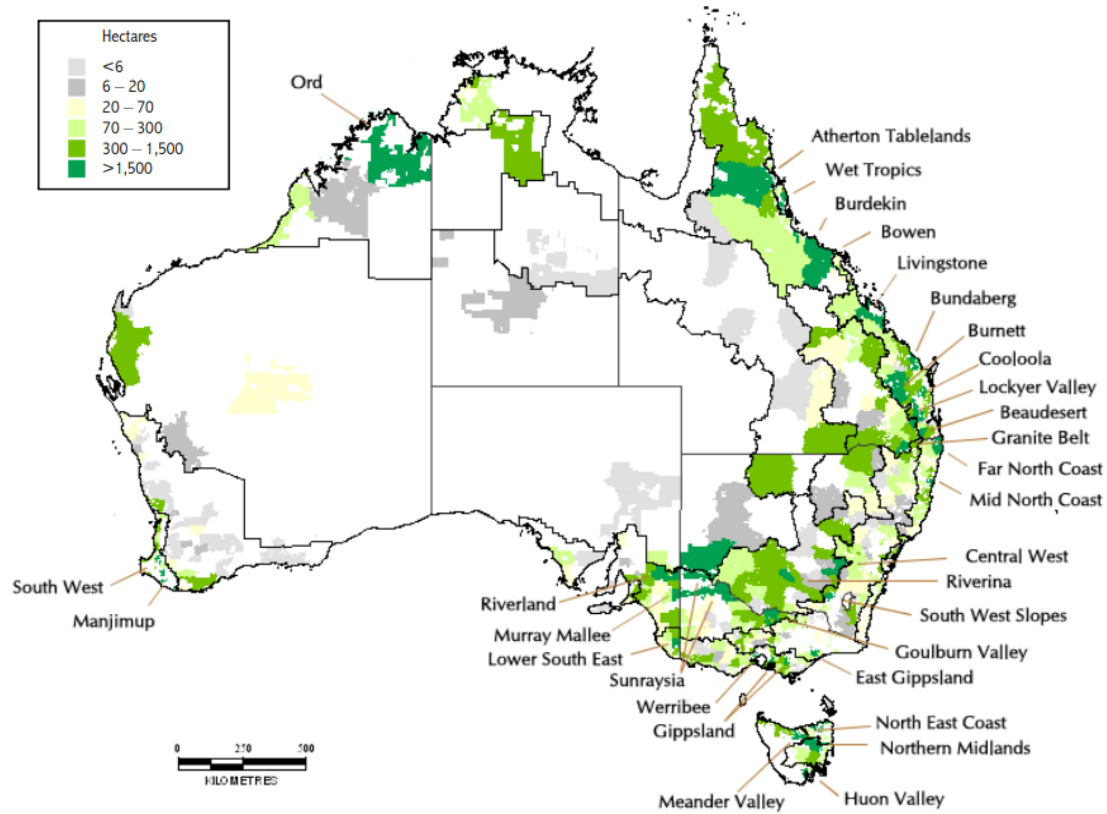

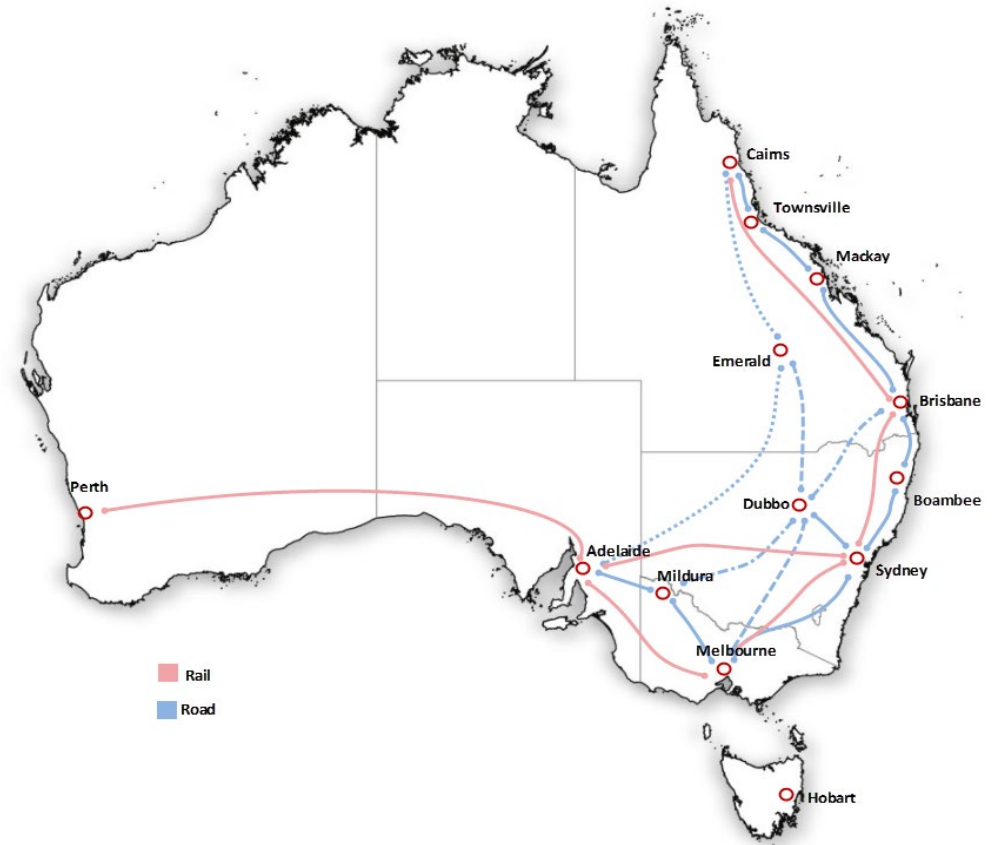


LINDSAY NETWORK – DIVERSIFYING & BUILDING RESILIENCE

KEY HORTICULTURE REGIONS BY DENSITY

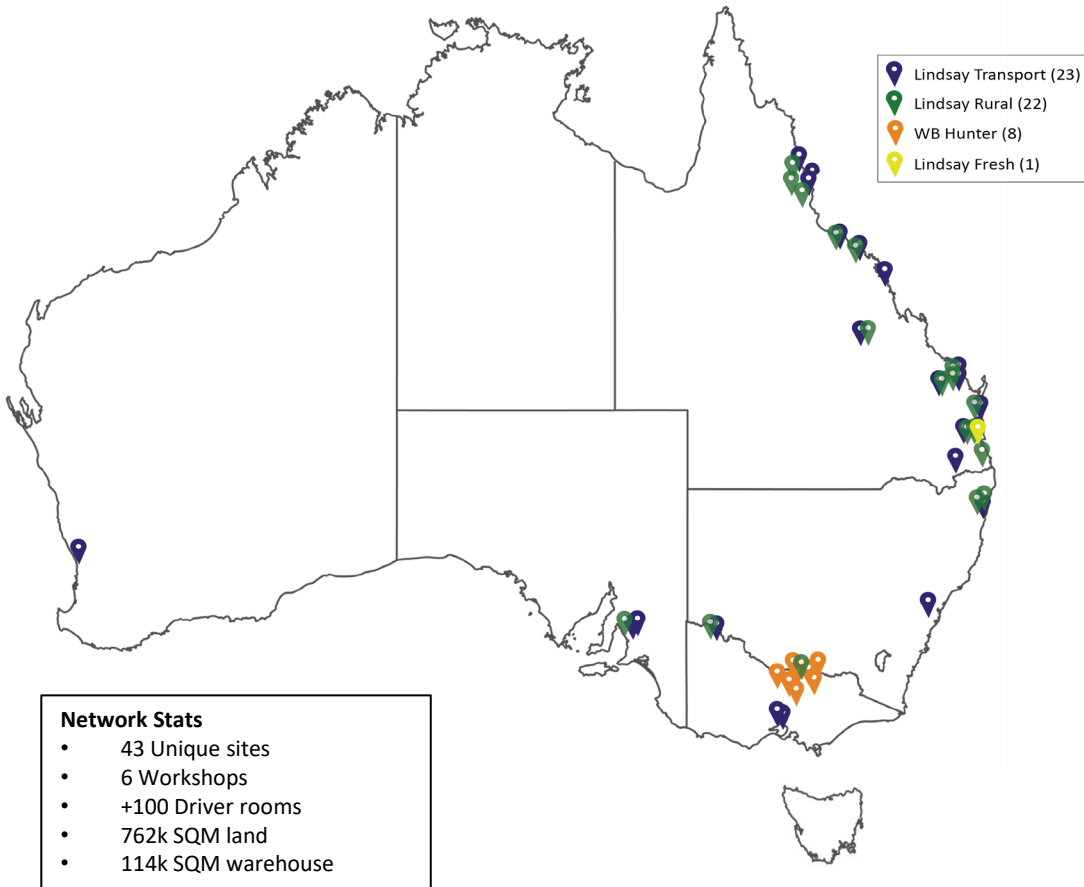

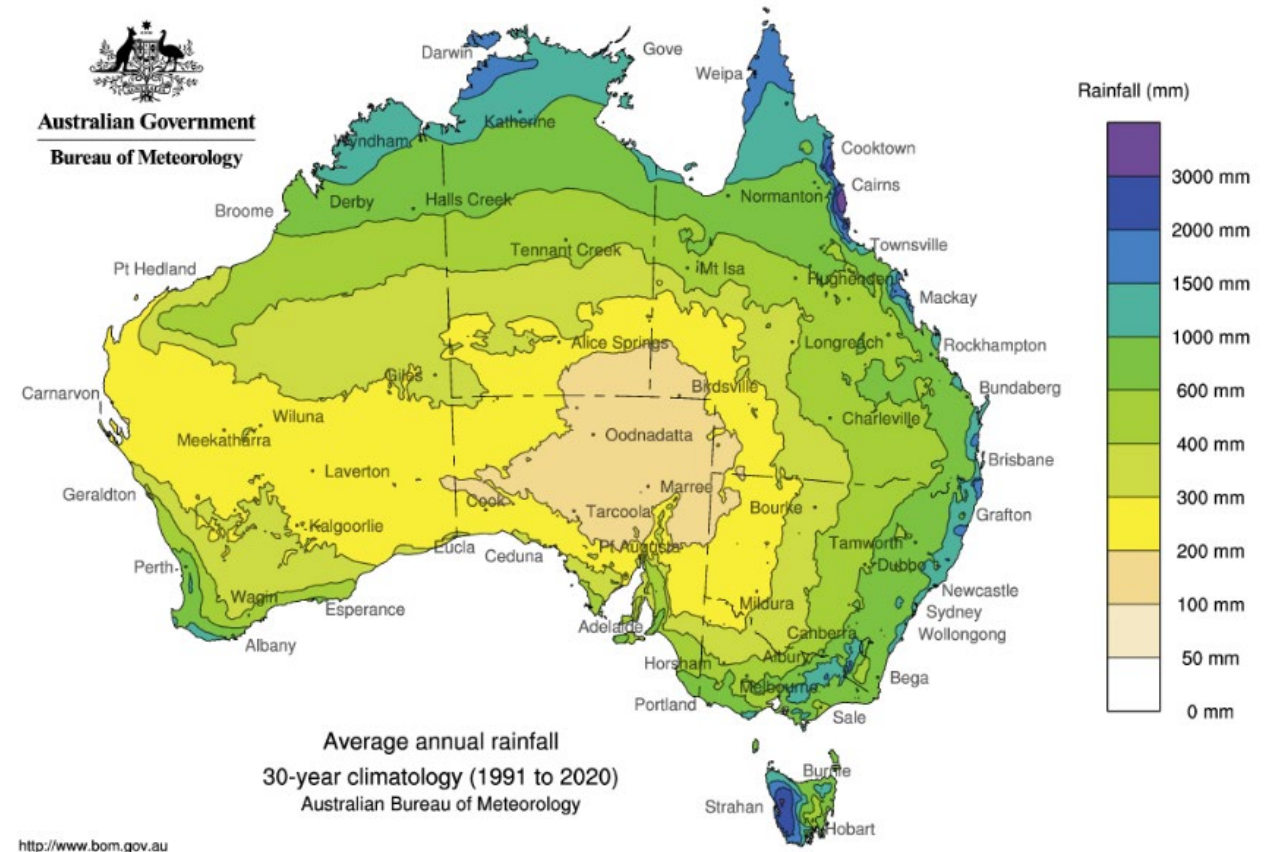

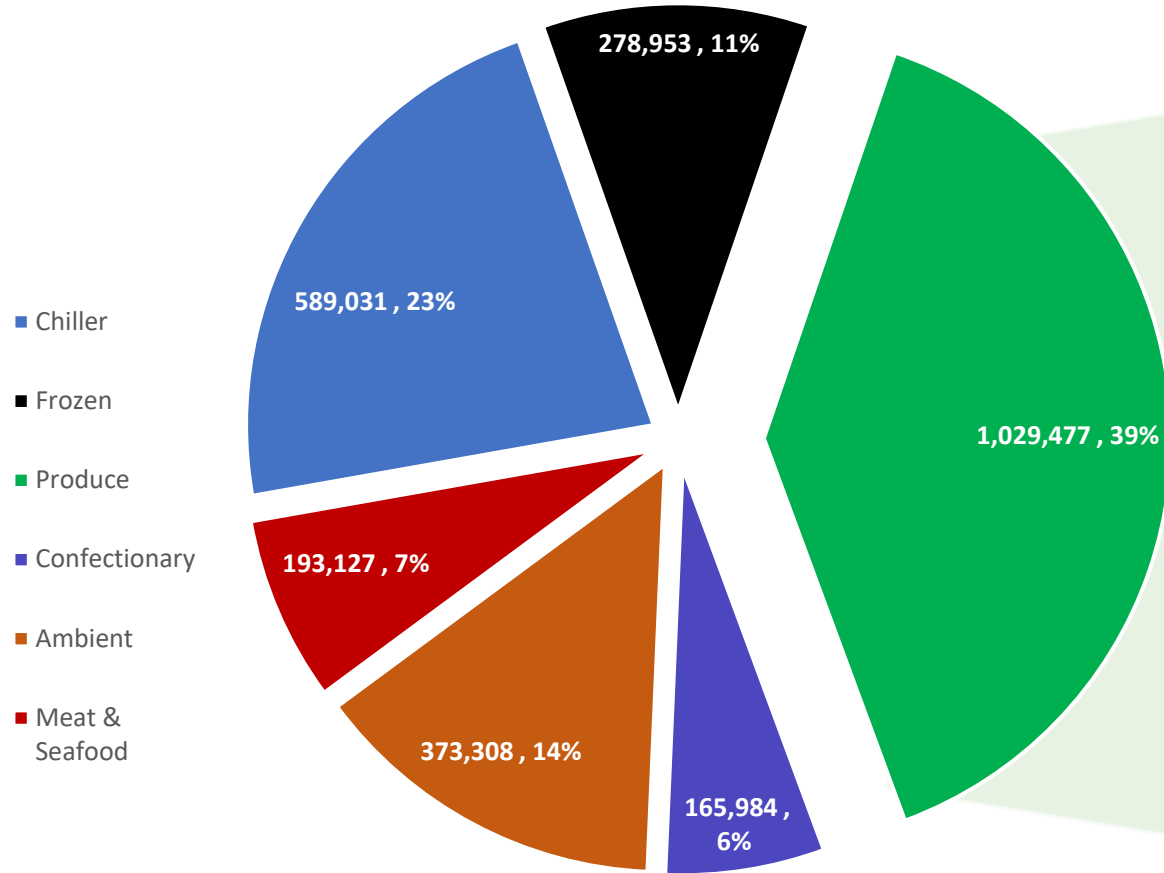


AVERAGE ANNUAL RAINFALL (1991 – 2020)



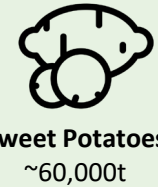
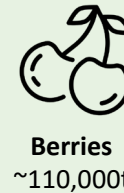

LAST TWELVE MONTHS



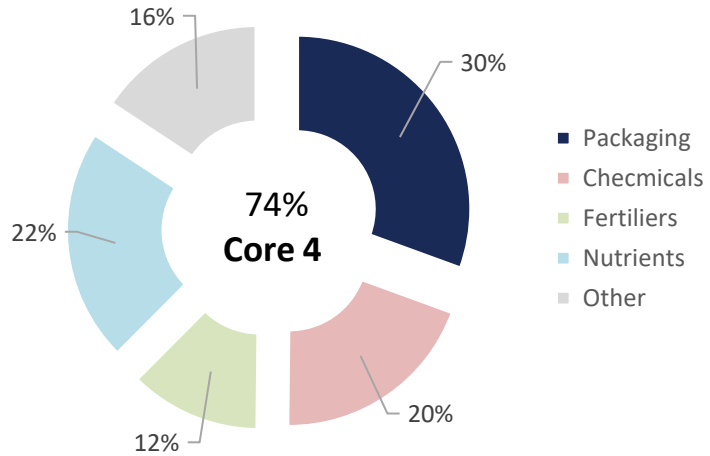

TOP SIX HORTICULTURE CATEGORIES

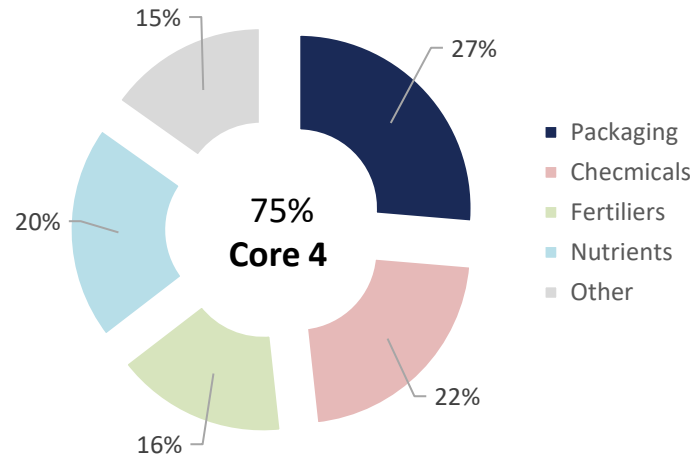

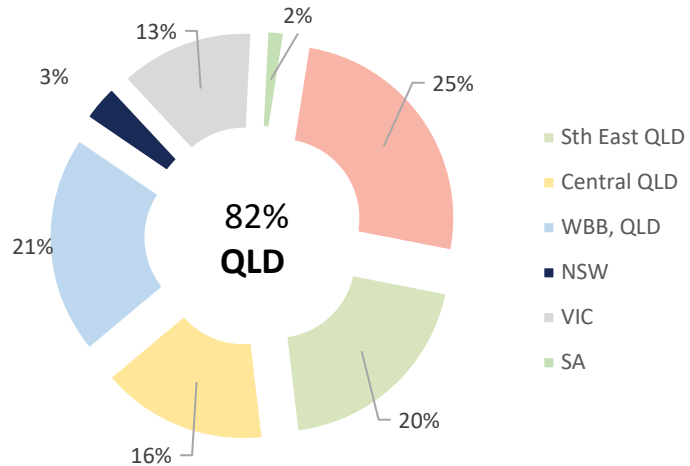
Rural FY19 Sales Mix (%)



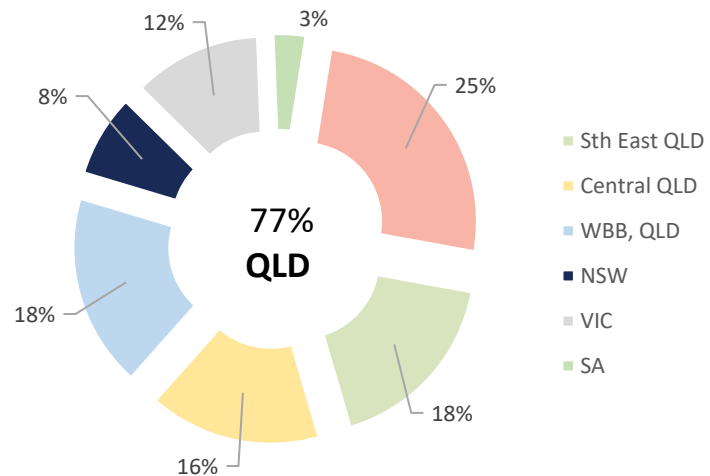
Rural FY23 Sales Mix (%)

Product Mix

Geographic diversification

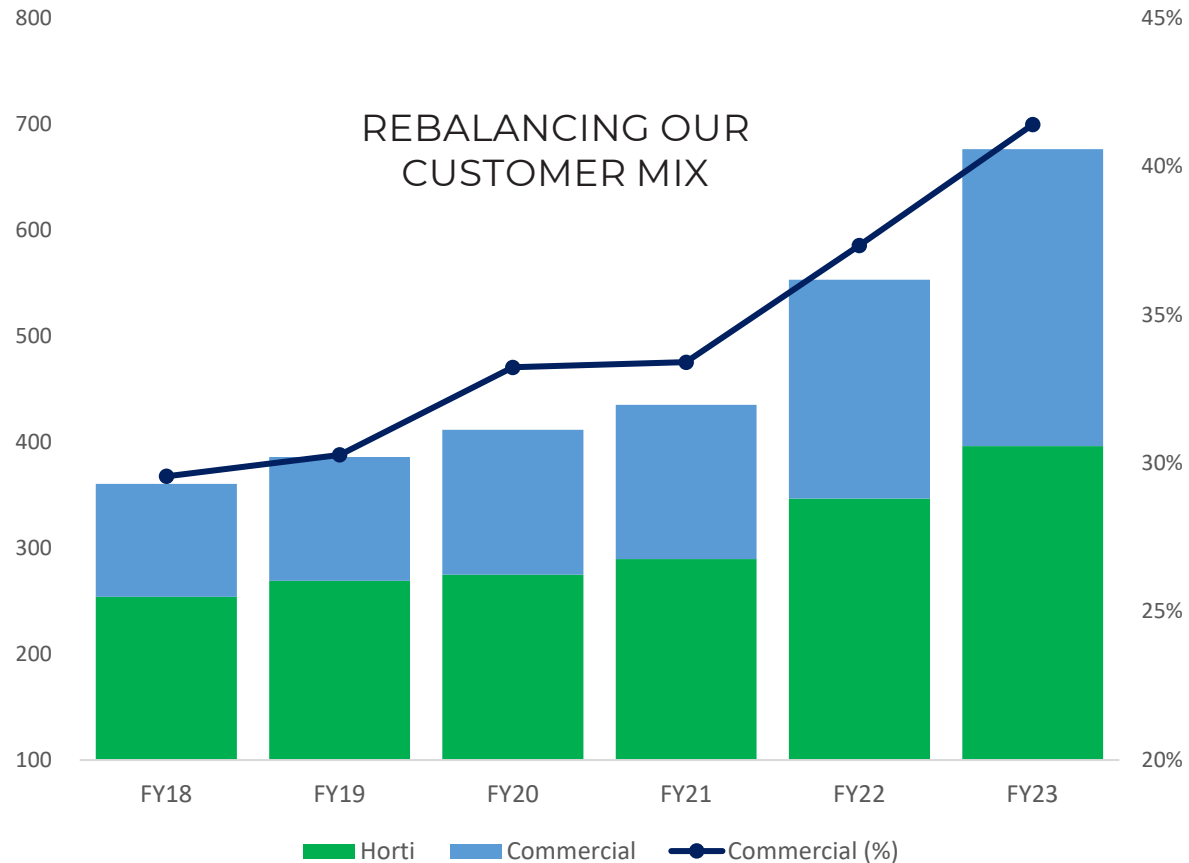
- 77% of sales generated in Queensland.

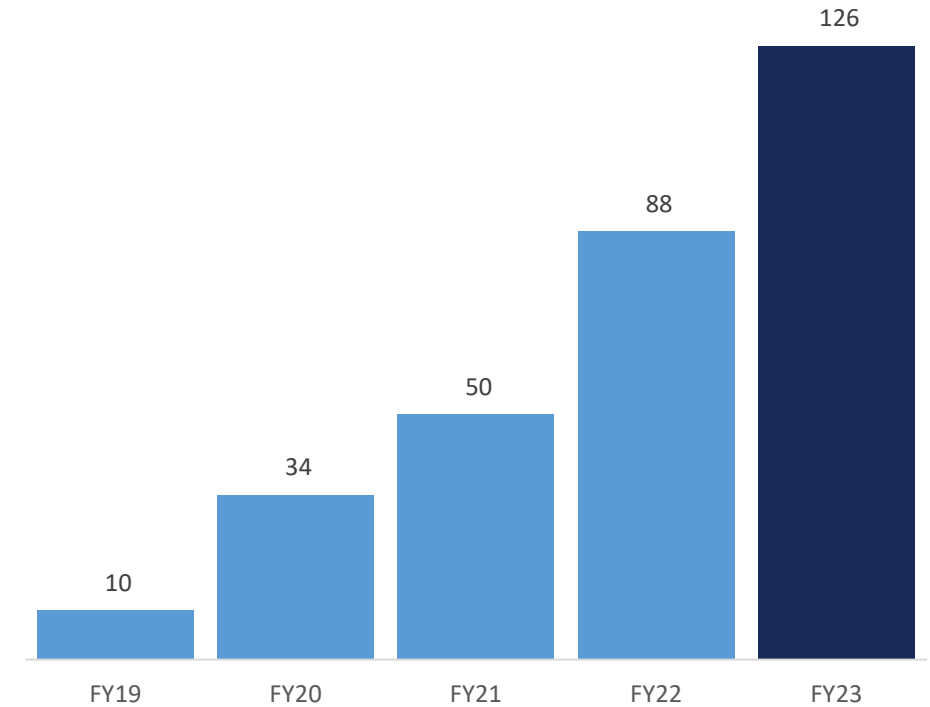

GROUP REVENUES – HORTICULTURE VS COMMERCIAL (\$'M)



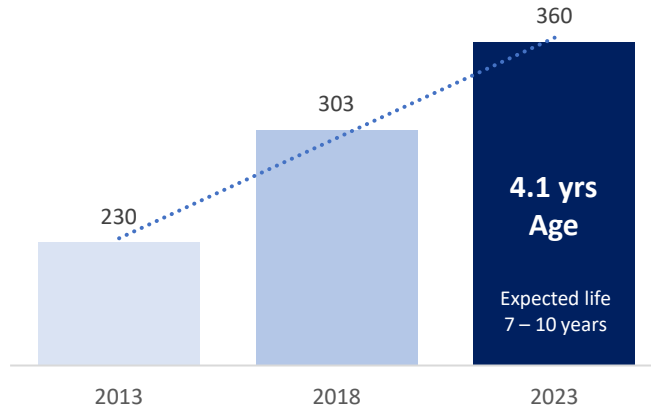
RAIL REVENUE (\$'M)



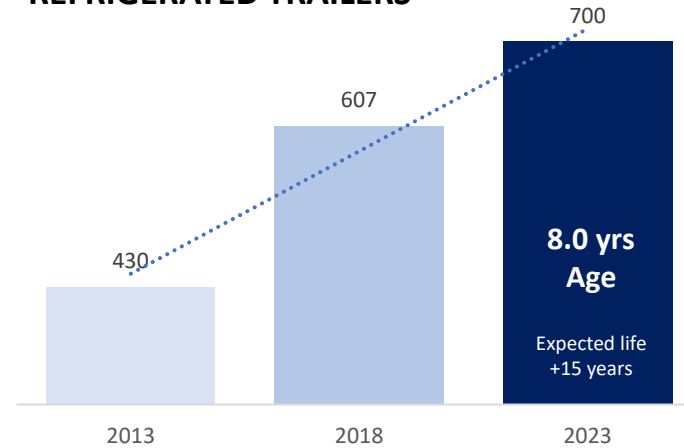

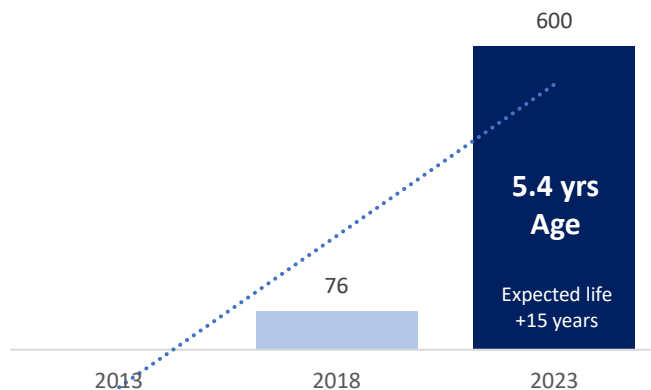

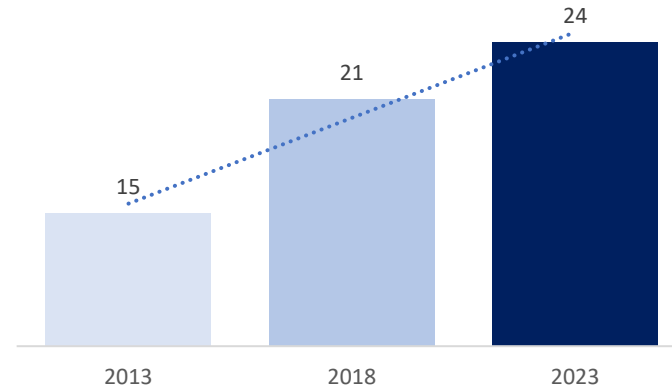

REFRIGERATED FACILITIES



- Largest refrigerated carrier in Australia (~10% of the market)
- Over the last 10 years we have continued to expand our fleet and network to meet customer demand
- In 2018, we diversified into rail providing our customers with multi-modal optionality
 - Rail provides a lower capital cost alternative for growth combined with a longer life asset, driving ROIC
 - Rail delivers positive ESG benefits including safer transportation and less carbon emissions (~4x)
 - Cheaper alternative for customers, but rail is slower and be less reliable
- Road fleet will remain the foundation of the logistics business due to the limitations of rail and customer demand
- Committed to invest in facilities that will deliver long-run sustainable growth

ERKSINE PARK

- Commissioned March 2020, the total site covers 57,000m² including 10,000m² under cover
- Erskine Park is one of the most critical sites in the Lindsay network – servicing all of Australia as a key transshipping depot ~19,000 spaces cross docked weekly with ~300 staff including 160 drivers
- The site makes ~4,500 local consignment pickups and deliveries weekly (~25,000 pallets) or the equivalent of +730 B-doubles a week
- The depot predominantly handles commercial freight (~70%) with rail representing around 25% of the sites total outbound volumes
