The L1 Long Short Fund returned -2.1% in June.

The Fund returned 33.8% for the quarter (ASX200AI 16.5%).

In June, the Fund gave back a small proportion of its recent gains, as COVID-19 cases re-emerged in some parts of the U.S. and Australia.

After a solid recovery in April and May, most major equity markets delivered small positive returns in June. The ASX200 Accumulation Index gained 2.6%, marginally outperforming developed markets - MSCI World 2.4%, S&P500 1.8%, FTSE100 1.5%, Nikkei 1.9%. The best performing sectors in Australia were Information Technology (+6.0%), Consumer Discretionary (+5.4%) and Consumer Staples (+5.1%), while Property (-2.7%), Energy (-2.0%) and Industrials (-1.7%) lagged.

Some of the key contributors to performance in June were:

Vivendi (long) is the owner of UMG, the world's number 1 music label that is the largest provider of music content for Spotify, Apple Music and Amazon Music. Vivendi shares rose in June on the announcement of an expansion to the current buyback authorisation by a further 20 million shares, as well as increased interest in the sector with the IPO of Warner Music Group. Assuming the current buyback program completes, Vivendi will have bought back €1.5bn worth of shares in 2020 (5.6% of shares on issue). We continue to believe Vivendi is very undervalued, trading on a P/E of only 17.5x FY21 (consensus earnings), with the structural shift to music streaming and large buyback program supporting a sustainable 10-15% EPS growth outlook p.a. for many years to come

Teck Resources (long) is one of the world's highest quality mining companies with very low-cost operations in coking coal, copper and zinc. The shares sold off in January due to falling commodity prices and have been recovering in recent months on stabilising coking coal and copper prices. Even at today's depressed commodity price assumptions, Teck trades on a P/E of only 7.6x FY21 (consensus earnings) and 4.1x EV/EBITDA, with a large cost out program still to come over the next few years. All of Teck's main assets are situated in low risk jurisdictions, such as Canada, U.S. and Chile. Teck is currently building one of the world's largest copper mines (QB2) at a time when the world is gradually becoming short copper due to ongoing grade declines at the world's largest mines. Copper demand continues to enjoy secular growth due to rising living standards across Asia. We believe the medium-term outlook for copper and coking coal is very attractive, given spot prices are close to marginal cash cost for many mines and incremental supply has proven difficult to bring on in a timely manner.

Hotel Property Investments (HPI) (long) is the owner of a strategic pubs/hotels property portfolio that is critical for Coles liquor licensing. HPI shares continued their recovery in June but are still trading on a yield of almost 7% (post trading ex the 9.7c interim half year dividend in June) and at a discount to NTA which has been struck on a conservative 6.1% cap rate. HPI venues have gradually begun reopening, in line with relaxed lockdown restrictions in Queensland, which should continue to

improve market confidence in the asset base. We believe the 12 year average lease term with a large skew to high quality tenants, such as Coles, makes HPI one of the most attractive and lowest risk opportunities in the Australian REIT sector.

Some of the key detractors to fund performance in June were:

Oil Search (long) has been a strong performer for the fund since we participated in its equity raise at \$2.10 back in early April and further added to our position around \$2.40-\$2.70 immediately afterwards. After a modest recovery in oil prices in April and May we saw oil prices consolidate in June. Oil Search shares broadly followed moves in energy markets, pulling back from around \$3.50 to circa \$3.20 by guarter end. Oil Search is one of the highest quality energy stocks listed in Australia, given its low cost of production, long life assets, attractive growth options and partnership with a high quality operator (Exxon Mobil). Oil Search has a large stake in two very substantial growth projects in PNG and Alaska and, as oil prices recover, we believe the market will likely reincorporate meaningful value for these projects in group valuations. Furthermore, we believe the more difficult economic backdrop in PNG is likely to incentivise the PNG Government to resolve their differences with the joint venture to enable this project to proceed (subject to market conditions).

SES (long) is a French satellite network provider that supplies data and video connectivity to broadcasters, telecommunications companies, governments and airlines globally. SES also owns 45% economic interest in the 5G spectrum that is critical to the future development of 5G services in the U.S. SES declined in June due to a broad-based sell off in value and COVID-19 affected stocks, with no company specific news of note. We believe SES is extremely undervalued as the market is currently ascribing no value to their 5G spectrum (which our analysis suggests is worth more than the entire market cap of SES). We used the recent sell-off in the shares to significantly add to our position and we believe the risk-reward is exceptional at current prices.

Other detractors in June included Charter Communications and News Corp (neither had any significant company news of note).

While the Fund has performed very strongly over the past the quarter, investors should continue to expect higher than usual Fund volatility in the short term, given elevated market volatility, ongoing news flow regarding COVID-19, changes in economic activity, policy responses and investor sentiment. We recognise the outlook for the global economy is uncertain and market volatility is likely to remain elevated, however, the Fund is well placed to navigate these events. We remain very excited and optimistic about the medium-term outlook for the Fund and are confident the portfolio is well positioned to withstand a wide range of potential economic outcomes.

L1 Long Short Fund Limited has been established to invest in a portfolio of predominantly Australian and New Zealand securities, with up to 30% invested in global securities. The Company has the ability to both buy and short-sell securities, which provides a flexible strategy to deal with changing stock market conditions. The objective is to deliver strong, positive, risk-adjusted returns to investors over the long term. The portfolio is managed by L1 Capital Pty Ltd, which has established a reputation for offering clients best of breed investment products.
