June Business Update

Gaining momentum with over 187,000¹ subscribers across Premium and Anywhere

Sezzle Inc. (ASX:SZL) (**Sezzle** or **Company**) // Purpose-driven digital payment platform, Sezzle, is pleased to provide the market with an update on key financial metrics for the month ended 30 June 2023.²

"I am thrilled to see the continued success of our initiatives and the promise that our new product launches are showing," stated Charlie Youakim, Sezzle Chairman and CEO. "The June launch of Sezzle Anywhere has been particularly exciting, driving our total subscriber base (Premium and Anywhere) to over 187,000. Sezzle Anywhere is making an immediate impact on our business, as we are experiencing a pickup in consumer activity, and we are seeing that flow through preliminary July to-date results."

Financial Highlights

- Total Income grew to US\$11.8 million (A\$17.6 million³) in June 2023, representing a 20.7% YoY increase. Total Income as a percentage of Underlying Merchant Sales (UMS) increased 153 bps YoY to 9.1%.
- In June, Sezzle recorded GAAP Net Income of US\$1.2 million, resulting in GAAP Net Income of US\$1.1
 million for the quarter and representing the fourth straight quarter of GAAP Net Income for the
 Company.

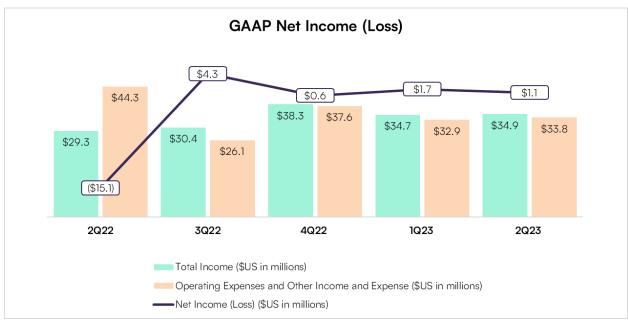


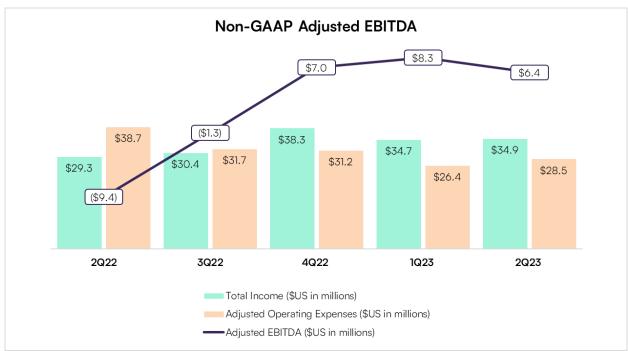
- The Company posted Adjusted EBTDA and Adjusted EBITDA (non-GAAP measures) of US\$1.2 million and US\$2.5 million, respectively, for the month of June. For the quarter ended 30 June 2023, Adjusted EBTDA and Adjusted EBITDA were US\$2.5 million and US\$6.4 million, respectively.
- As of 30 June 2023, Sezzle retained abundant capital and liquidity with US\$63.4 million of cash on hand (US\$1.3 million restricted) and US\$58.3 million drawn on its US\$100 million credit facility.
- As of 30 June 2023, notes receivable (net) and merchant accounts payable amounted to US\$83.8
 million and US\$67.4 million, respectively. The merchant interest program represented US\$52.4 million
 of the merchant accounts payable balance.

Other Notable Items

- Sezzle Canada recently surpassed the milestone of 500,000 users, reaching the mark in just four years. Consumer loyalty in Canada is strong with the top 10% of Sezzle's Canadian shoppers making an average of 23 purchases per year. In addition, the Sezzle app consistently has the highest rating amongst Buy Now, Pay Later apps on the Canadian App Store. These achievements are a testament to Sezzle's commitment to superior execution and a great product offering. The Company remains dedicated to continued investment in the region.
- Nasdaq Listing. Sezzle is waiting for final approval of the Registration Statement after filing Amendment No. 2 to Form S-1 with the SEC on 28 July 2023. Pending any additional final deliveries with the SEC and the Nasdag, the Company is on track to go live on the Nasdag Capital Market shortly thereafter.

Non-GAAP Financial Measures

To supplement our operating results prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States ("GAAP"), we present the following non-GAAP financial measures: Adjusted earnings before taxes, depreciation, and amortization ("Adjusted EBTDA"); and adjusted earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation, and amortization ("Adjusted EBITDA"). Definitions of these non-GAAP financial measures and summaries of the reasons why management believes that the presentation of these non-GAAP financial measures provide useful information to the company and investors are as follows:

- Adjusted EBTDA is defined as GAAP net income (loss), adjusted for certain non-cash and non-recurring charges including depreciation, amortization, equity and incentive—based compensation, and merger-related costs as detailed in the reconciliation table of adjusted EBTDA to GAAP net income (loss) below. We believe that this financial measure is a useful measure for period-to-period comparison of our business by removing the effect of certain non-cash and non-recurring charges that may not directly correlate to the underlying performance of our business.
- Adjusted EBITDA is defined as GAAP net income (loss), adjusted for certain non-cash and non-recurring charges including depreciation, amortization, equity and incentive—based compensation, and merger-related costs, as well as net interest expense as detailed in the reconciliation table of GAAP net income (loss) to adjusted EBITDA. We believe that this financial measure is a useful measure for period-to-period comparison of our business by removing the effect of certain non-cash and non-recurring charges, as well as funding costs, that may not directly correlate to the underlying performance of our business.
- Adjusted operating expense is defined as GAAP operating expenses plus net interest expense; and
 less depreciation and amortization, equity and incentive-based compensation, and other nonrecurring or non-cash charges as detailed in the reconciliation table of adjusted operating expense
 to GAAP operating expense above. We believe that adjusted operating expense is a useful financial
 measure to both management and investors for evaluating our operating performance without the
 impact of certain non-cash and non-recurring charges that do not necessarily correlate to the
 underlying performance of our business.



Additionally, we have included these non-GAAP measures because they are key measures used by our management to evaluate our operating performance, guide future operating plans, and make strategic decisions, including those relating to operating expenses and the allocation of resources. Therefore, we believe these measures provide useful information to investors and other users of this press release to understand and evaluate our operating results in the same manner as our management and board of directors. However, non-GAAP financial measures have limitations, should be considered supplemental in nature, and are not meant as a substitute for the related financial information prepared in accordance with U.S. GAAP. These limitations include the following:

- Adjusted EBTDA and adjusted EBITDA exclude certain recurring, non-cash charges such as
 depreciation, amortization, and equity and incentive—based compensation, which have been, and
 will continue to be for the foreseeable future, recurring GAAP expenses. Further, these non-GAAP
 financial measures exclude certain significant cash inflows and outflows, such as merger-related
 costs (which are comprised of legal fees in connection with our terminated proposed merger with
 Zip Co Limited) and reimbursements for such merger-related costs, which have a significant impact
 on our working capital and cash.
- Adjusted EBITDA excludes net interest expense, which has a significant impact on our GAAP net income, working capital, and cash.
- Long-lived assets being depreciated or amortized may need to be replaced in the future, and these
 non-GAAP financial measures do not reflect the capital expenditures needed for such replacements,
 or for any new capital expenditures or commitments.
- These non-GAAP financial measures do not reflect income taxes that may represent a reduction in cash available to us.
- Non-GAAP measures do not reflect changes in, or cash requirements for, our working capital needs.
- Other companies, including companies in our industry, may calculate the non-GAAP financial measures differently or not at all, which reduces their usefulness as comparative measures.

Because of these limitations, you should not consider these non-GAAP financial measures in isolation or as substitutes for analysis of our financial results as reported under GAAP, and these non-GAAP financial measures should be considered alongside other financial performance measures, including net income (loss) and other financial results presented in accordance with GAAP. We encourage you to review the related GAAP financial measures and the reconciliations of these non-GAAP financial measures to their most directly comparable GAAP financial measures and not rely on any single financial measure to evaluate our business.
