Avecho Quarterly Activities Report and Appendix 4C

Melbourne, **Australia**, **29 January 2021** - Avecho Biotechnology Limited (ASX: AVE) ("Avecho" or the "Company"), a company that develops and commercialises innovative Human and Animal Health products using its proprietary drug delivery system called TPM®, is pleased to release its Quarterly Activities Report and Appendix 4C for the quarter ended 31 December 2020.

Key Highlights

- Clinical development of Avecho's enhanced oral cannabinoid products begun;
 - Avecho joins the CACOS observational clinical trial to test its leading formulation in patients
 - o Design and planning for a second clinical trial (Phase I) begun
- Business Development campaign continues, with ongoing discussions related to assets in both the human and animal health portfolio.
- Cash balance at the close of quarter was A\$1.87m.

Operations

The continued development of Avecho's enhanced cannabinoid product was the focus during Q4. Having demonstrated significant increases in oral bioavailability from CBD formulations containing TPM[®] in an animal model during Q3, the company focused on advancing the leading formulation into human clinical trials.

As a first step, Avecho joined Australia's largest running observational study of medicinal cannabis products, the CA clinics Observational Study (CACOS). Avecho will test the performance of its enhanced oral cannabidiol (CBD) TPM® formulation in human patients being prescribed medicinal cannabis for a range of indications. Performance will be compared against commonly prescribed CBD formulations. Recruitment for the study began late December, and will continue on an ongoing basis throughout 2021 to maximize the number of patients dosed with both the CBD TPM® and commercial comparator formulations.

In parallel, Avecho began planning a second clinical trial; a Phase I pharmacokinetic study designed to characterise the drug absorption from the Avecho CBD formulation. Together, the data from these studies will direct the pharmaceutical CBD TPM® formulation towards the most appropriate clinical indications for subsequent studies and product registration. Avecho's cannabinoid program will aim to develop a pharmaceutical dosage form and will support the benefits of including TPM® in natural medicinal cannabis extracts. This will open additional licensing opportunities for the use of TPM® in third-party medicinal cannabis products, both in Australia and around the world, including the large North American markets.

Avecho's external licensing discussions continued thoughout Q4. Licensing opportunies for a number of Avecho's portfolio products are currently under review by third parties in both the pharmaceutical and animal health spaces, and involve a range of territories.



Corporate

During the quarter, Avecho had net operating outflow of A\$730K, including \$266K invested in R&D activities. Adminstration and corporate costs were the main cause of the increased outflow during the December quarter, including \$232K prepayment of corporate and D&O insurance for the next 12 months. Furthermore, Avecho purchased \$50K of raw material in preparation for a production run for Vital ET® in Q1 2021. Avecho has continued to manufacture and sell Vital ET® to Ashland during the transfer of manufacturing to their US facility. At the end of the quarter, the Company held A\$1.87m in cash. The Company remains committed to its R&D programs, while continuing to demonstrate prudent cash management and adapt its operational policies and procedures in line with COVID-19 mitigation measures.

Payments to related parties and their associates during the quarter as outlined in Section 6 of the accompanying Appendix 4C to this quarterly activities report were A\$63K. These payments are related to director fees for the quarter.
