

# **2022 IAG AGM Voting Results**

The outcome of the resolutions put to IAG's 2022 Annual General Meeting (AGM) earlier today are as follows:

Resolution	Description	Outcome
1.	Re-election of Tom Pockett	Passed as an ordinary resolution
2.	Re-election of Helen Nugent	Passed as an ordinary resolution
3.	Re-election of George Savvides	Passed as an ordinary resolution
4.	Election of Scott Pickering	Passed as an ordinary resolution
5.	Adoption of the Remuneration Report for the year ended 30 June 2022	Passed as an ordinary resolution
6.	Allocation of share rights to Nick Hawkins, Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer	Passed as an ordinary resolution
7.	Contingent Board Spill Meeting Resolution	Not put to the AGM

Resolution 7 was to be put to the AGM if at least 25% of the votes validly cast on Resolution 5 were against Resolution 5. As Resolution 5 has received 96.63% of the votes validly cast in favour, Resolution 7 was <u>not</u> put to the AGM.
