Trade Finance Loan Book & Compliance as at 31 January 2017

In accordance with the Corporate Bond Issue Information Memorandums released to the ASX on 18 May 2015, 24 March 2016 and 18 May 2016, CML Group (ASX code: CGR) wish to advise that as at 31 January 2017 it was compliant with all Financial Covenants contained within the Memorandums. The calculations are tabled below.

At the end of January 2017 CML had a trade finance loan book of over \$104.4m (December 2016: \$118.1m), of which it had supplied actual funding of \$62.7m (December 2016: \$70.3m). This represents a Loan to Value ratio of 60.1% (December 2016: 59.5%).

Please note all Financial Covenant definitions are contained in the Information Memorandum released to the ASX on 18 May 2015, 24 March 2016 and 18 May 2016.
