2. DETAILS OF THE OFFERS

2.1 SPP

On 26 April 2024, the Company announced its intention to undertake a Share Purchase Plan (**SPP**) to Eligible Shareholders (as detailed below).

Under the SPP, Eligible Shareholders were entitled to apply for Shares up to the value of \$30,000 at \$0.007 per Share (**SPP Share**), together with, subject to Shareholder approval, one (1) free-attaching unlisted option exercisable at \$0.014 and expiring two (2) years after the date of issue (**SPP Option**) for every two (2) SPP Shares subscribed for and issued under the SPP. Fractional entitlements will be rounded to the nearest whole number.

The issue of the SPP Options is subject to Shareholder approval at an extraordinary general meeting, which will take place on 20 June 2024 (**General Meeting**).

Further details of the SPP are set out in the Company's ASX announcements released on 3 and 6 May 2024.

2.2 Top-Up Placement

Additionally, the Company agreed to grant Canaccord (also defined below) the right to facilitate an offer of Shares to raise up to an additional \$1,500,000 through a placement (**Top-Up Placement**). The issue price for the Shares under the Top-Up Placement was the same as the SPP Shares. The Shares under the Top-Up Placement were issued utilising the Company's available capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.

On 14 June 2024, the Company issued 132,857,143 Shares to the Placement Participants (defined below) to raise approximately \$930,000 (before costs). The Company utilised its existing ASX Listing Rule 7.1A capacity to issue the Shares under the Top-Up Placement and proposes to issue a further 10,000,000 Shares to Director, Julian Babarczy, pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 10.11 and subject to Shareholder approval at a future general meeting of Shareholders.

Subject to Shareholder approval at the General Meeting, the Top-Up Placement will also include the issue of one (1) free-attaching Option (**Placement Option**) for every two (2) Shares subscribed for on the same terms as the SPP Options.

2.3 Underwriting

The Company entered into an underwriting agreement with Canaccord Genuity (Australia) Limited (ACN 075 071 466) (Canaccord or the Underwriter) on 22 April 2024, whereby Canaccord agreed to underwrite the SPP up to a maximum amount of \$1,500,000 (Underwritten Amount) (the Underwriting Agreement). In the event that Eligible Shareholders subscribe for an amount less than the Underwritten Amount (Subscription Amount), Shares to the value of the difference between the Subscription Amount and the Underwritten Amount will be placed to nominees or sub-underwriters of Canaccord (Shortfall Shares).

Pursuant to the Underwriting Agreement, the Company agreed to issue/pay Canaccord the fees set out in the Appendix 3B lodged by the Company on 26 April 2024 including the issue of 30,000,000 Options on the same terms as the SPP Options and the Placement Options (**Broker Options**). The Company will seek Shareholder approval for the issue of the Broker Options at the General Meeting.

2.4 Shareholder approvals

The issue of the Placement Options and the SPP Options is subject to Shareholder approval at the General Meeting.

If Shareholder approval is not obtained for the Placement Options and SPP Options, the Company will be unable to proceed with the Offers and issue the Options. If Shareholder approval is not obtained for the Broker Options, the Company will issue the Options pursuant to the Company's ASX Listing Rule placement capacity.

Further information is set out in the Notice of General Meeting announced on 17 May 2024.

2.5 The Offers

2.5.1 SPP Options Offer

The SPP Options Offer is an offer of one (1) SPP Option for every two (2) SPP Shares subscribed for and issued to Eligible Shareholders that participated in the SPP (**SPP Participants**).

Based on the number of Shares subscribed for under the SPP, 107,142,849 SPP Options will be issued under the SPP Options Offer, subject to Shareholder approval at the General Meeting.

The terms and conditions of the SPP Options are set out in Section 4.1. All of the Shares issued upon exercise of the SPP Options will rank equally with the Shares on issue at the date of this Prospectus. Refer to Section 4.2 for further information regarding the rights and liabilities attaching to the Shares.

No funds will be raised from the issue of SPP Options as the SPP Options are free attaching to SPP Shares issued under the SPP on a one (1) for two (2) basis.

2.5.2 Placement Options Offer

The Placement Options Offer is an offer of one (1) Placement Option for every two (2) Shares subscribed for and issued to the institutional, sophisticated and professional investors, who are clients of Canaccord that participated in the Top-Up Placement (**Placement Participants**), subject to Shareholder approval at the General Meeting. Based on the number of Shares issued under the Top-Up Placement, 71,428,572 Placement Options will be issued under the Placement Options Offer.

The terms and conditions of the Placement Options are set out in Section 4.1. All of the Shares issued upon exercise of the Placement Options will rank equally with the Shares on issue at the date of this Prospectus. Refer to Section 4.2 for further information regarding the rights and liabilities attaching to the Shares.

No funds will be raised from the issue of Placement Options as the Placement Options are free attaching to Shares that were issued under the Top-Up Placement on a one (1) for two (2) basis.

2.5.3 Broker Options Offer

The Broker Options Offer is an offer of 30,000,000 Broker Options to Canaccord.

The terms and conditions of the Broker Options are set out in Section 4.1. All of the Shares issued upon exercise of the Broker Options will rank equally with the Shares on issue at the date of this Prospectus. Refer to Section 4.2 for further information regarding the rights and liabilities attaching to the Shares.

No funds will be raised from the issue of Broker Options as they are issued in consideration for underwriting and lead manager services provided by Canaccord pursuant to the SPP and the Top-Up Placement (if any).

2.6 Minimum subscription

There is no minimum subscription for the Offers.

2.7 ASX listing

The Company will not apply for official quotation on ASX of the Options offered pursuant to this Prospectus.

2.8 Applications

By completing an Application Form, applicants will be taken to have declared that all details and statements made by them are complete and accurate and that they have personally received the Application Form together with a complete and unaltered copy of the Prospectus.

Placement Options Offer

The Placement Options Offer will only be extended to the Placement Participants (or their nominee/s). Application Forms will only be provided to these parties on invitation by the Directors.

No subscription monies are payable for the Placement Options offered pursuant to this Prospectus under the Placement Options Offer as the Options are being issued on the basis of one (1) Placement Option for every two (2) Shares subscribed for and issued under the Placement.

Completed Application Forms must be returned to the address set out on the Application Form, with sufficient time to be received by or on behalf of the Company by **no later than 5.00pm (AEST) on the Closing Date**.

SPP Options Offer

The SPP Options Offer will only be extended to the SPP Participants (or their nominee/s). Application Forms will only be provided to these parties on invitation by the Directors.

2.9 Issue

Options issued pursuant to the Offers will be issued in accordance with the ASX Listing Rules and timetable set out at the commencement of this Prospectus.

Holding statements for Options issued under the Offers will be mailed in accordance with the timetable set out at the commencement of this Prospectus.

2.10 Restrictions on the distribution of the Prospectus

The Offers do not, and are not intended to, constitute an offer in any place or jurisdiction in which, or to any person to whom, it would not be lawful to make such an offer or to issue this Prospectus.

The Offers are not being extended and Options will not be issued to applicants with a registered address which is outside Australia or New Zealand.

New Zealand

The Offers to New Zealand investors are regulated offers made under Australian and New Zealand law. In Australia, this is Chapter 8 of the Corporations Act and regulations made under that Act. In New Zealand, this is subpart 6 of Part 9 of the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013 and Part 9 of the Financial Markets Conduct Regulations 2014.

3. PURPOSE AND EFFECT OF THE OFFERS

3.1 Purpose of the Offers

The purpose of the Offers is to make an offer of Options to the SPP Participants, Placement Participants and the Underwriter.

Additionally, the Offers are being made such that the relief provided under ASIC Corporations (Sale Offers That Do Not Need Disclosure) Instrument 2016/80 with respect to the on-sale provisions of section 707 of the Corporations Act is available. Specifically, if the Options are issued with disclosure under this Prospectus, then the Shares issued upon the exercise of any of the Options can be on-sold within 12 months of their issue, without a disclosure document for the on-sale offer.

No funds will be raised from the issue of the Options as they are being issued freeattaching to Shares issued to SPP Participants and Placement Participants and to the Underwriter in consideration for lead manager and underwriting services provided.

3.2 Effect of the Offers

The principal effect of the Offers will be to increase the number of Options on issue from nil as at the date of this Prospectus to 208,571,421.

3.3 Effect of the Offers on capital structure

The Company currently has 2,056,188,092 Shares on issue. There will be no resulting change to the number of Shares on issue by virtue of the Offers.

3.4 Financial effect of the Offers and pro-forma balance sheet

As stated above, there will be no proceeds from the Offers. The expenses of the Offers (approximately \$200,000) will be met from the Company's existing cash reserves. A total of \$2.5 million was raised from the SPP and the Top-Up Placement, before costs.

The Company's reviewed balance sheet as at 31 December 2023 and the unaudited pro forma balance sheet as at 30 April 2024, shown below, have been

prepared on the basis of the accounting policies normally adopted by the Company and reflect the changes to its financial position.

The pro-forma balance sheet has been prepared assuming completion of the SPP and Top-Up Placement and that no Options or convertible securities are exercised prior to the closing date of the Offers.

The pro-forma balance sheet has been prepared to provide investors with information on the assets and liabilities of the Company and pro-forma assets and liabilities of the Company as noted below. The historical and pro-forma financial information is presented in an abbreviated form, insofar as it does not include all of the disclosures required by Australian Accounting Standards applicable to annual financial statements.

4. RIGHTS AND LIABILITIES ATTACHING TO SECURITIES

4.1 Terms and Conditions of Options

The terms and conditions of the Options are as follows:

(a) **Entitlement**

Each Option entitles the holder to subscribe for one (1) Share upon exercise of the Option.

(b) Exercise Price

Subject to paragraph (i), the amount payable upon exercise of each Option will be \$0.014 (Exercise Price).

(c) Expiry Date

Each Option will expire at 5:00 pm (WST) on the date which is two (2) years from the date of issue (**Expiry Date**). An Option not exercised before the Expiry Date will automatically lapse on the Expiry Date.

(d) Exercise Period

The Options are exercisable at any time on or prior to the Expiry Date (Exercise Period).

(e) Notice of Exercise

The Options may be exercised during the Exercise Period by notice in writing to the Company in the manner specified on the Option certificate (**Notice of Exercise**) and payment of the Exercise Price for each Option being exercised in Australian currency by electronic funds transfer or other means of payment acceptable to the Company.

(f) Exercise Date

A Notice of Exercise is only effective on and from the later of the date of receipt of the Notice of Exercise and the date of receipt of the payment of the Exercise Price for each Option being exercised in cleared funds (Exercise Date).

(g) Timing of issue of Shares on exercise

Within 5 Business Days after the Exercise Date, the Company will:

- (i) issue the number of Shares required under these terms and conditions in respect of the number of Options specified in the Notice of Exercise and for which cleared funds have been received by the Company;
- (ii) if required, give ASX a notice that complies with section 708A(5)(e) of the Corporations Act, or, if the Company is unable to issue such a notice, lodge with ASIC a prospectus prepared in accordance with the Corporations Act and do all such things necessary to satisfy section 708A(11) of the Corporations Act to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors; and

(iii) if admitted to the official list of ASX at the time, apply for official quotation on ASX of Shares issued pursuant to the exercise of the Options.

If a notice delivered under (ii) for any reason is not effective to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors, the Company must, no later than 20 Business Days after becoming aware of such notice being ineffective, lodge with ASIC a prospectus prepared in accordance with the Corporations Act and do all such things necessary to satisfy section 708A(11) of the Corporations Act to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors.

(h) Shares issued on exercise

Shares issued on exercise of the Options rank equally with the then issued shares of the Company.

(i) Reconstruction of capital

If at any time the issued capital of the Company is reconstructed, all rights of an Optionholder are to be changed in a manner consistent with the Corporations Act and the ASX Listing Rules at the time of the reconstruction.

(i) Participation in new issues

There are no participation rights or entitlements inherent in the Options and holders will not be entitled to participate in new issues of capital offered to Shareholders during the currency of the Options without exercising the Options.

(k) Change in exercise price

An Option does not confer the right to a change in Exercise Price or a change in the number of underlying securities over which the Option can be exercised.

(I) Transferability

The Options are transferable subject to any restriction or escrow arrangements imposed by ASX or under applicable Australian securities laws.

4.2 Rights and liabilities attaching to Shares

The following is a summary of the more significant rights and liabilities attaching to the Shares to be issued upon the exercise of the Options offered pursuant to this Prospectus. This summary is not exhaustive and does not constitute a definitive statement of the rights and liabilities of Shareholders. To obtain such a statement, persons should seek independent legal advice.

Full details of the rights and liabilities attaching to Shares are set out in the Constitution, a copy of which is available for inspection at the Company's registered office during normal business hours.

(a) General meetings

Shareholders are entitled to be present in person, or by proxy, attorney or representative to attend and vote at general meetings of the Company.

Shareholders may requisition meetings in accordance with section 249D of the Corporations Act and the Constitution of the Company.

(b) Voting rights

Subject to any rights or restrictions for the time being attached to any class or classes of shares, at general meetings of shareholders or classes of shareholders:

- (i) each Shareholder entitled to vote may vote in person or by proxy, attorney or representative;
- (ii) on a show of hands, every person present who is a Shareholder or a proxy, attorney or representative of a Shareholder has one vote; and
- (iii) on a poll, every person present who is a Shareholder or a proxy, attorney or representative of a Shareholder shall, in respect of each fully paid Share held by him, or in respect of which he is appointed a proxy, attorney or representative, have one vote for each Share held, but in respect of partly paid shares shall have such number of votes as bears the same proportion to the total of such Shares registered in the Shareholder's name as the amount paid (not credited) bears to the total amounts paid and payable (excluding amounts credited).

(c) Dividend rights

Subject to the rights of any preference Shareholders and to the rights of the holders of any shares created or raised under any special arrangement as to dividend, the Directors may from time to time declare a dividend to be paid to the Shareholders entitled to the dividend which shall be payable on all Shares according to the proportion that the amount paid (not credited) is of the total amounts paid and payable (excluding amounts credited) in respect of such Shares.

The Directors may from time to time pay to the Shareholders any interim dividends as they may determine. No dividend shall carry interest as against the Company. The Directors may set aside out of the profits of the Company any amounts that they may determine as reserves, to be applied at the discretion of the Directors, for any purpose for which the profits of the Company may be properly applied.

Subject to the ASX Listing Rules and the Corporations Act, the Company may, by resolution of the Directors, implement a dividend reinvestment plan on such terms and conditions as the Directors think fit and which provides for any dividend which the Directors may declare from time to time payable on Shares which are participating Shares in the dividend reinvestment plan, less any amount which the Company shall either pursuant to the Constitution or any law be entitled or obliged to retain, be applied by the Company to the payment of the subscription price of Shares.

(d) Winding-up

If the Company is wound up, the liquidator may, with the authority of a special resolution, divide among the Shareholders in kind the whole or any part of the property of the Company, and may for that purpose set such value as he considers fair upon any property to be so divided, and may determine how the division is to be carried out as between the Shareholders or different classes of Shareholders.

The liquidator may, with the authority of a special resolution, vest the whole or any part of any such property in trustees upon such trusts for the benefit of the contributories as the liquidator thinks fit, but so that no Shareholder is compelled to accept any shares or other securities in respect of which there is any liability.

(e) Shareholder liability

As the Shares issued on exercise of the Options will be fully paid shares, they will not be subject to any calls for money by the Directors and will therefore not become liable for forfeiture.

(f) Transfer of shares

Generally, shares in the Company are freely transferable, subject to formal requirements, the registration of the transfer not resulting in a contravention of or failure to observe the provisions of a law of Australia and the transfer not being in breach of the Corporations Act and the ASX Listing Rules.

(g) Future increase in capital

The issue of any new Shares is under the control of the Directors of the Company. Subject to restrictions on the issue or grant of securities contained in the ASX Listing Rules, the Constitution and the Corporations Act (and without affecting any special right previously conferred on the holder of an existing share or class of shares), the Directors may issue Shares as they shall, in their absolute discretion, determine.

(h) Variation of rights

Under section 246B of the Corporations Act, the Company may, with the sanction of a special resolution passed at a meeting of Shareholders vary or abrogate the rights attaching to Shares.

If at any time the share capital is divided into different classes of shares, the rights attached to any class (unless otherwise provided by the terms of issue of the shares of that class), whether or not the Company is being wound up, may be varied or abrogated with the consent in writing of the holders of three quarters of the issued shares of that class, or if authorised by a special resolution passed at a separate meeting of the holders of the shares of that class.

(i) Alteration of constitution

In accordance with the Corporations Act, the Constitution can only be amended by a special resolution passed by at least three quarters of Shareholders present and voting at the general meeting. In addition, at

least 28 days written notice specifying the intention to propose the resolution as a special resolution must be given.

5. RISK FACTORS

5.1 Introduction

The Options offered under this Prospectus are considered highly speculative. An investment in the Company is not risk free and the Directors strongly recommend potential investors to consider the risk factors described below, together with information contained elsewhere in this Prospectus and to consult their professional advisers before deciding whether to apply for Options pursuant to this Prospectus.

There are specific risks which relate directly to the Company's business. In addition, there are other general risks, many of which are largely beyond the control of the Company and the Directors. The risks identified in this section, or other risk factors, may have a material impact on the financial performance of the Company and the market price of the Options.

The following is not intended to be an exhaustive list of the risk factors to which the Company is exposed.

5.2 Company specific

Potential for dilution	Assuming all Options under the Offers are exercised prior to the Expiry Date, the number of Shares in the Company will increase from 2,056,188,092 Shares on issue at the date of this Prospectus to 2,264,759,513 Shares. This means that each Share will represent a lower proportion of the ownership of the Company. It is not possible to predict what the value of the Company or a Share will be following the completion of the Offers being implemented and the Directors do not make any representation as to such matters.

Additional requirements for capital	The Company's capital requirements depend on numerous factors, including the successful take up of the Offers. Depending on the Company's ability to generate income from its operations, the Company may require further financing in addition to amounts raised under the Offers. Any additional equity financing will dilute shareholdings, and debt financing, if available, may involve restrictions on financing and operating activities. If

	the Company is unable to obtain additional financing as needed, it may be required to reduce the scope of its operations and scale back its technology development and exploration programs as the case may be. There is however no guarantee that the Company will be able to secure any additional funding or be able to secure funding on terms favourable to the Company.

Any such arrangement, should it arise, may take the form of an asset sale, farm-out arrangement or similar contractual arrangement for the divestment of those rights to third parties. The terms of the arrangement cannot be guaranteed. Any such arrangement carries contract and counterparty risks and the risks that disputes may arise in connection with the contract arrangements.
Exploration and operating	The mineral exploration licences and mining lease comprising the Company's projects, are at various stages of exploration, and potential investors should understand that mineral exploration and development are high-risk undertakings. There can be no assurance that future exploration of these licences, or any other mineral licences that may be acquired in the future, will result in the discovery of an economic resource. Even if an apparently viable resource is identified, there is no guarantee that it can be economically exploited. The future exploration activities of the Company may be affected by a range of factors including geological conditions, limitations on activities due to seasonal weather patterns or adverse weather conditions, unanticipated operational and technical difficulties, difficulties in commissioning and operating plant and equipment, mechanical failure or plant breakdown, unanticipated metallurgical problems which may affect extraction costs, industrial and environmental accidents, industrial disputes, unexpected shortages and increases in the costs of consumables, spare parts, plant, equipment and staff, native title process, changing government regulations and many other factors beyond the control of

The success of the Company will also depend upon the Company being able to maintain title to the mineral exploration licences comprising the projects and obtaining all required approvals for their contemplated activities. In the event that exploration programmes prove to be unsuccessful this could lead to a diminution in the value of the Company's projects, a reduction in the cash reserves of the Company and possible relinquishment of one or more of the mineral exploration licences comprising the Company's projects.

Tenure, access and grant of applications

Tenure and Renewal

Mining and exploration tenements are subject to periodic renewal. The renewal of the term of granted tenements is subject to compliance with the applicable mining legislation and regulations and the discretion of the relevant mining authority. Renewal conditions may include increased expenditure and work commitments or compulsory relinquishment of areas of the tenements. The imposition of new conditions or the inability to meet those conditions may adversely affect the operations, financial position and/or performance of the Company. The consequence of forfeiture or involuntary surrender or nonrenewal of a granted tenement for reasons beyond the control of the Company could be significant. The Company has exploration licences which will shortly be under application for renewal. While there are risks associated with the renewal of tenements generally, the Company is not aware as at the date of this Prospectus of any reason why any of its exploration licences will not be renewed.

In relation to expenditure obligations, the Company has previously agreed to an Amalgamated Expenditure Agreement (AEA) which commenced 1 July 2021 through to 31 December 2022 pursuant to which it was to meet a total expenditure of circa \$1.6m (including prior shortfalls) in relation to EL5922, EL5971, EL6024, EL6441, EL6448 and EL6638. The effect of the AEA was to aggregate prior shortfalls in expenditure with additional required expenditure and provide the Company with an extended period of time to meet those amalgamated expenditure requirements. The Department of Energy and Mines of South Australia (Department) has agreed to extend the AEA for a further two-year period (i.e. to 31 December 2024) subject to conditions which include lodgement of expenditure returns when due and the carrying forward of unmet expenditure requirements for a revised AEA. While the Company has established a renewed working relationship with the Department and the Board is of the view the Company has the ability to meet the shortmedium term expenditure requirements in relation to its tenements, there is a risk that a failure to comply with expenditure obligations (including the AEA) may result in

cancellation of one or more of its exploration licences or mining leases.

While the Company previously filed a draft Program for Environmental Protection and Rehabilitation (PEPR) in respect of the Kookaburra Gully Project (ML6460) in 2017, this draft was later withdrawn on the advice of the Department. The Company has been in communication with the Department in relation to the status of both its exploration licences and the mining lease in relation to the Kookaburra Gully Project, however due to the Company not yet having a PEPR approved by the Department, it is currently non-compliant with the conditions of ML6460. While the Company intends to file a further draft PEPR as soon as practicable, there is a risk that any delays in the process may be viewed adversely by the Department and affect the status of the mining lease or potential for the approval of the PEPR and/or be adversely considered on a question of renewal in the future. As at the date of this Prospectus, there has been no indication from the Department that it intends to take any imminent further action in relation to the above and the Company has met with and established, what it considers to be, a good and renewed working relationship with the Department.

Access

Exploration and mining licences may include various restrictions excluding, limiting or imposing conditions upon the ability of the Company to conduct exploration or mining activities, including but not limited to in respect of exclusions from pursuing exploration or mining on certain areas of Commonwealth land, requirements arising from Native Title legislation and claims and/or state legislation relating to Aboriginal heritage, culture and objects, environmental based conditions and restrictions and access procedures in relation to privately held land. While the Company will formulate its exploration and mining plans to accommodate and work within any such access restrictions, there is no guarantee the Company will be able to satisfy such conditions on commercially viable terms, if at all. In addition, such restrictions may be complex and/or require approvals, consents negotiations involving governmental entities or third parties. As such, there is a risk that access issues may prevent the Company from implementing its intended exploration and miining plans in a timely manner or at all, which may adversely impact upon the financial position, operations and prospects of the Company. Further, any future changes in legislation and regulations may impose significant obligations or restrictions on the Company which cannot be predicted.

Reliance on key personnel

The responsibility of overseeing the day-to-day operations and the strategic management of the Company depends substantially on its senior management and its key

The risks associated with the development of a mine will be considered in full should the one or more of the Company's projects reach that stage and will be managed with ongoing consideration of stakeholder interests.

Environmental

The operations and proposed activities of the Company are subject to State and Federal laws and regulations concerning the environment. As with most exploration projects and mining operations, the Company's activities are expected to have an impact on the environment, particularly if advanced exploration or mine development proceeds. It is the Company's intention to conduct its activities to the highest standard of environmental obligation, including compliance with all environmental laws.

Mining operations have inherent risks and liabilities associated with safety and damage to the environment and the disposal of waste products occurring as a result of mineral exploration and production. The occurrence of any such safety or environmental incident could delay production or increase production costs. Events, such as unpredictable rainfall or bushfires may impact on the Company's ongoing compliance with environmental legislation, regulations and licences. Significant liabilities could be imposed on the Company for damages, clean up costs or penalties in the event of certain discharges into the environment, environmental damage caused by operations previous non-compliance environmental laws or regulations.

The disposal of mining and process waste and mine water discharge are under constant legislative scrutiny and regulation. There is a risk that environmental laws and regulations become more onerous making the Company's operations more expensive.

Any failure to comply with applicable laws and regulations or permits, even if inadvertent, could result in material fines, penalties or other liabilities. In extreme cases, failure could result in suspension of the Company's tenements.

Additionally, there can be no assurance that there will be, or continue to be, an active market for the Shares.
