Extension of NSW Resilience At Home Caravan Program

Highlights;

- **NSW Resilience extends 'at home caravan program' to 15 additional areas**
- **Caravans will be sourced from Camplify for this extension**
- **Camplify will coordinate with existing and new RV owners to deploy these vans for via the Temporary Accommodation Program over the coming months**

Today the NSW State Government through the Minister for Emergency Services and Resilience, and Minister for Flood Recovery Steph Cooke announced the extension of the NSW 'at home caravan program' has been extended to an additional 15 areas including;

- Ballina LGA: Ballina, East Ballina, Empire Vale, Keith Hall, Patches Beach and West Ballina;
- Lismore LGA: East Lismore, North Lismore and South Lismore; and
- Tweed LGA: Burringbar, Chinderah, Condong, Mooball, South Murwillumbah and Tumbulgum.

These caravans will be sourced via the Camplify platform.

In Q4FY22 Camplify reported a total bookings value of \$1.6m for their Temporary Accommodation Program for the quarter, with deployments ramping up. This extension will allow Camplify to work with residents of these locations to significantly expand the RVs deployed in order to provide additional rental bookings for RV owners, and provide valuable temporary accommodation for residents of these affected regions.

AT-HOME CARAVAN PROGRAM TO BE EXPANDED

The successful at-home caravan program for flood-affected Northern Rivers residents will be expanded to more communities to provide additional medium-term housing relief.

Minister for Emergency Services and Resilience and Minister for Flood Recovery Steph Cooke said the program is being extended to include residents in 15 areas across the Ballina, Lismore and Tweed local government areas (LGAs).

“Housing is the biggest challenge in the flood recovery effort and there is no one-size-fits-all solution when it comes to medium-term housing solutions,” Ms Cooke said.

“Caravans have already been delivered to more than 110 households in Woodburn and we want this opportunity to be rolled out to more communities in the Northern Rivers.”

Caravans will be sourced from Camplify, and located on the resident’s private property at no cost, with properties assessed during a face-to-face application process between owners and Resilience NSW to ensure it can safely accommodate a caravan.

Residents in the following areas will be able to register for the at-home caravan program:

- Ballina LGA: Ballina, East Ballina, Empire Vale, Keith Hall, Patches Beach and West Ballina;
- Lismore LGA: East Lismore, North Lismore and South Lismore; and
- Tweed LGA: Burringbar, Chinderah, Condong, Mooball, South Murwillumbah and Tumbulgum.

Camplify CEO Justin Hales said the caravans provide people in need with a reliable home, and called on more caravan owners to consider registering their vans to the cause.

“By repurposing our caravan supply we can give people a place to stay on their own properties while they manage the difficult task of repairing and rebuilding from the floods,” Mr Hales said.

“Camplify will work with Resilience NSW to source and coordinate the placement of the vans through its community of van owners within its relief program.”

Residents can register for the at-home caravan program at:

- Ballina Indoor Sports Centre, 63 Cherry Street on Wednesday 7 and Friday 9 September between 9am and 4pm;

- Lismore recovery assistance point, Harold Fredericks car park on Monday 5 and Tuesday 6 September between 9am and 4pm; and
- Murwillumbah Recovery Centre, Murwillumbah Civic Centre, 10-14 Tumbulgum Road on Thursday 8 September between 9am and 4pm.
