- 8.6.1 Does the entity expect that it will continue to have the current level of net operating cash flows for the time being and, if not, why not?

The Company expects it may continue to have negative operating cash flow for the next few months, however it continues to see a significant improvement in new customer orders which are now being finalised and will result in improved operational cashflow in next few months.

8.6.2 Has the entity taken any steps, or does it propose to take any steps, to raise further cash to fund its operations and, if so, what are those steps and how likely does it believe that they will be successful?

The Company has made significant progress. The Company has successfully finalised a capital raising of \$8.732m and is currently finalising a \$10.97m debt restructing and new equity issue proposals to be considered by shareholders at an upcoming General Meeting to be called in early December and to be held in early January.

8.6.3 Does the entity expect to be able to continue its operations and to meet its business objectives and, if so, on what basis?

Yes. In addition to the above, the Company has continued to collect the amortising promissory note installments from the sale of Tillerstack GmbH. Monthly instalments have been received since February 2021. The planned balance sheet restructure will eliminate approx \$15m of liabilities and result in improved working capital and allow the company to support the growth in future revenue opportunities.
