AASMF Loan

On 2 November 2015, Prieska Copper Zinc Mine (Pty) Ltd (a 70% owned subsidiary of Orion) (**PCZM**) and Anglo American sefa Mining Fund (**AASMF**) entered into a ZAR14.25M loan agreement for the further exploration and development of the Prieska Copper-Zinc Project (**Loan**). Under the terms of the Loan, AASMF advanced ZAR14.25M to PCZM. The key terms of the Loan are:

- Loan amount: ZAR14.25M (~\$1.23M) (on 1 August 2017);
- Interest: Prime lending rate in South Africa; and
- Security: 29.17% of the shares held in PCZM by Agama Exploration and Mining (Pty) Ltd (a wholly owned subsidiary of Orion), have been pledged as security to AASMF for the performance by PCZM of its obligations in terms of the Loan.

At Quarter end, the Loan balance was \$A1.98M (ZAR22.99M) (including capitalised interest). PCZM and AASMF are continuing negotiations to agree and settle a repayment plan in relation to the Loan.

IDC Shareholder Loan

During the Quarter, Orion and the Industrial Development Corporation of South Africa Limited (**IDC**) entered into definitive agreements in terms of which the IDC acquired 43.75% of the issued ordinary shares in New Okiep Mining Company Proprietary Limited (**NOM**) and triggered pre-development funding arrangements for the Flat Mines SAFTA area (**Flat Mines Project**), as announced on 7 September 2022.

The IDC funding of pre-development costs in the aggregate amount of ZAR34.58M (~\$A3.0M) will be advanced to NOM as a shareholder loan on the same terms as the pre-development funding amount of ZAR44.46M (~\$A3.84M) that Orion had already advanced to NOM, including that the loan is unsecured, interest free until such time as the Flat Mines Project commences commercial production and will be repaid when NOM is in a financial position to make repayment. Pursuant to the definitive agreements having been implemented during the Quarter, and the IDC becoming a shareholder in NOM, during the Quarter, the IDC advanced ZAR21.91M (~\$A1.89M) of its pre-development funding commitment.

Tembo Convertible Loan

Following Quarter end, on 3 January 2023, Orion announced that Tembo Capital Mining Fund II LP (**Tembo**) continues its strong support of Orion, through an unsecured convertible loan facility of US\$0.50M (~\$A0.72M) (**Convertible Loan Facility**). Under the terms of the Convertible Loan Facility, in certain instances, amounts outstanding under the Convertible Loan Facility (including capitalised interest and fees) may be repaid by the issue of ordinary shares in Orion to Tembo (subject to receipt of shareholder and regulatory approvals).

Answer: Orion anticipates that current levels of net operating cash flows will be maintained for the time being, however, outgoings may alter subject to funding activities (refer Item 8.8.2).

8.8.2 Has the entity taken any steps, or does it propose to take any steps, to raise further cash to fund its operations and, if so, what are those steps and how likely does it believe that they will be successful?

Answer: During the Quarter, Orion progressed funding facilities for its projects located in the Northern Cape of South Africa.

In December 2022, definitive agreements were signed with TF R&S Canada Ltd. and Triple Flag International Ltd. (together **Triple Flag**), for a combined US\$87M (~\$A128M) secured funding package for PCZM. This comprised a US\$80M Precious Metal Stream and a \$A10M early Funding Arrangement, with the latter of such funding to be made available to Orion to complete the Early Mining Works BFS and to commence the Dewatering Project. Subject to the fulfilment of other key conditions precedent, funding in terms of the \$A10M early Funding Arrangement is expected to be drawn down in the March 2023 Quarter.

In addition to the Triple Flag funding, Orion progressed definitive agreements with the IDC for a ZAR250M (~\$A21.58M) senior secured loan facility (**Convertible Loan**) to fund early mining works and key pre-development activities at the Prieska Copper-Zinc Project. IDC Executive Committee approval has been received and key terms of the Convertible Loan recorded in non-binding term sheet. Orion anticipates finalising definitive agreements shortly, with funding expected to be available for draw-down in the March 2023 Quarter, subject to fulfilment of conditions precedent standard for such arrangements.

The Triple Flag \$A10M early Funding Arrangement together with the IDC ZAR250M Convertible Loan, will enable Orion to complete the Early Mining Works BFS and to commission and operate the Dewatering Project.

During the Quarter, Orion and the IDC entered into definitive agreements in terms of which the IDC acquired 43.75% of the issued ordinary shares in NOM and triggered predevelopment funding arrangements for the Flat Mines Project. The IDC funding of predevelopment costs in the aggregate amount of ZAR34.58M (~\$A3.0M) will be advanced to NOM on the same terms as the pre-development funding amount of ZAR44.46M (~\$A3.84M) that Orion had already advanced to NOM. Pursuant to the definitive agreements having been implemented during the Quarter, and the IDC becoming a shareholder in NOM, during the Quarter, the IDC advanced ZAR21.91M (~\$A1.89M) of its pre-development funding commitment.

On 3 January 2023, Orion announced that Tembo continues its strong support of Orion, through an unsecured US\$0.5M (~\$A0.72M) Convertible Loan Facility.
