NOTICE OF 2023 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Notice is given that the 2023 Annual General Meeting (AGM or Meeting) of shareholders of Aguia Resources Limited (**Aguia** or **Company**) will be held:

The Explanatory Memorandum accompanying this Notice of Meeting provides additional information on matters to be considered at the AGM. The Explanatory Memorandum, Entitlement to Attend and Vote section and Proxy Form are part of this Notice of Meeting.

CONSIDERATION OF REPORTS

The first item of business is to receive and consider the Financial Report, the Directors' Report, and the Independent Auditor's Report of the Company for the financial year ended 30 June 2023.

All shareholders can view the Company's 2023 Annual Report, which contains the Financial Report, the Directors' Report and the Independent Auditor's Report of the Company for the year ended 30 June 2023, on the Company's website at <https://aguiaresources.com.au>.

Shareholders are not required to vote on this item.

QUESTIONS AND COMMENTS

The Chair will also give shareholders a reasonable opportunity to ask the Auditor questions relevant to the following:

- a. the conduct of the audit;
- b. the preparation and content of the Independent Auditor's Report;
- c. the accounting policies adopted by the Company in relation to the preparation of the financial statements; and
- d. the independence of the Auditor in relation to the conduct of the audit.

The Chair will also give the Auditor a reasonable opportunity to answer written questions submitted by shareholders that are relevant to the content of the Independent Auditor's Report or the conduct of the audit.

Following consideration of the Reports, the Chair will give shareholders a reasonable opportunity to ask questions about and make comments on the business of the meeting, the management of the Company or about the Company generally.

To consider and, if thought fit, pass the following as an **ordinary resolution** of the Company:

“That Mr Warwick Grigor be elected as a Non-Executive Chairman of the Company effective 19 September 2023.”

Resolution 2 – Election of Non-Executive Director – Benjamin Jarvis

To consider and, if thought fit, pass the following as an **ordinary resolution** of the Company:

“That Mr Benjamin Jarvis be elected as a Non-Executive Director of the Company effective 6 September 2023.”

Resolution 3 - Re-election of Director – Martin McConnell

To consider and, if thought fit, pass the following as an **ordinary resolution** of the Company:

“That Martin McConnell, who retires in accordance with clause 6.2(e) of the Company’s Constitution and being eligible for election, is re-elected as a Director of the Company.”



Please note that, in accordance with section 250R(3) of the Corporations Act 2001 (Cth) (**Corporations Act**), the vote on this resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company.

Voting Exclusion Statement

A vote on Resolution 5 must not be cast (in any capacity) by or on behalf of the following persons:

- a. a member of the Key Management Personnel (KMP) whose remuneration details are included in the 2023 Remuneration Report; or
- b. a closely related party of such a KMP (including close family members and companies the KMP controls).

However, a person described above may cast a vote on Resolution 5 as a proxy if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person described above and either:

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- a. the proxy appointment is in writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on the resolution; or
 - b. the vote is cast by the Chair of the Meeting and the appointment of the Chair as a proxy:







ENTITLEMENT TO ATTEND AND VOTE

In accordance with regulation 7.11.37 of the Corporations Regulations 2001 (Cth), the Board has determined that persons who are registered holders of shares of the Company as at 7:00 pm (Sydney time) on Saturday, 25 November 2023, will be entitled to attend and vote at the AGM as a shareholder.

If more than one joint holder of shares is present at the AGM (whether personally, by proxy or by an attorney or by representative) and tenders a vote, only the vote of the joint holder whose name appears first on the register will be counted.

Appointment of Proxy

If you are a shareholder entitled to attend and vote, you may appoint an individual or a body corporate as a proxy. If a body corporate is appointed as a proxy, that body corporate must ensure that it appoints a corporate representative in accordance with section 250D of the Corporations Act to exercise its powers as proxy at the AGM.

A proxy need not be a shareholder of the Company.

A shareholder may appoint up to two proxies and specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy may exercise. If the shareholder does not specify the proportion or number of votes to be exercised, each proxy may exercise half of the shareholder's votes.

To be effective, the proxy must be received at the Share Registry of the Company no later than 9:30 am (Sydney time) on Saturday, 25 November 2023. Proxies must be received before that time by one of the following methods:

A proxy form must be received by the Company in the manner stipulated above to be valid. The Company reserves the right to declare invalid any proxy not received in this manner.

Power of Attorney

A proxy form and the original power of attorney (if any) under which the proxy form is signed (or a certified copy of that power of attorney or other authority) must be received by the Company no later than 9.30 am (Sydney time) on Saturday, 25 November 2023, being 48 hours before the AGM.

Corporate Representatives

A body corporate that is a shareholder or which has been appointed as a proxy is entitled to appoint any person to act as its representative at the AGM. The appointment of the representative must comply with the requirements under section 250D of the Corporations Act. The representative should provide a properly executed letter or other document confirming its authority to act as the company's representative to Link Market Services before the commencement of the meeting. A "Certificate of Appointment of Corporate Representative" form may be obtained from the Company's share registry or online at www.linkmarketservices.com.au.

IMPORTANT: If you appoint the Chair of the Meeting as your proxy, or the Chair becomes your proxy by default, and you do not direct your proxy on how to vote on Resolutions 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12, then by submitting the proxy form you will be expressly authorising the Chair to exercise your proxy on the relevant resolution, even though the resolutions are connected, directly or indirectly, with the remuneration of the KMP.

Voting at the Meeting

It is intended that voting on each of the proposed resolutions at this Meeting will be conducted by a poll rather than on a show of hands. The Company encourages shareholders to lodge their proxy votes in advance of the Meeting by no later than 9:30 am (Sydney time) on Saturday, 25 November 2023.

SHAREHOLDER QUESTIONS – SUBMITTED PRIOR TO THE MEETING

Shareholders who are unable to attend the Meeting or who may prefer to register questions in advance are invited to do so. The Company will not allow conduct at any shareholder meeting which is discourteous to those who are present at the meeting or that in any way disrupts or interferes with the proper conduct of the meeting. The Chair of the Meeting will exercise their powers as the Chair to ensure that the meeting is conducted in an orderly and timely fashion, in the interests of all attending shareholders.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Explanatory Memorandum has been prepared for the information of shareholders of the Company (**Shareholders**) in relation to the business to be conducted at the Company's AGM to be held on Monday, 27 November 2023, at 10:00 am (Sydney time).

The purpose of this Explanatory Memorandum is to provide shareholders with information that is reasonably required by Shareholders to decide how to vote upon the resolutions.

Subject to the abstentions noted below, the Directors unanimously recommend that shareholders vote in favour of all Resolutions. The Chair of the Meeting intends to vote all available undirected proxies in favour of all Resolutions.

Resolutions 1 to 11 are ordinary resolutions, which require a simple majority of votes cast by shareholders present and entitled to vote on the resolution. Resolution 5, relating to the Remuneration Report, is advisory and does not bind the Directors or the Company. Resolution 12 is to be voted on as a special resolution. For a special resolution to be passed, at least 75% of the votes cast by shareholders present and entitled to vote on the resolution must be in favour of the resolution.

RESOLUTION 1 – ELECTION OF NON-EXECUTIVE CHAIRMAN – WARWICK GRIGOR

Warwick Grigor was appointed as an independent non-executive Chairman of the Company on 19 September 2023. In accordance with clause 6.2(e) of the Constitution, Warwick Grigor retires from office at the conclusion of the AGM and is eligible for re-election as a Director of the Company.

ASX Listing Rule 14.4 provides that a director of an entity must not hold office (without re-election) past the third annual general meeting following the director's appointment or three years, whichever is longer.

Mr Grigor brings +40-years of experience in Australian equity capital markets and the resources sector globally. In his early career, Mr Grigor was a mining analyst with stockbroking firms, most notably County NatWest Securities. In 1991, he and Andrew Forrest established Far East Capital Ltd, an ASIC licenced specialist investment bank. In 2008, Warwick sponsored a successful new stockbroking company named BGF Equities and took on the role of Executive Chairman. After three years, Canaccord Genuity acquired 50% of BGF. Four years later Warwick retired from broking to resume operatorship of Far East Capital.

More recently he has aligned himself with high-net-worth investors. A particular focus of recent years has been the interaction between technology, materials and mining. At various times he has sat on mining company boards, the most notable ones being the uranium miner Peninsula Energy (ASX:PEN), the emerging gold producer West Wits Mining (ASX:WWI) and the graphene pioneer, First Graphene Resources (ASX:FGR). Mr Grigor is a graduate of the Australian National University, having completed degrees in law and economics.

If shareholders do not approve the election of Warwick Grigor, then Mr Grigor will cease to be a Director at the conclusion of the Meeting.

The Board supports the re-election of Warwick Grigor as he will contribute to the Board with significant experience in the areas of mining and advisory services.

For the reasons above, the Directors, with Mr Warwick Grigor abstaining, unanimously recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 1.

RESOLUTION 2 – ELECTION OF NON-EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR – BEN JARVIS

Ben Jarvis was appointed as an independent non-executive Director of the Company on 6 September 2023 at a meeting of shareholders. In accordance with clause 6.2(e) of the Constitution, Ben Jarvis retires from office at the conclusion of the AGM and is eligible for re-election as a Director of the Company.

ASX Listing Rule 14.4 provides that a director of an entity must not hold office (without re-election) past the third annual general meeting following the director's appointment or three years, whichever is longer.

Mr Jarvis is an experienced company director in the small resources sector, most notably with companies that have operations in South America. Since 2011, he has been a non-executive director of South-American focused Austral Gold Limited (ASX: AGD; TSX-V: AGLD), a precious metals mining and exploration company with an extensive portfolio of assets in Chile and Argentina. He is also the Non-Executive Chairman of Chilean-focused Freehill Mining Limited (ASX: FHS) which operates the 100%-owned Yervas Buenas magnetite and aggregate materials project in near to La Serena. He is also a non-executive director of QX Resources Limited (ASX: QXR) which has a portfolio of exploration assets in Australia and other investments in the resources sector. Mr Jarvis is the managing director of Six Degrees Investor Relations, an investor relations and advisory firm he founded in 2006 with offices in Sydney and Perth.

If shareholders do not approve the election of Ben Jarvis, then Mr Jarvis will cease to be a Director at the conclusion of the Meeting.

The Board supports the re-election of Ben Jarvis as he will contribute to the Board with significant experience in the areas of advisory services.

For the reasons above, the Directors, with Mr Ben Jarvis abstaining, unanimously recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 2.

RESOLUTION 3 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – MARTIN MCCONNELL

Martin McConnell was appointed as an independent non-executive Director of the Company on 11 June 2019 at a meeting of shareholders. In accordance with clause 6.2(e) of the Constitution, Martin McConnell retires from office at the conclusion of the AGM and is eligible for re-election as a Director of the Company.

ASX Listing Rule 14.4 provides that a director of an entity must not hold office (without re-election) past the third annual general meeting following the director's appointment or three years, whichever is longer.

Martin has over 40 years of experience in banking, insurance and advisory, having held management positions with several domestic and international banks. Martin was previously a Director with Grant Samuel, advising in the real estate and finance sectors. Martin is currently the Chief Executive Officer of the APRA licenced insurance company, Assetinsure Pty Ltd. Martin was instrumental in establishing the credit risk insurance business at Assetinsure which supports banks on a global basis through participation in project finance and other institutional loans, in sectors such as mining, oil and gas, real estate, healthcare, renewables, shipping and aviation.

If shareholders do not approve the election of Martin McConnell, then Mr McConnell will cease to be a Director at the conclusion of the Meeting.

The Board supports the re-election of Martin McConnell as he will contribute to the Board with significant experience in the areas of banking and advisory services.

For the reasons above, the Directors, with Mr Martin McConnell abstaining, unanimously recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 3.

RESOLUTION 4 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – CHRISTINA MCGRATH

Ms Christina McGrath was appointed as an independent non-executive Director of the Company on 11 June 2019 at a meeting of shareholders. In accordance with clause 6.2(e) of the Constitution, Christina McGrath retires from office at the conclusion of the AGM and is eligible for re-election as a Director of the Company.

ASX Listing Rule 14.4 provides that a director of an entity must not hold office (without re-election) past the third annual general meeting following the director's appointment or three years, whichever is longer.

Ms. Christina McGrath has over 30 years of experience in business in the corporate sector. She has had extensive experience as both a commercial lawyer and as an Executive Manager. Her senior Executive Management positions – including Company Secretary – were in the retail and energy resources sectors and include a 10-year period at Coles Myer in both the corporate and supermarket divisions. Over a period of 10 years, Christina worked at KPMG Australia as senior corporate advisor to a wide range of entities, including listed companies. Christina was instrumental in developing KPMG's approach to Corporate Governance globally and held a senior advisory position at KPMG's global headquarters in New York for several years. Christina brings broad commercial and management experience to the Board. She grew up on a farm in the Victorian Mallee, where her family have been farming for generations, and enjoys working in Aguia's growing agribusiness.

If shareholders do not approve the election of Christina McGrath, then Ms McGrath will cease to be a Director at the conclusion of the Meeting.

The Board supports the re-election of Christina McGrath as he will contribute to the Board with significant experience in the areas of banking and advisory services.

For the reasons above, the Directors, with Ms Christina McGrath abstaining, unanimously recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 4.

RESOLUTION 5 - REMUNERATION REPORT

As required by section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act, a resolution that the Company's Remuneration Report be adopted will be put to the vote. Section 250R(3) of the Act provides that the vote on this resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company. However, the Board will take the outcome of the vote into account in setting the remuneration policy for future years.

Shareholders can view the full 2023 Remuneration Report in the 2023 Annual Report, which is available on Aguia's website at <https://aguiaresources.com.au/>.

Following consideration of the 2023 Remuneration Report, the Chair of the Meeting will give shareholders a reasonable opportunity to ask questions about or make comments on the 2023 Remuneration Report.

The Directors abstain, in the interests of good corporate governance, from making a recommendation in relation to Resolution 5.

RESOLUTIONS 6, 7, 8 AND 9 - ISSUE OF SECURITIES TO MR WARWICK GRIGOR, MS CHRISTINA MCGRATH, MR MARTIN MCCONNELL AND MR BEN JARVIS

Background

The Board considers that options are an important tool in rewarding, retaining and incentivising employees of the Company and increasing goal alignment between shareholders, directors, and executives.

Those Directors who do not have an interest in the outcome of the relevant resolution recommend that shareholders vote in favour of each resolution regarding the options for the reasons set out below:

1. The Directors consider it important for the Company to be able to attract and retain experienced directors and that the proposed grant of securities to each Director is appropriate, taking into account the relevant Director's level of experience and contribution to the Company.
2. The Company has previously issued securities to Directors, and Resolutions 6 to 9 ensure a congruent and consistent remuneration philosophy.
3. The Directors consider that the proposed number of securities to be granted to each Director is appropriate and in accordance with the Company's remuneration policy to:
 - motivate the relevant Directors to pursue long-term growth and success of the Company (within an appropriate control framework);
 - align the interests of key leadership with the long-term interests of the Company's Shareholders; and
 - ensure a clear correlation between performance and remuneration.
4. If the Company is unable to issue the proposed securities, then it may need to consider whether, to attract and retain appropriate directors, it needs to increase the level of cash fees payable. By issuing securities, the Company will be able to preserve a greater portion of its cash reserves for operating expenditure than it would if additional cash remuneration were given to the Directors.

Proposed issue of securities

Agua is proposing to issue:

- 5,000,000 unlisted options to Mr Warwick Grigor.
- 3,000,000 unlisted options to each of Ms Christina McGrath, Mr Martin McConnell and Mr Ben Jarvis

Specific details of the proposed issues are set out below.

Section 208 of the Corporations Act

Section 208(1) of the Corporations Act provides that a public company must not, without the approval of the Company's members, give a financial benefit to a related party unless an exception to the prohibition as set out in sections 210 to 216 of the Corporations Act applies to that issue.

As Directors of the Company, each of Mr Warwick Grigor, Ms McGrath, Mr McConnell and Mr Ben Jarvis are all related parties of the Company for the purposes of section 228(2) Corporations Act. The issue of the shares and options proposed under Resolutions 6, 7, 8 and 9 will constitute the giving of a financial benefit to a related party for the purposes of section 229(3)(e) of the Corporations Act.

The Board, with Mr Grigor abstaining, has resolved that the grant of options to Mr Grigor constitutes reasonable remuneration within the meaning of section 211(1) of the Corporations Act as the Company wishes to maximise the use of its cash resources towards the Company's development and equity-based incentives, such as options, are used to supplement cash-based remuneration.

The Board, with Ms McGrath abstaining, has resolved that the grant of options to Ms McGrath constitutes reasonable remuneration within the meaning of section 211(1) of the Corporations Act as the Company wishes to maximise the use of its cash resources towards the Company's development and equity-based incentives, such as options, are used to supplement cash-based remuneration.

The Board, with Mr McConnell abstaining, has resolved that the grant of options to Mr McConnell constitutes reasonable remuneration within the meaning of section 211(1) of the Corporations Act as the Company wishes to maximise the use of its cash resources towards the Company's development and equity-based incentives, such as options, are used to supplement cash-based remuneration.

The Board, with Mr Jarvis abstaining, has resolved that the grant of options to Mr Jarvis constitutes reasonable remuneration within the meaning of section 211(1) of the Corporations Act as the Company wishes to maximise the use of its cash resources towards the Company's development and equity-based incentives, such as options, are used to supplement cash-based remuneration.

For the reasons set out above, shareholder approval is not required under section 208(1) of the Corporations Act. However, approval is still required for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 10.11.

ASX Listing Rule 10.11

ASX Listing Rule 10.11 provides that unless one of the exceptions in ASX Listing Rule 10.12 applies, a listed entity must not issue or agree to issue securities to any of the following unless it obtains shareholder approval by ordinary resolution:

1. a related party;
2. a person who is, or was at any time in the 6 months before the issue or agreement, a substantial (30%+) holder in the entity;
3. a person who is, or was at any time in the 6 months before the issue or agreement, a substantial (10%+) holder in the entity and who has nominated a director to the Board of the entity pursuant to a relevant agreement which gives them a right or expectation to do so;
4. an associate of a person referred to in items 1 - 3 above; or
5. a person whose relationship with the entity or a person referred to items 1 - 4 above is such that, in ASX's opinion, the acquisition of securities should be approved by Shareholders.

As Mr Warwick Grigor, Ms McGrath, Mr McConnell and Mr Ben Jarvis are Directors of Aguia, they are each considered to be a related party under item 1 above and accordingly, shareholder approval is required under Listing Rule 10.11. Resolutions 6, 7, 8 and 9 seek the requisite shareholder approval for the issues under and for the purposes of Listing Rule 10.11.

If shareholders approve Resolution 6, Aguia will be able to proceed with the issue of options as set out above to Mr Warwick Grigor and/or his associates on the terms and conditions as set out in this Notice. If shareholders do not approve Resolution 6, Aguia will not be able to issue options as set out above to Mr Warwick Grigor and/or his associates. The Board would need to consider alternative remuneration arrangements.

If shareholders approve Resolution 7, Aguia will be able to proceed with the issue of shares as set out above to Ms McGrath and/or her associates on the terms and conditions as set out in this Notice. If shareholders do not approve Resolution 7, Aguia will not be able to issue shares as set out above to Ms McGrath and/or her associates. The Board would need to consider alternative remuneration arrangements.

If shareholders approve Resolution 8, Aguia will be able to proceed with the issue of options as set out above to Mr McConnell and/or his associates on the terms and conditions as set out in this Notice. If shareholders do not approve Resolution 8, Aguia will not be able to issue options as set out above to Mr McConnell and/or his associates. The Board would need to consider alternative remuneration arrangements.

If shareholders approve Resolution 9, Aguia will be able to proceed with the issue of options as set out above to Mr Jarvis and/or his associates on the terms and conditions as set out in this Notice. If shareholders do not approve Resolution 9, Aguia will not be able to issue options as set out above to Mr Jarvis and/or his associates. The Board would need to consider alternative remuneration arrangements.

To ensure Aguia can attract and retain the right talent and align the interests of directors with those of shareholders, the Board considers it important for Aguia to offer incentives to its directors and executives that are in line with market practice.

Options – Resolutions 6, 7, 8 and 9

Shareholders are asked to approve the issue of:

- 5,000,000 unlisted options to Mr Warwick Grigor to acquire ordinary shares in the Company, subject to payment of the exercise price (**Chair Options**); and
- 3,000,000 unlisted options to Ms McGrath to acquire ordinary shares in the Company, subject to payment of the exercise price (**Executive Director Options**);
- 6,000,000 unlisted options to both Mr McConnell and Mr Jarvis (3,000,000 unlisted options each) to acquire ordinary shares in the Company, subject to payment of the exercise price (**NED Options**);

At an exercise price of \$0.04 per share on the following terms:

- a. Subject to a change of control event, the Chair Options, Executive Director options and NED Options will vest at any time up until the date of expiry.
- b. The Chair Options, Executive Director options and NED Options are exercisable at \$0.04 (4 cents) per share and are only exercisable between the Issue Date (no later than 1 month after this meeting) and the expiry date (30 November 2026). Each Chair Options, Executive Director options and NED Options upon exercise will convert into 1 fully paid ordinary share upon exercise.

The key terms are outlined above in this Notice of Meeting. These options will vest, at the discretion of the holder up until the date of expiry. All material terms that will be in the offer letter have been disclosed in the NOM.
- 10.13.10 *Resolutions 6, 7, 8 and 9* – Voting exclusion statements are included with each of the resolutions.

ASX Listing Rule 7.1 imposes a 15% cap on the number of equity securities that can be issued by Aguia without shareholders' approval in any rolling 12-month period. However, Aguia is permitted to issue shares (or other securities) in excess of the 15% limit if those shares or securities are issued in reliance on an exception to ASX Listing Rule 7.1 or the issue is approved by shareholders.

Resolutions 6, 7, 8 and 9, if passed, will provide approval for this purpose in relation to both the options and any Shares issued on the vesting of those rights. If approval is given under Listing Rule 10.11, approval is not required under ASX Listing Rule 7.1, in accordance with Exception 14 in ASX Listing Rule 7.2.

The Directors consider that the award of options to Mr Grigor is an appropriate incentive in the best interests of Aguia and therefore recommend (with Mr Grigor abstaining from making a recommendation) that shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 6.

The Directors consider that the award of options to Ms McGrath is an appropriate incentive in the best interests of Aguia and therefore recommend (with Ms McGrath abstaining from making a recommendation) that shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 7.

The Directors consider that the award of options to Mr McConnell is an appropriate incentive in the best interests of Aguia and therefore recommend (with Mr McConnell abstaining from making a recommendation) that shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 8.

The Directors consider that the award of options to Mr Jarvis is an appropriate incentive in the best interests of Aguia and therefore recommend (with Mr Jarvis abstaining from making a recommendation) that shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 9.

RESOLUTION 10 - RATIFICATION OF ISSUE OF THE FEBRUARY 2023 PLACEMENT SHARES UNDER LISTING RULE 7.1

On 22 February 2023, the Company announced details of a placement to professional and sophisticated investors to subscribe to new Aguia shares at a price of \$0.045 per share to raise approximately \$1.436 million (**Placement**). The 32,895,219 Placement shares were issued on 24 February 2023 under the Company's 15% placement capacity in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

Specific information about Resolution 10

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12-month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that period.

As described above, the issue referred to in Resolution 10 was issued within the 15% limit permitted under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and without shareholder approval, thereby reducing the Company's remaining available capacity.

ASX Listing Rule 7.4.2 provides that shareholders may approve an issue of, or agreement to issue, securities after the fact so that the securities issued are regarded as having been made with approval for the purpose of ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

The Company is seeking approval of Resolution 10 for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 7.4 to enable the Company to refresh its issuing capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1, thereby providing the Company with the flexibility to issue further securities under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 if the need arises in the next 12 months.

If shareholders approve Resolution 10, the issue approved will be excluded in calculating Aguia's 15% limit in ASX Listing Rule 7.1, effectively increasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue without shareholder approval over the 12-month period following the issue of the securities.

If shareholders do not approve Resolution 10, any issue not approved will be included in calculating Aguia's 15% limit in ASX Listing Rule 7.1, effectively decreasing the number of equity securities it can issue without shareholder approval over the 12-month period following the issue of the securities.

To this end, Resolution 10 seeks shareholder approval for the issues under and for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.4.

On 27 September 2023, the Company announced details of a placement to professional and sophisticated investors to subscribe to new Aguia shares at a price of \$0.0145 per share to raise approximately \$500,000 (**Placement**). The 34,482,758 Placement shares were issued on 3 October 2023. Placement shares totalling 26,803,836 were issued under the Company's 15% placement capacity in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 7.1. Placement Shares totalling 7,678,922 were issued under the Company's additional placement capacity in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.

The funds raised from the above issues of securities have been and continue to be used for general working capital and to assess new and existing exploration and project development activities.

Specific information about Resolution 11

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 and 7.1A limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12-month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that period (Listing Rule 7.1) and additional capacity of 10% under listing rule 7.1A.

As described above, the issues referred to in Resolution 11 was issued within the 15% limit permitted under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A, an additional 10% capacity and without shareholder approval, thereby reducing the Company's remaining available capacity.



RESOLUTION 12 - APPROVAL OF ADDITIONAL SHARE ISSUE CAPACITY UNDER ASX LISTING RULE 7.1A

Background

ASX Listing Rule 7.1 generally limits the amount of equity securities that a listed entity can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12-month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that period.

However, under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A, certain listed companies may seek shareholder approval by special resolution to issue equity securities equivalent to an additional 10% of the number of ordinary securities on issue by way of placement over the earlier of a 12-month period (**Additional 10% Placement Capacity**). This is in addition to the existing 15% placement capacity permitted by ASX Listing Rule 7.1, bringing the total combined potential placement capacity for the entity to 25%.

A company is eligible to seek shareholder approval for this additional placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A if it satisfies both of the following criteria at the date of the meeting at which that approval is sought:

- a. it has a market capitalisation of \$300 million or less; and
- b. it is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index.

The Company currently satisfies both the above criteria, and it is anticipated that it will satisfy both these criteria at the date of the AGM. If on the date of the AGM, Aguia no longer meets this eligibility criteria, Resolution 12 will be withdrawn.

Accordingly, Resolution 12 is seeking approval of shareholders by special resolution for the issue of up to the number of equity securities as calculated in accordance with the formula in ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.2, at an issue price permitted by ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.3 to such persons as the Board may determine, on the terms described in this Explanatory Memorandum.

Approval of Resolution 12 does not oblige the Company to conduct a placement or use the Additional 10% Placement Capacity. The approval would provide the Company with additional flexibility and the ability to move quickly if an opportunity arises which requires additional capital.

At the date of this Notice, the Company has on issue 468,377,011 fully paid ordinary shares, the Company will have the capacity to issue:

- a. 70,256,552 equity securities under ASX Listing Rule 7.1; and
- b. 46,837,701 equity securities under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.

The actual number of equity securities that the Company will have capacity to issue under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A will be calculated at the date of issue of the equity securities in accordance with the formula prescribed in ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.2.

If shareholders approve Resolution 12, the effect will be to allow Aguia to issue equity securities under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A up to the combined 25% capacity in ASX Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A without further shareholder approval.

If shareholders do not approve Resolution 12, Aguia will not be able to access the additional 10% capacity to issue equity securities without shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A and will remain subject to the 15% capacity limit on issuing equity securities without shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

Additional Information
