N1H sets record quarter performance Quarterly activity report and trading update (for the period of 1 January 2022 to 31 March 2022)

N1 Holdings Limited (ASX: **N1H** or the "**Company**") is pleased to announce the March 2022 quarter cashflow which records continued growth in various business segments including Small and Medium Enterprises (**SME**) lending, mortgage management (branded commercial and residential loans - N1 Plus) and mortgage brokerage, throughout the first 3 quarters of the financial year ending 30 June 2022 (**FY22**). For Q3 of FY22, the Company set another record quarter, with significant increases in cash receipts, revenue and net profit compared to the same period in the previous financial year.

A highlight of the FY22 year-to-date (1 July 2021 to 31 March 2022) (FYTD) and quarterly cash flow and financial performance:

- Net profit FYTD of approximately \$596,000 (unaudited), compared to a net loss of \$63,000 for the same period last financial year.
- EBITDA FYTD of approximately \$1.2 million (unaudited), an improvement of 84% compared to the same period last financial year.
- Revenue FYTD of \$7.56 million (unaudited), an improvement of 104% compared to the same period last financial year.
- Cash receipts from customers of \$9.411 million for FYTD, an improvement of 194% compared to the same period last financial year.
- Cash receipts from customers of \$3.897 million for the quarter, an improvement of 402% compared to the same period last financial year.
- Positive operating cash flow of \$1.626 million for Q3 of FY22 and \$10.26 million for FYTD.
- The Company's SME lending business (including management fees derived from the One Lending Fund through N1 Asset Management) continued to be the major revenue generator of the Company, accounting for 82% of the total cash receipts from customers in Q3 FY22. Total cash receipts from customers via the SME Lending business was \$3.19 million for Q3 FY22.
- The Company's cash balance as of 31 March 2022 is \$12,543,000.

Company Business activities

The Company recorded quarterly revenue of \$2.95 million (unaudited). The Company's SME lending business contributed \$2.5 million of revenue in the quarter and accounted for 85% of the Company's total revenue in Q3 FY22. The balance of other revenue was comprised of mortgage broking, mortgage management, funds management, and others.

One Lending Fund revenue was \$0.8 million (unaudited) for the quarter and \$2.24 million for FYTD. Please not that One Lending Fund's revenue does not form part of the Company's revenue (as this is a separate SME lending fund managed by N1 Asset Management, a 100% owned subsidiary of the Company).

The Company currently has committed SME lending capital of \$93 million comprising:

- \$22.5 million of capital committed to the One Lending Fund;
- \$15.5 million of capital from the Company's balance sheet; and
- \$55 million committed capital under a debt facility.



The Company continues to raise funds for SME lending purposes, including One Lending Fund.

Payments to related parties of the entity and their associates

- Salary and super to executive directors of \$163,541; and
- Services provided by director related entities of \$27,190. Costs are determined on an arm's length basis.
