Commercial Operations

On 24 August 2023 AVADA announced an expansion to its presence in Victoria, entering into a binding agreement to acquire STA Traffic Management ('STA'). The acquisition provides AVADA the opportunity to diversify its client base, with STA primarily servicing corporate clients in the infrastructure and utilities sectors in Victoria. In addition to expanding and diversifying AVADA's customer base and footprint in Victoria, the acquisition of STA Traffic Management brings synergies and integration benefits through allocation of resources and back-office efficiencies.

The acquisition is expected to be earnings and earnings per share accretive. The acquisition settled on 23 October 2023.
