# Trading update, Quarterly Activities Report and ASX Appendix 4C For the Quarter Ended 31 December 2023

**Sydney, 31 January 2024**: BSA (Company or Group) is pleased to publish the quarterly activities report, trading update and the related Appendix 4C statement of cashflows for the quarter ending 31 December 2023 (Q2 FY2024):

#### Highlights:

- Financial results for the half year ended 31 December 2023 are presented as continuing operations and discontinued operations;
- Material year on year improvement in continuing operations as a result of additional client scopes and pricing initiatives;
- Half Year ended 31 December 2023 EBITDA margin of 8.3% (pcp 5.2%) achieved in continuing operations;
- Divested business transition services completed;
- Entered into partnership with Guardian Protection Services Pty Ltd (Guardian) for APS Fire Division and conducting an orderly closure; and
- Half year results will be released on 23 February 2024 with investor call details below.

#### Trading update:

BSA is also pleased to release an unaudited trading update for the 6 months to 31 December 2023 for continuing operations:

- Half year revenue of \$121.2 million is down by 1.5% vs. prior comparative period (pcp). Volumes across
  fixed line services were impacted by customer roll out timing which marginally reduced revenue.
  However, gross margin and EBITDA margins increased due to favourable mix of work. Other platforms
  continue to deliver stable volumes;
- Half year EBITDA of \$10.1 million (\$3.7 million increase in EBITDA to pcp) driven by higher margin work on Fixed Line platforms;
- Performance is expected to continue at similar margins as a result of pricing changes and volume forecasts; and
- Focus of the Group remains on the Telecommunications and Energy sectors.

Commenting on the half year results, the Joint CEO's Arno Becker and Richard Bartley said:

"Our continuing operations have delivered exceptional results over the past six months, demonstrating a steady increase in profitability. Our margin mix continues to be favourable and is indicative of our commitment to our clients.

The Fire business has been a key area of focus among our stakeholders. We now have certainty and a clear path forward regarding this matter".

## **Discontinued operations**

#### **APS Fire Division partnership with Guardian Protection Services**

BSA has entered into an agreement with Guardian Protection Services Pty Limited (Guardian) in relation to the APS Fire Division which is currently held for sale. The partnership will see Guardian assume responsibility for certain key projects from APS Fire, subject to approvals, in addition to providing services to APS Fire in relation to warranty periods for recently completed projects.

Guardian is a trusted and experienced business which operates in the fire protection industry. Guardian company has operated for 22 years and has extensive experience with a proven track record. Guardian operates across multiple and diverse sectors including Commercial, Industrial, Infrastructure and Government.

This move completes an exit of all non-core activities in line with the Company strategy and future focus which will be on the telecommunications sectors and complementary markets.

The BSA Board and Management team understand the importance of providing stability to all stakeholders including valued employees and clients. The transition plan to Guardian will provide certainty to both people and projects. The APS Fire division will not tender for new work, partner with Guardian to finalise specific projects and cease operations once all rights and obligations have been addressed.

#### **Financial Impact:**

BSA expects to incur approximately \$3.8m in closure costs for APS Fire including people related costs, warranty liabilities in addition to project completion and wind down costs. This will be recognised as one off restructure costs in the Groups' half year financial statements. The cash impact of the closure will ultimately be less than this amount as client retentions are returned over the coming 24 months and working capital is unwound.

BSA provides an unaudited trading update for discontinued operation for the 6 months ended 31 December 2023 excluding restructure costs.
