Quarterly Activity Report for the quarter 1 January 2022 to 31 March 2022

Reef Casino Trust (Trust) Business activities

The Reef Hotel Casino complex in Cairns is the Trust's main asset.

Trading during the quarter ended 31 March 2022 at the Reef Hotel Casino

The operator of the Reef Hotel Casino, Casinos Austria International (Cairns) Pty Ltd, has reported profitable trading for each of January, February and March and therefore the whole quarter resulting in positive rental income for the Trust.

Particularly in January and February 2022, some of our food and beverage outlets' operating hours were cut back and there was a slight reduction in table games capacity. This was due to the following:

1. Visitation during the quarter was impacted by the Government mandate of requiring various indoor venues including our complex whereby staff and guests must be "fully vaccinated" and, until 4 March 2022, to wear masks. Also, there was a steep rise in COVID-19 cases in Queensland and elsewhere in Australia following the opening of state borders.
2. This also resulted in some disruptions to the availability of staff to attend work against a general business environment experiencing staff shortage. As COVID-19 cases stabilised, staff disruptions reduced.

The reopening of the national borders from 21 February 2022 had minimal impact in the quarter.

Trust Income

The Trust received rental income from the Reef Hotel Casino during the quarter.

Trust Expenditure

Operating expenditure during the quarter totalled \$1,760,000 including property outgoings, rates and taxes, repairs and maintenance, responsible entity fees and other administrative costs. Cash payments in the quarter included the annual insurance premiums.

Capital expenditure paid during the quarter was \$958,000. Capital expenditure continues to be carefully managed.

- Non-executive director fees and related on-costs.
- Responsible Entity Fees (including GST).
- Operating expenses (including GST) paid by the Trust to the lessee (operator) of the Reef Hotel Casino.

In addition, during the quarter the Trust received rental income from the lessee (operator) of the Reef Hotel Casino net of operating costs. Rental income and expenses are shown gross in item 1.1 and 1.2 of the attached Appendix 4C.
