Resignation of CEO and Director and Appointment of Interim CEO

Mr Hamish Douglass will remain as Magellan’s Executive Chairman.

He commenced his journey with Magellan in 2007 as a Non-executive Director before transferring to our executive ranks in 2015, initially as Executive Chairman and then becoming CEO in 2019. Brett was instrumental in the development of Magellan’s exchange traded products and in the development of Magellan’s retirement product, **FuturePay**. On behalf of the Company, I would like to thank Brett for his extensive contribution to Magellan since 2007 and wish him all the very best in his future endeavours.”

About the Magellan Infrastructure Fund (Currency Hedged)

The Fund’s investment objective is to achieve attractive risk-adjusted investment returns over the medium to long-term, whilst minimising the risk of permanent capital loss.
