Operations Update: Hurricane Ida

- The Byron operated SM58 and SM71 production platforms and EOD 351 drilling rig, drilling SM69 E2 well, were all safely evacuated ahead of Hurricane Ida
- Hurricane Ida appears to have passed approximately 90 miles to the east of Byron's South Marsh Island properties

Byron Energy Limited (Byron or the Company) (ASX: **BYE**) would like to provide the following operational update regarding the Company owned and operated projects comprising its 100% owned and operated South Marsh Island Block 58 (SM58), 50% owned and operated South Marsh Island Block 71 (SM71) and the Byron operated, 100% working interest, South Marsh Island 69 E2 well (SM69 E2).

All platforms were safely evacuated on Friday 27 August 2021 (USCDT) with production shut-in at all platforms. The Enterprise Offshore Drilling 351 (EOD 351) jack-up drilling rig was also evacuated and drilling operations suspended.

At present time it would appear that Hurricane Ida passed approximately 90 miles (145 km) east of the South Marsh Island.

Byron will provide a further update once the platforms and drilling rig are inspected by the Company.
