Q1 FY24 (September 30, 2023) Activity Report and Appendix 4C

<u>Keypath Education International, Inc.</u> (Keypath or the Company) (ASX: KED) today released its Quarterly Activity Report and Appendix 4C – Quarterly Cash Flow Report for the quarter ended September 30, 2023 (Q1 FY24). The Appendix 4C is prepared in US dollars (the Company's functional and presentation currency) under US GAAP and is unaudited. Similarly, any financial measures presented in the Quarterly Activity Report are unaudited.

Highlights of Q1 FY24

- Strong revenue growth in Q1 FY24
 - Q1 FY24 revenue of US\$35.5 million, 13.1% higher than Q1 FY23 (15.2% higher on a constant currency basis)
 - Q1 FY24 revenue within our Healthcare¹ segment was 27.8% higher than Q1 FY23
- Continued innovation and growth in new products
 - Continued expansion in Healthcare programs including Nursing, Speech Pathology, and Mental Health
- Contribution margin and adjusted EBITDA improved significantly as vintages with improved growth, unit economics and returns profiles work through our proven unit economic model
 - Q1 FY24 contribution margin of US\$10.6 million, US\$4.4 million higher than Q1 FY23
 - Q1 FY24 adjusted EBITDA of US\$2.2 million (including US\$0.5 million foreign currency exchange losses), US\$5.6 million higher than Q1 FY23
- Strong cash position
 - US\$32.9 million (no debt) as of September 30, 2023
 - Organic growth fully funded through to cash flow breakeven
- As we continue to position the Company for long-term growth, we remain confident in achieving our guidance for FY24 and breakeven adjusted EBITDA from H2 FY24 with continuing improvement beyond H2 FY24

Keypath's Founder and CEO, Steve Fireng, said, "We are pleased with our progress in FY24 with strong revenue and adjusted EBITDA growth in Q1 FY24 keeping us on track to meet our FY24 guidance. These Q1 FY24 results show the progress we are making in our strategic focus on Healthcare in the US, and the APAC region, providing us with confidence in driving revenue growth and continued profitability improvements in the coming periods, including achieving breakeven adjusted EBITDA from H2 FY24.

¹ Healthcare includes Nursing, Health & Social Services verticals.

While we continue to move our investment from our mature vintages to newer vintages and programs where we see the strongest demand, we have driven significant improvement in contribution margin as our recent larger vintages progress through our proven unit economic model, despite our most recent vintages being the largest in our history and in their deepest investment phase. We are pleased with the progress and outcomes within Healthcare programs as we continue to build out a global Healthcare platform. These investments, along with the continued expansion in APAC, will provide long-term sustainable and profitable growth for Keypath.

Further underlining our confidence in the future, we continue to expect future vintages will achieve US\$25 million - US\$35 million in revenue at maturity. Keypath is well-positioned to expand its technology and services to continue assisting universities in providing quality access to education in a digital environment, including by continuing to grow our programs across partners and regions."

Revenue growth accelerates in Q1 FY24

Keypath has delivered strong revenue growth in Q1 FY24 with revenue increasing 13.1% to US\$35.5 million (15.2% growth on a constant currency basis when adjusted for unfavorable foreign exchange impacts of US\$0.6 million⁵).

³ Contribution margin is revenue less direct costs, which consists of salaries and wages, direct marketing and general & administrative expenses attributable to direct departments. Contribution margin is not a US GAAP based measure.

⁴ Adjusted EBITDA is earnings before interest, tax, depreciation and amortization excluding certain non-recurring items and stock-based compensation. Adjusted EBITDA is not a US GAAP based measure. Note that reported EBITDA for Q1 FY24 was US\$1.3 million as compared to US\$(2.6) million in Q1 FY23. Q1 FY24 adjustments to reported EBITDA include US\$0.1 million of one-time stock-based compensation, US\$0.6 million of ongoing stock-based compensation and \$0.3 million SEC Registration costs. Q1 FY23 adjustments to reported EBITDA include US\$0.6 million of one-time stock-based compensation, US\$0.6 million of ongoing stock-based compensation, offset by a \$2.0 million favorable adjustment from the final settlement of the long-term incentive plan cash awards.

⁵ The comparisons at constant currency rates (foreign exchange) reflect comparative local currency foreign exchange rates at the prior period's average foreign exchange rates. This measure provides information on the change in revenue assuming that foreign currency exchange rates have not changed between the prior period and the current period. Management believes the use of this measure aids in the understanding of changes in revenue without the impact of foreign currency.

We have continued to see strong demand for programs in the North American region in Healthcare and more broadly in APAC. Our pipeline of new programs continues to be at historically high levels and is exceeding expectations, underpinning or confidence in the longer-term growth prospects of the Company.

Contribution margin and adjusted EBITDA improved significantly as vintages progress through our proven unit economic model despite investment in large new vintages

Contribution margin for Q1 FY24 increased by US\$4.4 million to US\$10.6 million reflecting the large recent vintages progressing through our proven unit economic model to maturity, offsetting the large number of programs we have signed recently that are in their deepest investment phase and the FY21-FY25 vintages⁶ being very large vintages, in terms of size and investment and expected steady-state revenue of US\$25 million – US\$35 million.

Adjusted EBITDA increased by US\$5.6 million to US\$2.2 million, reflecting our continued growth, strategic focus, and cost efficiency and leverage we are driving, further enhanced by our investment efficiency with flat period-on-period investment of US\$3.3 million (compared to US\$3.4 million in Q1 FY23) in incremental costs associated with the large, new vintages noted above.

Cash Flows and Position

As of September 30, 2023, the Company had total cash on hand of US\$32.9 million, reflecting net cash outflow of US\$13.9 million in Q1 FY24, in line with previous years' cash flow seasonality.

The Company remains debt-free and fully funded to pursue the Company's growth objectives.

Net cash used in operating activities was US\$12.0 million Q1 FY24, reflecting the timing of collections and payments, employee costs and direct marketing required to procure, develop and manage new programs ahead of their launch. Q1 and Q3 are typically lower cash receipt quarters as our largest student starts / enrollments are typically in these quarters with a relatively high cash outflow versus cash inflow. Quarterly cash flow is also impacted by the timing of launches and therefore spending on new programs. The use of cash in the quarter was expected and is in line with our plan for the full year.

Net cash used in investing activities was US\$1.4 million in Q1 FY24, primarily representing the capitalized value of employee and contractor costs directly involved in the development of programs and eligible for capitalization under US GAAP.

Net cash used in financing activities was insignificant in Q1 FY24.

FY24 Outlook

We continue to proactively and analytically transition our focus and investment into newer vintages comprising programs with improved growth, unit economics and returns profiles. The performance of our vintages in FY24 and demand from universities to partner with Keypath continue to underline our confidence in the outlook for these newer vintages.

⁶ Vintage year or vintage cohort refers to the fiscal year in which the first student intake occurred for any given program. For example, if a program commences on July 1, 2023, it will be classified as an FY24 vintage. Fiscal year is from July 1 to June 30.

Having seen the strong growth and profitability performance of our FY21 vintage when compared to our earlier "pre-KeypathEDGE" vintages, we are confident investment in these newer vintages will drive strong revenue growth (with newer vintages reaching US\$25 million – US\$35 million at maturity) and profitability, as shown in these Q1 FY24 results.

As we continue to position the Company for long-term growth, we remain confident in achieving our guidance for FY24 of:

- Revenue: US\$130 million US\$135 million on a constant currency basis⁷
- Adjusted EBITDA: US\$(1) million US\$(3) million on a constant currency basis

With our track record of revenue growth, the largest vintages with the strongest programs in our history moving through our proven unit economic model and our record partner and program pipeline, we remain confident in driving revenue growth into the future.

We are well funded to cash flow positivity and remain confident in our target of adjusted EBITDA profitability from H2 FY24.
