1. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

To receive and consider the annual financial report of the Company for the financial year ended 30 June 2021 together with the declaration of the Directors, the Directors' report, the Remuneration Report and the auditor's report.

2. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as a **non-binding resolution**:

"That, for the purposes of section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, approval is given for the adoption of the Remuneration Report as contained in the Company's annual financial report for the financial year ended 30 June 2021."

Note: the vote on this Resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company.

Voting Prohibition Statement:

A vote on this Resolution must not be cast (in any capacity) by or on behalf of either of the following persons:

- (a) a member of the Key Management Personnel, details of whose remuneration are included in the Remuneration Report; or
- (b) a Closely Related Party of such a member.

However, a person (the **voter**) described above may cast a vote on this Resolution as a proxy if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person described above and either:

- (a) the voter is appointed as a proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; or
- (b) the voter is the Chair and the appointment of the Chair as proxy:
 - (i) does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; and
 - (ii) expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even though this Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

3. RESOLUTION 2 – ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – SIMON WILLIAM JOHNSON

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That, for the purpose of clause 14.4 of the Constitution, ASX Listing Rule 14.4 and for all other purposes, Mr Simon William Johnson, a Director who was appointed as an additional director on 6 April 2021, retires, and being eligible, is elected as a Director."

4. RESOLUTION 3 – ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – CHRISTIAN JOHN PAECH

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That, for the purpose of clause 14.4 of the Constitution, ASX Listing Rule 14.4 and for all other purposes, Mr Christian John Paech, a Director who was appointed as an additional Director on 13 December 2021, retires, and being eligible, is elected as a Director."

5. RESOLUTION 4 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – SAMUEL JARVIS

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That, for the purpose of clause 14.2 of the Constitution, ASX Listing Rule 14.4 and for all other purposes, Mr Samuel Jarvis, a Director, retires by rotation, and being eligible, is re-elected as a Director."

6. RESOLUTION 5 – RATIFICATION OF PRIOR ISSUE OF OPTIONS PURSUANT TO CAPITAL RAISING

"That, for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 7.4 and for all other purposes, Shareholders ratify the issue of 95,000,000 Broker Options on the terms and conditions set out in the Explanatory Statement."

9. RESOLUTION 8 - APPROVAL OF 10% PLACEMENT CAPACITY

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass the following resolution as a **special** resolution:

"That, for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 7.1A and for all other purposes, approval is given for the Company to issue up to that number of Equity Securities equal to 10% of the issued capital of the Company at the time of issue, calculated in accordance with the formula prescribed in ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.2 and otherwise on the terms and conditions set out in the Explanatory Statement."

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared to provide information which the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass the Resolutions.

1. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

In accordance with the Constitution, the business of the Meeting will include receipt and consideration of the annual financial report of the Company for the financial year ended 30 June 2021 together with the declaration of the Directors, the Directors' report, the Remuneration Report and the auditor's report.

The Company will not provide a hard copy of the Company's annual financial report to Shareholders unless specifically requested to do so. The Company's annual financial report is available on its website at www.axpenergy.com.

2. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

2.1 General

The Corporations Act requires that at a listed company's annual general meeting, a resolution that the remuneration report be adopted must be put to the shareholders. However, such a resolution is advisory only and does not bind the company or the directors of the company.

The remuneration report sets out the company's remuneration arrangements for the directors and senior management of the company. The remuneration report is part of the directors' report contained in the annual financial report of the company for a financial year.

The chair of the meeting must allow a reasonable opportunity for its shareholders to ask questions about or make comments on the remuneration report at the annual general meeting.

2.2 Voting consequences

A company is required to put to its shareholders a resolution proposing the calling of another meeting of shareholders to consider the appointment of directors of the company (**Spill Resolution**) if, at consecutive annual general meetings, at least 25% of the votes cast on a remuneration report resolution are voted against adoption of the remuneration report and at the first of those annual general meetings a Spill Resolution was not put to vote. If required, the Spill Resolution must be put to vote at the second of those annual general meetings.

If more than 50% of votes cast are in favour of the Spill Resolution, the company must convene a shareholder meeting (**Spill Meeting**) within 90 days of the second annual general meeting.

All of the directors of the company who were in office when the directors' report (as included in the company's annual financial report for the most recent financial year) was approved, other than the managing director of the company, will cease to hold office immediately before the end of the Spill Meeting but may stand for re-election at the Spill Meeting.

Following the Spill Meeting those persons whose election or re-election as directors of the company is approved will be the directors of the company.

2.3 Previous voting results

At the Company's previous annual general meeting the votes cast against the remuneration report considered at that annual general meeting were less than 25%. Accordingly, the Spill Resolution is not relevant for this Annual General Meeting.

3. RESOLUTION 2 – ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – SIMON WILLIAM JOHNSON

3.1 General

The Constitution allows the Directors to appoint at any time a person to be a Director either to fill a casual vacancy or as an addition to the existing Directors, but only where the total number of Directors does not at any time exceed the maximum number specified by the Constitution.

Pursuant to the Constitution and Listing Rule 14.4, any Director so appointed holds office only until the next annual general meeting and is then eligible for election by Shareholders but shall not be taken into account in determining the Directors who are to retire by rotation (if any) at that meeting.

Mr Johnson, having been appointed by other Directors on, 6 April 2021 in accordance with the Constitution, will retire in accordance with the Constitution and Listing Rule 14.4 and being eligible, seeks election from Shareholders.

3.2 Qualifications and other material directorships

Mr Johnson joined the Board in April 2021 assuming to the role of non-executive Chairman.

Mr Johnson brings considerable experience and skills to the Company. Based in Perth, Mr Johnson has extensive international oilfield experience having lived and worked in the USA, the Middle East, the Far-East and Europe over the past 25 years, including as a C-suite executive for several large cap NYSE-listed drilling contractors. He also has substantial experience in Board level engagement. Simon has held senior positions at Borr Drilling (NYSE: BDRL), Noble Corporation (NYSE: NE), Seadrill (NYSE: SDRL) with his early career at Diamond Offshore and others. He completed the Advanced Management Program at Harvard University and holds a double major in Economics and Finance from Curtin University.

Mr Johnson has no other current or former listed directorships.

3.3 Independence

Simon Johnson has no interests, position or relationship that might influence, or reasonably be perceived to influence, in a material respect his/her capacity to bring an independent judgement to bear on issues before the Board and to act in the best interest of the Company as a whole rather than in the interests of an individual security holder or other party.

If elected the Board considers Simon Johnson will be an independent Director.

3.4 Other material information

The Company conducts appropriate checks on the background and experience of candidates before their appointment to the Board. The Company undertook such checks prior to the appointment of Simon Johnson.

Simon Johnson has confirmed that he considers he will have sufficient time to fulfil his responsibilities as a Non-Executive Chairman of the Company and does not consider that any other commitment will interfere with his availability to perform his duties as a Non-Executive Chairman of the Company.

3.5 Board recommendation

The Board has reviewed Simon Johnson's performance since his appointment to the Board and considers that Simon Johnson's skills and experience will continue to enhance the Board's ability to perform its role. Accordingly, the Board supports the election of Simon Johnson and recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 2.

4. RESOLUTION 3 – ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – CHRISTIAN JOHN PAECH

4.1 General

The Constitution allows the Directors to appoint at any time a person to be a Director either to fill a casual vacancy or as an addition to the existing Directors, but only where the total number of Directors does not at any time exceed the maximum number specified by the Constitution.

Pursuant to the Constitution and Listing Rule 14.4, any Director so appointed holds office only until the next annual general meeting and is then eligible for election by Shareholders but shall not be taken into account in determining the Directors who are to retire by rotation (if any) at that meeting.

Christian Paech having been appointed by other Directors on 13 December 2021 in accordance with the Constitution, will retire in accordance with the Constitution and Listing Rule 14.4 and being eligible, seeks election from Shareholders.

4.2 Qualifications and other material directorships

Mr. Paech is based in Adelaide and has considerable oil and gas industry and related legal experience, having been a member of the Senior Leadership Team at Santos Limited (ASX: STO) where he held the position of General Counsel for approximately ten years. Prior to joining Santos, Mr. Paech specialised in M&A and securities law in private practise, including roles with Ashurst in the United Kingdom and Herbert Smith Freehills in Melbourne. He is well versed in corporate governance, risk management and commercial matters as they relate to hydrocarbon exploitation across multiple jurisdictions.

Mr. Paech holds a Bachelor's degrees in both Commerce and Laws (Hons.) from the University of Adelaide.

Mr Paech and is currently a non-executive director of ASX listed Barton Gold Holdings Limited (ASX: BGD).

4.3 Independence

Christian Paech has no interests, position or relationship that might influence, or reasonably be perceived to influence, in a material respect his/her capacity to bring an independent judgement to bear on issues before the Board and to act in the best interest of the Company as a whole rather than in the interests of an individual security holder or other party.

If re-elected the Board considers that Christian Paech will be an independent Director.

4.4 Other material information

The Company conducts appropriate checks on the background and experience of candidates before their appointment to the Board. The Company undertook such checks prior to the appointment of Christian Paech.

Christian Paech has confirmed that he considers he will have sufficient time to fulfil his responsibilities as a Non-Executive Director of the Company and does not consider that any other commitment will interfere with his availability to perform his duties as a Non-Executive Director of the Company.

4.5 Board recommendation

The Board has reviewed Christian Paech's performance since his appointment to the Board and considers that Christian Paech's skills and experience will continue to enhance the Board's ability to perform its role. Accordingly, the Board supports the election of Christian Paech and recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 3.

5. RESOLUTION 4 – ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – SAMUEL JARVIS

5.1 General

Listing Rule 14.4 and clause 14.2 of the Constitution provide that, other than a managing director, a director of an entity must not hold office (without reelection) past the third annual general meeting following the director's appointment or three years, whichever is the longer. However, where there is more than one managing director, only one is entitled to be exempt from this rotation requirement.

Mr Jarvis, who has served as a Director since 28 February 2018 and was last reelected on 29 November 2018, retires by rotation and seeks re-election.

5.2 Qualifications and other material directorships

Mr Samuel Jarvis was appointed as Non-Executive Director 28 February 2018. He has extensive experience in commercial management and development drilling as well as knowledge of the upstream oil and gas value chain. For the past 15 years, he has held senior Executive roles with leading global oil and gas drilling companies in SE Asia.

Mr Jarvis graduated with honours in engineering in 1995 and holds a degree in economics with a Finance Major.

Other current or former listed directorships in the last 3 years: QX Resources Ltd (ASX: QXR).

5.3 Independence

If re-elected the Board considers that Samuel Jarvis will be an independent Director.

5.4 Board recommendation

The Board has reviewed Samuel Jarvis's performance since his appointment to the Board and considers that Samuel Jarvis's skills and experience will continue to enhance the Board's ability to perform its role. Accordingly, the Board supports

the re-election of Samuel Jarvis and recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 4.

6. RESOLUTIONS 5 - RATIFICATION OF PRIOR ISSUE OF OPTIONS PURSUANT TO CAPITAL RAISING

6.1 General

On 18 December 2020 the Company completed a placement by issuing 599,999,999 Placement Shares pursuant to the Company's placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1, raising \$1,800,000 (Capital Raising).

The Company agreed to issue one (1) free attaching Placement Option for every two (2) Placement Share subscribed for and issued under the Capital Raising on 18 December 2020, subject to obtaining Shareholder approval. The Company obtained shareholder approval at a General Meeting held 10 June 2021, but was not able to issue the Options within the 3-month time limit.

The placement terms were for each two shares subscribed for at \$0.003 each, one Option expiring 18 months after issue and exercisable on payment of \$0.005 would be issued, subject to shareholder approval.

Accordingly, 300,000,000 Placement Options have been issued by the Company on 20 October 2021 with an exercise price of \$0.005 and expiring on 20 April 2023.

6.2 ASX Listing Rules 7.1

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, ASX Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12-month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that 12-month period.

Under Listing Rule 7.1A, an eligible entity can seek approval from its members, by way of a special resolution passed at its annual general meeting, to increase this 15% limit by an extra 10% to 25%.

The Company's ability to utilise the additional 10% capacity provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A for issues of equity securities following this Meeting remains conditional on Resolution 8 being passed at this Meeting.

The issue of the Placement Options does not fit within any of these exceptions and, as the issue has not yet been approved by Shareholders, it effectively uses up part of the 15% limit under ASX Listing Rule 7.1, reducing the Company's capacity to issue further equity securities without Shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rules 7.1 for the 12-month period following the date of issue of the Placement Options.

6.3 ASX Listing Rule 7.4

ASX Listing Rule 7.4 allows the shareholders of a listed company to approve an issue of equity securities made using its placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 or ASX Listing Rule 7.1A after it has been made or agreed to be made. If they do, the issue is taken to have been approved under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and so that issue does not reduce the company's capacity to issue further equity securities without shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 or ASX Listing Rule 7.1A, as applicable.

The Company wishes to retain as much flexibility as possible to issue additional equity securities in the future without having to obtain Shareholder approval for such issues under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and ASX Listing Rule 7.1A. Accordingly, the Company is seeking Shareholder ratification pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of the Placement Options.

Resolutions 5 seek Shareholder ratification pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of the 300,000,000 Placement Options under the Capital Raising.

6.4 Technical information required by ASX Listing Rule 14.1A

If Resolution 5 is passed, the Placement Options issued will be excluded in calculating the Company's combined 25% limit under ASX Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A, effectively increasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12-month period following the date of issue of the Placement Options.

If Resolution 5 is not passed, the Placement Options issued will be included in calculating the Company's combined 25% limit under ASX Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A, effectively decreasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12-month period following the date of issue of the Placement Options.

It is noted that the Company's ability to utilise the additional 10% capacity provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A for issues of equity securities following this Meeting remains conditional on Resolution 8 being passed at this Meeting.

6.5 Technical information required by ASX Listing Rule 7.5

Pursuant to and in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 7.5, the following information is provided in relation to Resolutions 5:

- (a) the 300,000,000 Placement Options were issued to professional and sophisticated investors. These recipients were identified by the Directors as a result of undertaking presentations to various investor groups and who support the Company's strategy. None of the recipients are related parties of the Company, members of the Company's key management personnel, a substantial holder, an adviser to the Company; or an associate of any of the above;
- (b) the terms and conditions of the Placement Options are set out in Schedule 1;
- (c) the Placement Options were issued on 20 October 2021;
- (d) the Placement Options were issued as free attaching at a nil issue price on the basis of one (1) free attaching Placement Option for every two (2) Placement Share subscribed for and issued under the 20 December 2020 Capital Raising;
- (e) the purpose of the issue of the Placement Options is to satisfy the terms of the Capital Raising as agreed with subscribers (being the issue of one Option exercisable on payment of \$0.005, expiring 18 months after issue, for each 2 shares subscribed for); and
- (f) the Placement Shares were not issued under an agreement.

7. RESOLUTIONS 6 - RATIFICATION OF PRIOR ISSUE OF BROKER OPTIONS

7.1 General

The Company engaged Australasian Capital Pty Limited (ABN 64 143 093 832) (AFSL 384503) (**Australasian Capital**) to facilitate the sale of all shares in the Company held by Jetan Pty Ltd (**Jetan**). For these services, Australasian Capital (or its nominees) were to be issued with 95,000,000 Options exercisable at \$0.005 each, on or before the date which is 24 months from the date of issue (**Broker Options**). Accordingly, the Company issued 95,000,000 Broker Options to Australasian Capital (or its nominees) on 21 October 2021.

7.2 ASX Listing Rules 7.1

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, ASX Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12-month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that 12-month period.

Under Listing Rule 7.1A, an eligible entity can seek approval from its members, by way of a special resolution passed at its annual general meeting, to increase this 15% limit by an extra 10% to 25%.

The Company's ability to utilise the additional 10% capacity provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A for issues of equity securities following this Meeting remains conditional on Resolution 8 being passed at this Meeting.

The issue of the Broker Options does not fit within any of these exceptions and, as the issue has not yet been approved by Shareholders, it effectively uses up part of the 15% limit under ASX Listing Rule 7.1, reducing the Company's capacity to issue further equity securities without Shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rules 7.1 for the 12-month period following the date of issue of the Placement Shares.

7.3 ASX Listing Rule 7.4

ASX Listing Rule 7.4 allows the shareholders of a listed company to approve an issue of equity securities made using its placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 or ASX Listing Rule 7.1 A after it has been made or agreed to be made. If they do, the issue is taken to have been approved under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and so that issue does not reduce the company's capacity to issue further equity securities without shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 or ASX Listing Rule 7.1A, as applicable.

The Company wishes to retain as much flexibility as possible to issue additional equity securities in the future without having to obtain Shareholder approval for such issues under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and ASX Listing Rule 7.1A. Accordingly, the Company is seeking Shareholder ratification pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of the Broker Options.

Resolutions 6 seek Shareholder ratification pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of the 95,000,000 Broker Options.

7.4 Technical information required by ASX Listing Rule 14.1A

If Resolution 6 is passed, the Broker Options issued will be excluded in calculating the Company's combined 25% limit under ASX Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A, effectively increasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue

without Shareholder approval over the 12-month period following the date of issue of the Placement Shares.

If Resolution 6 is not passed, the Broker Options issued will be included in calculating the Company's combined 25% limit under ASX Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A, effectively decreasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12-month period following the date of issue of the Placement Shares.

It is noted that the Company's ability to utilise the additional 10% capacity provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A for issues of equity securities following this Meeting remains conditional on Resolution 8 being passed at this Meeting.

7.5 Technical information required by ASX Listing Rule 7.5

Pursuant to and in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 7.5, the following information is provided in relation to Resolutions 6:

- (a) the 95,000,000 Broker Options were issued to Cove Street Advisors Pty Ltd, Chaleyer Holdings Pty Ltd, Mr V Larusso, Filmrim Pty Ltd & Mr M Shirley;
- (b) the terms and conditions of the Broker Options are set out in Schedule 2;
- (c) the Broker Options were issued on 21 October 2021;
- (d) the Broker Options were issued at a nil issue price;
- (e) the purpose of the issue of the Broker Options is to satisfy the terms of the agreement with Australasian Capital Pty Limited (being the issue of 95,000,000 Options exercisable on payment of \$0.005, expiring 24 months after issue); and
- (f) the Broker Options were issued under an agreement. A summary of the material terms of the agreement is set out in Section 7.1.

8. RESOLUTION 7 – APPOINTMENT OF AUDITOR

8.1 Background

On 22 July 2021, in accordance with section 327C of the Corporations Act 2001, the Company appointed Pitcher Partners BA&A Pty Ltd (**Pitcher Partners**) as auditor of the Company following ASIC's consent to the resignation of the previous auditor of the Company, Grant Thornton, in accordance with Section 329(5) of the Corporations Act 2001.

Following the above appointment, and in accordance with section 327C(2) of the Corporations Act, Pitcher Partners holds office as auditor of the Company until the Company's next Annual General Meeting, being the meeting the subject of this Notice of Meeting.

In accordance with section 327B(1)(b), the Company now seeks Shareholder approval for the ongoing appointment of Pitcher Partners as auditor of the Company and its controlled entities.

In accordance with section 328B of the Corporations Act 2001, notice in writing nominating Pitcher Partners as auditor has been given to the Company by a Shareholder. A copy of this notice is attached to this Notice of Meeting as Schedule 3.

Pitcher Partners has provided to the Company, and has not withdrawn, its written consent to act as auditor of the Company, in accordance with section 328A(1) of the Corporations Act.

If this Resolution is passed, the appointment of Pitcher Partners as the Company's auditor will take effect at the close of this Meeting.

8.2 Board Recommendation

The Board recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of this Resolution. The Chairman of the Meeting intends to vote undirected proxies in favour of this Resolution.

9. RESOLUTION 8 – APPROVAL OF APPROVAL OF 7.1A MANDATE

9.1 General

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of Equity Securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12 month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that period.

However, under Listing Rule 7.1A, an eligible entity may seek shareholder approval by way of a special resolution passed at its annual general meeting to increase this 15% limit by an extra 10% to 25% (7.1A Mandate).

An 'eligible entity' means an entity which is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and has a market capitalisation of \$300,000,000 or less. The Company is an eligible entity for these purposes.

As at the date of this Notice, the Company is an eligible entity as it is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and has a current market capitalisation of \$46,497,445 (based on the number of Shares on issue and the closing price of Shares on the ASX on 15 December 2021).

Resolution 8 seeks Shareholder approval by way of special resolution for the Company to have the additional 10% placement capacity provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A to issue Equity Securities without Shareholder approval.

If Resolution 8 is passed, the Company will be able to issue Equity Securities up to the combined 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A without any further Shareholder approval.

If Resolution 8 is not passed, the Company will not be able to access the additional 10% capacity to issue Equity Securities without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1A, and will remain subject to the 15% limit on issuing Equity Securities without Shareholder approval set out in Listing Rule 7.1.

9.2 Technical information required by Listing Rule 7.1A

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.3A, the information below is provided in relation to Resolution 8:

(a) Period for which the 7.1A Mandate is valid

The 7.1A Mandate will commence on the date of the Meeting at which the approval is obtained and expire on the first to occur of the following:

- (i) the date that is 12 months after the date of this Meeting at which the approval is obtained;
- (ii) the time and date of the Company's next annual general meeting; and
- (iii) the time and date of approval by Shareholders of any transaction under Listing Rule 11.1.2 (a significant change in the nature or scale of activities) or Listing Rule 11.2 (disposal of the main undertaking).

(b) Minimum price

Any Equity Securities issued under the 7.1A Mandate must be in an existing quoted class of Equity Securities and be issued at a minimum price of 75% of the volume weighted average price of Equity Securities in that class, calculated over the 15 trading days on which trades in that class were recorded immediately before:

- (i) the date on which the price at which the Equity Securities are to be issued is agreed by the entity and the recipient of the Equity Securities; or
- (ii) if the Equity Securities are not issued within 10 trading days of the date in Section 9.2(b)(i), the date on which the Equity Securities are issued.

(c) Use of funds raised under the 7.1A Mandate

The Company intends to use funds raised from issues of Equity Securities under the 7.1A Mandate for exploration and development of its existing projects, including without limitation drilling of oil wells, and general working capital.

(d) Risk of Economic and Voting Dilution

Any issue of Equity Securities under the 7.1A Mandate will dilute the interests of Shareholders who do not receive any Shares under the issue.

If Resolution 8 is approved by Shareholders and the Company issues the maximum number of Equity Securities available under the 7.1A Mandate, the economic and voting dilution of existing Shares would be as shown in the table below.

The table below shows the dilution of existing Shareholders calculated in accordance with the formula outlined in Listing Rule 7.1A.2, on the basis of the closing market price of Shares and the number of Equity Securities on issue or proposed to be issued as at 15 December 2021.

The table also shows the voting dilution impact where the number of Shares on issue (Variable A in the formula) changes and the economic dilution where there are changes in the issue price of Shares issued under the 7.1A Mandate.

- (iv) the circumstances of the Company, including, but not limited to, the financial position and solvency of the Company;
- (v) prevailing market conditions; and
- (vi) advice from corporate, financial and broking advisers (if applicable).

(f) Previous approval under Listing Rule 7.1A

The Company previously obtained approval from its Shareholders pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1A at its annual general meeting held on 29 January 2021 (**Previous Approval**).

During the 12 month period preceding the date of the Meeting, being on and from 28 January 2020, the Company has not issued any Equity Securities pursuant to the Previous Approval.

9.3 Voting Exclusion Statement

As at the date of this Notice, the Company is not proposing to make an issue of Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A. Accordingly, a voting exclusion statement is not included in this Notice.
