

Notice to ASX 31 August 2020

BOUGAINVILLE COPPER LIMITED (BOC)

The directors of Bougainville Copper Limited announce the following results of the company for the six months ended 30 June 2020 together with comparable results for the six months to 30 June 2019. An update of recent events is also included. The results have been independently reviewed.

The result for the six months ended 30 June 2020 for the group was a net operating loss of K4.5 million (AUD\$2.0m) compared to net loss of K3.9 million (AUD\$1.61m) in the corresponding period last year.

The results of the Bougainville Copper Foundation Limited have been consolidated.

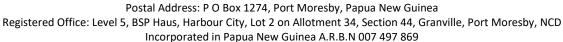
Total expenditure in the first half of 2020 decreased compared to the corresponding period in 2019. This resulted in savings of K749,000. Stakeholder engagement, communications and media, and community projects were key areas where spending was reduced. This was in part a reflection of a restricted operating environment in PNG and Bougainville due to local restrictions associated with the global coronavirus pandemic.

Dividend income from the Company's investments in ASX listed shares reduced to K1.54 million compared to K2.92 million in 2019.

Investments of K21.7 million were realised during the period with the K8.9 million fair value gain accumulated in reserves transferred within equity to retained earnings. During the period K13.9 million was reinvested in ASX listed equities. The Company does not expect it will need to realise investments to fund operations until 2021.

The value of ASX listed investments reduced as the COVID-19 pandemic continues to affect world markets. We have observed an increase in the listed share values since 30 June 2020.

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Events of Significance

Overview

Like many other companies, Bougainville Copper's activities in 2020 have been constrained due to the measures introduced in PNG and Bougainville in response to the global coronavirus pandemic.

The Company has also continued to take a respectful and deliberately low-key approach to its engagement, following Bougainville's historic referendum and as it conducts general and presidential elections. Polling commenced on 12 August and vote counting will commence 2 September. 440 candidates are contesting 40 seats in the House of Representatives and 25 candidates are standing for president. Numerous candidates have expressed support for mining and the Company will seek to work constructively with the new government and president regarding the Panguna project.

EL1 Tenure

The Judicial Review of the decision by the Autonomous Bougainville Government (ABG) to refuse an extension of the Company's Exploration Licence (EL1) is expected to proceed in the PNG National Court in the last quarter of 2020.

The directors of the company continue to take all possible steps to protect tenure in Bougainville.

Company Shareholdings

Following the referendum in December 2019, PNG Prime Minister James Marape, committed to transferring the Independent State of PNG's 36.4 per cent shareholding in the Company to the people of Bougainville. This transfer has yet to occur.

Mining Law Legislation

In late January 2019, the ABG introduced three bills to Bougainville's parliament that if passed would result in significant changes to local mining laws. The bills were met with widespread community opposition, including by landowners who felt their rights would be eroded if they were to pass. After deferring further consideration of the bills until after the referendum, they were reintroduced into parliament in March 2020 but failed to pass.

Community Engagement

Bougainville Copper has continued to maintain positive relations with the project area's customary landowners, including with the Panguna Development Company Limited (PDCL). The PDCL is a company 100 per cent owned and operated by landowners and its board of directions are registered agents for blocks in the project area. Bougainville Copper provides modest assistance to the PDCL during its establishment phase.

The Company has also continued to provide support for community projects and



activities although at reduced levels due to the restricted operating environment. Village Liaison Officers have remained engaged with local communities.

Bougainville Copper has been active in promoting community health information during the pandemic via its Facebook page which is an important source of local news.

The Company has also provided sponsorship for a weekly community health radio program which is an initiative of the Bougainville Health Department and New Dawn FM. The program commenced in February.

2020 Dividend

The Directors have not declared a dividend in respect of the six months ended 30 June 2020.

Borrowing

No borrowings were outstanding as of 30 June 2020.

Basis of financial report preparation

19.1 This is a half yearly report, it is a general purpose financial report prepared in accordance with the listing rules and IAS 34: Interim Financial Reporting. 1. Tenement EL1

The Autonomous Bougainville Government passed the Bougainville Mining Act 2015 (BMA) on 1 April 2015. This legislation may seek to challenge the company's control of the mine assets and may reflect an expropriation of assets for the purpose of the Bougainville Copper Act.

The BMA converted the Special Mining Lease held by the company to an Exploration Licence (EL) for a period of two years from 8th September 2014, the date the Transitional Mining Act was created. In July 2016 the company applied to extend the EL. The ABG commenced the processing of the application in October 2017 and on 16 January 2018 issued a Notice of refusal to grant a renewal for the following reasons:

- 1. The required majority consent of the landowners was not evident during the Mining Wardens hearing and shows BCL does not have the social licence to operate the mine.
- 2. The reopening of the Panguna Mine is a divisive issue and has the potential to adversely affect the ABG's preparation for the conduct of the referendum given that it was BCL's past operation of Panguna Mine that ignited the Bougainville crisis which resulted in the loss of about 20,000 lives. Hence, it is in Bougainville's best interest to maintain peace and unity.

The company commenced an action in the National Court of Papua New Guinea seeking leave for a Judicial Review of the renewal application process. Leave was granted on 10th April 2018. A stay was granted against the ABG, from giving effect to or relying on the decision to refuse the application by BCL for extension of EL1.

Panguna Minerals Limited (PML), a company 50% owned by SMLOLA and 50% by Central Exploration Pty Ltd (a company 70% owned by RTG Mining Inc) was joined to the proceedings on 22nd August 2018. BCL applied for leave to appeal the joinder decision. The leave to appeal was dismissed on 11th March 2019. The application for leave to appeal the joinder was then heard by a three-person bench of the Supreme court on 27th June 2019 and again refused on 6th February 2020, however BCL noted that the difficulty of the question was reflected in the fact that the members of the bench were split as to the proper outcome. PML will now definitely be a defendant to the proceeding, and its activities given due scrutiny.

BCL welcomes the certainty that the ruling brings and looks forward to the prosecution of its claims against the defendants, and remains confident of our tenement position and believe the court proceedings will uphold our rights.

The Judicial Review of the renewal application process will proceed the in the last quarter of 2020.

Bougainville Copper Limited while adhering to the requirements of the Bougainville Mining Act 2015, also recognises and maintains the tenements in accordance with the PNG National legislation and the Bougainville Copper agreement.

The directors of the company continue to take all possible steps to protect tenure in Bougainville.

2. Investment Unlisted Investment Fund

On 24 November 2016, the Company acquired a subsidiary (Bougainville Copper Foundation Limited). The subsidiary holds an investment in an unlisted investment fund. The investment has a carrying value of K1.1 million.

Management have not been provided with the 2018, and 2019 audited financial statements of the investee and the investee is unable to confirm the value of units held by the various investors.

Accordingly, the Company has been unable to determine the fair value of the investment and accordingly whether the carrying value of the investment of K1.1 million is fairly stated.

Report on review of interim financial information to the Directors of Bougainville Copper Limited

Introduction

We have reviewed the accompanying condensed interim consolidated balance sheet of Bougainville Copper Limited (the Company) and its subsidiary (the Group) as at 30 June 2020 and the related condensed interim consolidated statements of comprehensive income, changes in equity and cash flows for the six-month period then ended and notes, comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes. The Directors are responsible for the preparation and presentation of this condensed interim consolidated financial information in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34, 'Interim Financial Reporting'. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on this condensed interim consolidated financial information based on our review.

Scope of review

We conducted our review in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements 2410, 'Review of interim financial information performed by the independent auditor of the entity'. A review of interim financial information consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Basis for qualified conclusion

The Group holds an investment in an unlisted investment fund with a carrying value of K1.1 million at 30 June 2020. Management has not been provided with audited financial statements of the investee at 30 June 2020 and there is currently no active market for the sale of units in the investment fund. As a result, we have been unable to satisfy ourselves as to the valuation of K1.1 million of the investments recognised at 30 June 2020.

Qualified conclusion

Based on our review, with the exception of the matter described in the preceding paragraph, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying condensed interim consolidated financial information is not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34, 'Interim Financial Reporting'.

Emphasis of matter

Without qualifying our conclusion, we draw attention to Section 19.2 of Appendix 4D which describes the continued significant uncertainty surrounding the future of the Panguna mine and related assets particularly in relation to the Company's rights to those assets. The mine assets were fully depreciated or impaired in previous financial years. Our conclusion is not qualified in respect of this matter.

Our review work has been undertaken so that we might state to the Directors those matters which we are required to state to them in our review report and for no other purpose.
