Commencement of mining at Tarcoola

WPG Resources Ltd (ASX: WPG; WPGO) is pleased to advise that mining has commenced at Tarcoola. Work commenced on developing the Tarcoola pit within 2 weeks of the Decision to Mine.



WPG Executive Chairman Bob Duffin today said "in anticipation of the approval of the project's Program for Environment Protection and Rehabilitation (PEPR), payment of \$72,000 into a Significant Environmental Benefit vegetation clearance offset account and lodgement and registration of the mine closure rehabilitation bond of \$1.76 million and the Decision to Mine, all contracts have been awarded, equipment necessary for works to commence has been mobilised to Tarcoola and the Tarcoola Hospital has been refurbished for accommodation purposes, and ancillary infrastructure finalised. In short order, we have been able to deploy staff and contractors to site, and reach this next important milestone.

"Our goal of transporting the first ore to Challenger in mid-December for treatment is on track."
