Explanation of Revenue

Investment income for the half-year increased to \$19,690,305 (HY22: \$1,266,354). This increase was primarily due to higher unrealised gain on the portfolio recognised during the half-year (\$15,613,178) due to favourable movement in the market values of the underlying securities held within the portfolios. The net realised loss on disposal of securities for the half year was \$381,033 (HY22: gain of \$7,908,494).

Dividends, trust distributions, and interest income increased by 37% to \$4,446,404 from \$3,241,781 in HY22.

Explanation of Net Profit to members

Profit after tax attributable to members was \$12,318,034 (HY22: \$16,702). This result was primarily due to higher dividend and trust distributions received and the net unrealised gains during the current half-year.

Total operating expenses during the half-year increased from \$1,336,738 to \$2,821,498. This was mainly due to performance fees of \$1,549,940 during HY23.

Directors' Report

Your Directors present their report on Clime Capital Limited ("the Company" or "CAM") for the half-year ended 31 December 2022.

Principal activities

The principal activity of the Company during the financial period was investing in domestic securities and unlisted unit trusts.

There were no significant changes in these activities during the current financial period.

Review of Operations

The Company recorded an after tax profit of \$12,318,034 for the half-year ended 31 December 2022 compared to an after tax profit of \$16,702 for the half-year ended 31 December 2021. This result was primarily due to unrealised gains on financial assets at fair value to profit or loss recognised during the period.

During the half-year, investment revenue (dividends, trust distributions and interest received) plus realised gains on financial assets sold was \$4,065,371 compared to \$11,150,275 for the half-year ended on 31 December 2021. The net unrealised gain on portfolio mark-to-market movements was \$15,613,178 compared to a \$9,883,921 net unrealised loss for the half-year ended 31 December 2021.

The Company has continued payment of quarterly dividends to its ordinary shareholders. Dividends declared during the period totalled \$3,622,684 (31 December 2021: \$3,923,049). September 2022 quarter dividend included a special dividend of 1.28 cents fully franked amounting to \$1,797,627.

As at 31 December 2022 the Company has Net Tangible Assets (NTA) of \$0.86 per share (pre-tax and cum-dividend) (30 June 2022: \$0.78) and \$0.87 per share (post-tax and cum-dividend) (30 June 2022: \$0.80).

Significant changes in the state of affairs

There were no significant changes in the state of affairs of the Company during the financial period.

After balance date events

On 25 January 2023, a fully franked dividend for the quarter ended 31 December 2022 of 1.30 cents per share was paid on ordinary shares which had been recorded as a dividend payable at balance date.

On the 14 February 2023, the Company confirmed its current on-market buyback (within the 10/12 limit) ends at close of trading on the 14 February 2023 and that it intends to commence a new on-market buyback program starting on 1 March 2023.

No other significant events have occurred since the reporting date which would impact on the financial position of the Company disclosed in the Statement of Financial Position as at 31 December 2022 or on the results and cash flows of the Company for the half-year ended on that date.

Rounding off of amounts

In accordance with ASIC Corporations (Rounding in Financial/Directors' Reports) Instrument 2016/191, the amounts in the directors' report have been rounded to the nearest dollar, unless otherwise stated.

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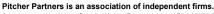

(a) Basis of accounting

These interim financial statements are general purpose financial statements prepared in accordance with the *Corporations Act 2001* and *Australian Accounting Standard AASB 134 Interim Financial Reporting.*Compliance with AASB 134 ensures compliance with International Financial Reporting Standards IAS 34 Interim Financial Reporting.

The interim financial statements are prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention with the exception of the valuation of investments described in Note 2 below.

These interim financial statements do not include all the notes of the type normally included in annual financial statements and therefore cannot be expected to provide full understanding of the financial performance, financial position and financing and investing activities of the Company as the annual financial statements. Accordingly, these interim financial statements are to be read in conjunction with the annual financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2022 and any public announcements made by the Company during the interim reporting period in accordance with the continuous disclosure requirements of the *Corporations Act 2001*.

The Statement of Financial Position is presented on a liquidity basis. Assets and liabilities are presented in decreasing order of liquidity and are not distinguished between current and non-current.

Details of reporting period

The current reporting period is the half-year ended 31 December 2022. For the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income, Statement of Changes in Equity and the Statement of Cash Flows, the previous corresponding period is the half-year ended 31 December 2021. For the Statement of Financial Position, the previous corresponding period is 30 June 2022.

The interim financial report was authorised for issue on 23 February 2023.

New or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted

The Company has adopted all of the new or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

Any new or amended Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

(b) Accounting policies

The accounting policies applied in these interim financial statements have been applied consistently throughout the period.

The accounting policies in these interim financial statements are the same as those applied in the Company's financial statements as at and for the year ended 30 June 2022.

(c) Rounding off of amounts

In accordance with ASIC Corporations (Rounding in Financial/Directors' Reports) Instrument 2016/191, the amounts in the Directors' report and in the financial report have been rounded to the nearest dollar, unless otherwise stated.

NOTE 2

Fair Value Measurement

The Company measures and recognises financial assets and liabilities at fair value through profit or loss on a recurring basis.

The Company has no assets or liabilities measured at fair value on a non-recurring basis in the current reporting period. AASB 13 requires disclosure of fair value measurements by level of the following fair value measurement hierarchy:

- Quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1);
- Inputs other than quoted prices included within level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly (Level 2); and
- Inputs for the asset or liability that are not based on observable market data (unobservable inputs) (Level 3).

Fair Value Measurement (continued)

(a) Fair value in an active market (Level 1)

The fair value of financial assets and liabilities traded in active markets (such as listed equity securities) are based on quoted market prices at the close of trading at the end of the reporting period without any deduction for estimated future selling costs.

The Company values its investments in accordance with the accounting policies set out in Note 1 of the annual report. For the majority of its investments, the Company relies on information provided by independent pricing services for the valuation of its investments.

The quoted market price used for financial assets held by the Company is the closing quoted last price at the end of the reporting period.

A financial instrument is regarded as quoted in an active market if quoted prices are readily and regularly available from an exchange, dealer, broker, industry group, pricing service, or regulatory agency, and those prices represent actual and regularly occurring market transactions on an arm's length basis.

An active market is a market in which transactions for the asset or liability take place with sufficient frequency and volume to provide pricing information on an ongoing basis.

(b) Fair value in an inactive or unquoted market (Level 3)

The fair value of financial assets and liabilities that are not traded in an active market is determined using valuation techniques. These include the use of recent arm's length market transactions and reference to the current fair value of a substantially similar other instrument. Refer to Note 2(f) for further details.

(g) Valuation processes used for Level 3 fair value measurements

The Company's unlisted unit trust investments are typically unlisted syndicated investments with a mediumterm investment horizon. The value of investment was initially recorded at cost / acquisition price. The Manager of these unlisted funds issues periodic updates (quarterly or half yearly) to communicate the performance of underlying assets, summary financial information and periodically, independent valuation of the trust's underlying assets. An independent external valuation is generally done annually and communicated to the investors through the regular fund update.

The Company reviews these updates and will reflect the investment valuation based on the independent valuation if and when it changes. As observable prices are not available for these securities, the Company has relied on valuations provided by managers of the underlying funds, based on the net asset value per unit reported by those trusts, in order to derive the fair value of the units.

Summarised sensitivity analysis

The following table summarises the sensitivity of the Company's operating profit and equity to other price risk. The reasonably possible movements in the risk variables have been determined based on management's best estimate, having regard to a number of factors, historical correlation of the Company's investments with the relevant benchmark and market volatility. However, actual movements in the risk variables may be greater or less than anticipated due to a number of factors, including unusually large market shocks resulting from changes in the performance of the securities in which the Company invests. As a result, historic variations in risk variables are not a definitive indicator of future variations in the risk variables.

Conversion of Convertible Notes into Equity

During the six months ended 31 December 2022, no convertible notes were converted to equity shares (30 June 2022: 5,780,118 at \$1.00 face value in ratio of 1.025 ordinary shares for every convertible note).

On-market share buy-back

On 31 January 2022, the Company announced its intention to refresh its ability to implement an on-market buy-back (within the 10/12 limit) for a further 12-month period which commenced from 15 February 2022 and ends on 14 February 2023. During this period, the Company has the ability to buy a maximum of 14,043,193 fully paid ordinary shares. During the half-year ended 31 December 2022, 442,631 ordinary shares were bought back and cancelled.

During the half-year ended 31 December 2022, Clime Capital Limited, in accordance with its on-market share buy-back scheme, bought back 442,631 (30 June 2022: 1,049,753) shares. The number of shares bought back and cancelled was within the '10/12 limit' imposed by s257B of the *Corporations Act 2001*, and as such, shareholder approval was not required.

Dividend reinvestment plan

The Company has established a dividend reinvestment plan under which holders of ordinary shares may elect to have all or part of their dividend entitlements satisfied by the issue of new ordinary shares rather than by being paid in cash. Shares are issued under the plan at a price determined by the Director from time to time in accordance with the *Corporations Act 2001* and the ASX Listing Rules.
