 2021 was 26.0% higher than Q3 2020 but remained 30.4% below Q3 2019.

Virginia experienced a resurgence in COVID-19 cases which began at the start of Q3 2021 and peaked in mid-September at levels not seen since the end of 2020. The increase in COVID-19 cases associated with the Delta variant delayed the plans of many businesses to return to the office.

As a result, weekday traffic remained on average around 33% below 2019 levels over the period. Weekend traffic, however, was only around 11% below 2019 levels over the quarter reflecting limited government imposed COVID-19 restrictions remaining in place.


The performance for the quarter continues the trend of recovery in traffic since the pandemic started in Q2 2020.



Warnow Tunnel

Traffic in Q3 2021 was 3.2% lower than Q3 2020 and 2.4% lower than Q3 2019. Most COVID-19 related movement and social restrictions in Germany were lifted towards the end of Q2, which supported summer holiday traffic.

Roadworks on competing routes continued to positively impact traffic at the Warnow Tunnel, albeit to a lesser extent than in prior comparative periods. This contributed to the slightly lower traffic numbers when compared with Q3 2020 and 2019. These roadworks are expected to continue into Q4.



As of 10 October, around 78% of the German adult (18+) population were fully vaccinated against COVID-19. Germany has also begun administering booster vaccinations against COVID-19 to provide additional immunity against the disease heading into the colder months.

Despite the lower traffic, toll revenue for the quarter was 0.1% higher than Q3 2020 and 1.6% higher than Q3 2019. This was a result of the increases in average tolls.
