Company Report (Appendix 4C)

Enclosed is the Quarterly Report (Appendix 4C) for the 3 months ended 31 December 2017.

The Company's cash balance at 31 December 2017 was \$1,048,000 in funds with bank overdrafts undrawn. The Company has access to a further cash amount totaling \$3,200,000, inclusive of bank and loan facilities.

During the quarter, the total cash balance decreased by a net \$430,000 reflecting the continuing substantial investment in new product developments.

Operating cash increased by \$55,000 during the quarter, impacted by fluctuations in trading activities and the timing of customer orders and payments.

Investment activities amounted to a net cash outflow of \$485,000 over the quarter, consisting mainly of substantial capitalized and budgeted new product development work at \$479,000.

There was no movement in financing activities during the quarter.
