LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN

17 February 2020

Dear NCN holder

Important information

You hold NAB Capital Notes (NCN). As a holder of NCN, this letter has important information for you.

NAB has elected to *repay* the existing NCN on 23 March 2020. NAB is offering an Eligible NCN Holder (defined below) the opportunity to *reinvest* in the new NAB Capital Notes 4. If you choose to do so, you'll maintain an investment in NAB. Otherwise, you will receive cash.

This letter sets out why NAB is repaying the existing NCNs and your options.

Background

On 17 February 2020:

- NAB issued a "resale notice" in accordance with the NCN Terms. That notice confirms that on 23 March 2020, all NCN on issue will be mandatorily purchased by a nominated purchaser appointed by NAB for \$100 per NCN (NCN Resale Proceeds).
- 2. NAB announced an offer of new securities called NAB Capital Notes 4. That offer contains a "Reinvestment Offer" that provides Eligible NCN Holders the option to have their NCN Resale Proceeds reinvested directly into NAB Capital Notes 4 to maintain an ongoing investment in securities issued by NAB.

What are my options?

If you are an Eligible NCN Holder you can either:

- 1. **Apply to reinvest** all or some of the NCN Resale Proceeds into NAB Capital Notes 4 through the Reinvestment Offer. You may reinvest based on the NCN you held at 7.00pm (Melbourne time) on 12 February 2020. No separate cash payment is required under the Reinvestment Offer;
- 2. **Sell your NCN on market** through your broker. The last day for trading in NCN on market will be 11 March 2020; or
- 3. Receive cash. If you do nothing, you will receive \$100 for each NCN you hold on 23 March 2020.

If you hold NCN but are **not** an Eligible NCN Holder you can either:

- 1. **Sell your NCN on market** through your broker. The last day for trading in NCN on market will be 11 March 2020; or
- 2. Receive cash. If you do nothing, you will receive \$100 for each NCN you hold on 23 March 2020.

Am I an "Eligible NCN Holder"?

You are an "Eligible NCN Holder" who can participate in the Reinvestment Offer if you:

- were registered as a holder of NCN at 7.00pm (Melbourne time) on 12 February 2020;
- are shown on the NCN register as having an address in Australia;
- are not an individual residing in a member state of the European Union; and
- are not in the United States or acting as a nominee for, or for the account or benefit of, a U.S. Person or not otherwise prevented from receiving the Reinvestment Offer or NAB Capital Notes 4 under the laws of any jurisdiction.

What are NAB Capital Notes 4?

NAB Capital Notes 4 are convertible, subordinated notes that are scheduled to pay quarterly, floating rate distributions in cash subject to the satisfaction of certain conditions. Those distributions are expected to be franked at the same rate as dividends paid on NAB's Ordinary Shares. The distribution rate is equal to the sum of the Bank Bill Rate plus a Margin determined under the Bookbuild (expected to be in the range of 2.95% to 3.15%), adjusted for NAB's tax rate.

NAB Capital Notes 4 do not have a fixed maturity date for repayment and holders do not have a right to request or require NAB to Convert, Redeem or Resell NAB Capital Notes 4. Therefore, it is possible that NAB Capital Notes 4 could remain on issue indefinitely and the Face Value will not be repaid. However, there are certain events that could occur while NAB Capital Notes 4 are on issue, which may result in NAB Capital Notes 4 being Converted into NAB Ordinary Shares, Redeemed or Resold for cash, or Written Off.

Full details of those events and the NAB Capital Notes 4 are contained in the NAB Capital Notes 4 Prospectus issued by NAB on 17 February 2020 (**Prospectus**).

Are there differences between NAB Capital Notes 4 and NCN?

Yes – there are important differences between NAB Capital Notes 4 and NCN that you should consider before deciding whether to apply to participate in the Reinvestment Offer. The Reinvestment Offer is not a simple rollover into a similar investment. Those differences are outlined in Section 3.2 of the Prospectus and some are outlined below:

How do I apply to participate in the Reinvestment Offer?

The Reinvestment Offer is expected to open on 25 February 2020. Once the Reinvestment Offer opens, applications can be made either:

- 1. by completing the Reinvestment Offer Application Form online at nab.com.au/ncn4offer; or
- 2. by completing a paper copy of the Reinvestment Offer Application Form. To receive a paper copy of the Prospectus and Reinvestment Offer Application Form, call the NAB Information Line on **1300 367 647** (within Australia) or on **+61 3 9415 4299** (outside Australia) (Monday to Friday 8.00am 7.30pm Melbourne time); or
- 3. through your Syndicate Broker.

Applications must be received prior to the Closing Date at 5.00pm (Melbourne time) on 17 March 2020. If you apply to participate in the Reinvestment Offer, your NCN Resale Proceeds will be used as the Application Monies. This means that no separate cash payment is required under the Reinvestment Offer.

See Sections 3.3 and 4 of the Prospectus for more information on how to apply to participate in the Reinvestment Offer.

It is important that you read and consider the Prospectus in full before making an Application. You should carefully consider the risks and other information in the Prospectus in light of your investment objectives, financial situation and particular needs (including financial and taxation issues).

Can I apply for additional NAB Capital Notes 4?

Yes – you may apply for more NAB Capital Notes 4 than the number of NCN registered in your name at 7.00pm (Melbourne time) on 12 February 2020. The application for additional NAB Capital Notes 4 will be made under the Securityholder Offer and you will be required to pay \$100 cash for each additional NAB Capital Note 4 you apply for.

Is there a chance the NCN Resale will not occur?

The resale notice is irrevocable, except as provided by the NCN Terms. The NCN Resale may not occur for a number of reasons, including if a loss absorption event occurs, the NCN nominated purchaser does not for any reason pay the NCN Resale Proceeds in full on 23 March 2020, APRA revokes its approval of the NCN Resale or the NCN cannot be transferred for any reason. If the NCN Resale does not occur, except where a loss absorption event occurs in respect of NCN, NCN holders will continue to hold NCN.

How will I receive my NCN Resale Proceeds if I don't participate in the Reinvestment Offer?

If you do not participate in the Reinvestment Offer, the cash proceeds of the NCN Resale will be paid to you using the same payment instructions that apply for your distribution payments.

Will I receive the NCN distribution scheduled to be paid on 23 March 2020?

A final NCN distribution is scheduled to be paid by NAB on 23 March 2020, subject to the satisfaction of the distribution payment conditions in the NCN Terms. If those conditions are satisfied, all NCN holders on the record date for the final distribution (at 7.00pm (Melbourne time) on 13 March 2020) (including Eligible NCN Holders who participate in the Reinvestment Offer) will receive a cash payment of \$0.7718 per NCN on 23 March 2020.
