Appendix 4C Quarterly Cash Flow Report and Quarterly Activities Report

Swoop Holdings Limited (**ASX: SWP**) is pleased to release its quarterly activities report and Appendix 4C for the three-month period ended 30 September 2022 (**Q1 FY23**).

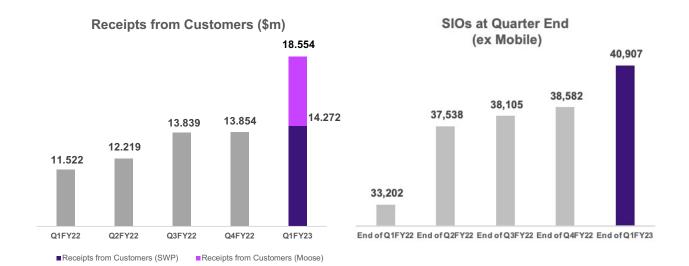
The quarterly cash flow report provided by Swoop incorporates the operations of Swoop (and its subsidiaries) plus recently acquired Moose Mobile for the 2-month period from 1 August 2022 to 30 September 2022. This acquisition, whilst not yet completed, having all conditions precedent satisfied on 31 October 2022 and a contractual effective date of 1 August 2022.

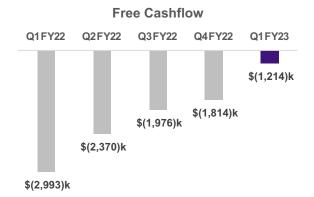
Swoop CEO Alex West comments "We are very pleased to report strong organic growth over the previous quarter, as well as this, we continue to demonstrate consistent strong organic growth when compared to the previous corresponding period. In addition to this organic growth, the contribution from Moose shows a step change in scale of the business as well as the expected strong free cash flow generation and growth opportunity Moose presents."

## Highlights of Q1 & Events Subsequent to the Quarter

- Q1 Receipts of \$18.6m for the quarter, an increase of \$4.7m from the previous quarter and \$7.0m over the previous corresponding period.
- Q1 Receipts were up +34% on previous quarter (Q4FY22) being +3% organic and +31% inorganic contribution.
- Q1 Receipts were up +61% on PCP (Q1FY22) being +15% organic and +46% inorganic.
- **SIO growth** was (annualised) +24% on previous quarter (Q4FY22) being +9% organic and +15% inorganic.
- SIO growth was +23% on PCP (Q1FY22) being +6% organic and +17% inorganic
- Positive operating cash flows of \$3.3 million for the quarter, up from \$3.0 million in the previous quarter, reflecting both Moose Mobile for the months of August and September as well as the timing of expenses in the underlying business.
- The company continues its improved **Free Cash Flow** over the quarter from (\$1.8m) to (\$1.2m) as it continues towards a neutral FCF position exiting FY23.
- Total Services in Operation for the underlying business at the end of Q1 was 138,612 with existing services increasing to 40,907 (from Q4FY22 38,582) and the addition of 97,705 Moose Mobile SIOs.
- Cash balance at 30 September was \$22.4m, the reduction from \$32.1m at 30 June 2022 reflecting the final deferred consideration payments for previous acquisitions (Voicehub, Beam, Luminet, IFibre) and \$3.3m cash payments for the current on market share buyback.
- All the conditions precedent for the acquisition of national mobile virtual network operator Moose Mobile (which was announced on 1 July 2022) were satisfied on 31 October 2022, with formal completion expected to occur during the first week of November.







## Acquisition and other highlights

#### Completed during Q1:

**Commenced** the Company's on-market share buy-back as announced on 15 August 2022. The buy-back is for up 14,532,529 fully paid ordinary shares, representing 10% of the Company's issued share capital at the time of the commencement of the buy-back. As at 30 September 2022 the Company had acquired 52.7% of the fully paid ordinary shares able to be bought back.

# Other events subsequent to 30 September 2022:

Satisfied all the conditions precent for the acquisition Queensland-based national mobile virtual network operator Moose Mobile on 31 October 2022. The acquisition has a contractual effective date of 1 August 2022. Moose provides over 97,000 mobile services to customers across Australia, with strong cash generation. The Purchase Price is \$24.0 million, comprising \$19.0 million in cash and \$5.0 million in Swoop shares issued at the 5-day VWAP prior to signing. \$2.85 million of the cash payable is to be held in escrow for 6 months for any potential claims or adjustments. An earn out of up to a maximum of \$7.0 million is payable based on Moose's FY2023 and FY2024 EBITDA performance and SIO growth. The cash component of the acquisition is to be funded from Swoop's Westpac Debt Facility. Swoop will confirm to the market when formal completion of the acquisition, including payment of the Purchase Price, occurs (expected the first week of November 2022).



# Payments to related parties of Swoop and their associates

The amounts included in item 6 in the Appendix 4C relate to the Directors Fees for the quarter (\$88k) and software subscription costs for software provided by a company related to Matthew Hollis (\$2k). This subscription cost is provided at commercial market rates.

A \$100,000 corporate card facility (maturity on demand).
