5. Approval of 10% Placement Facility

Resolution 3

To consider, and if thought fit, pass the following resolution as a special resolution:

“That for the purpose of ASX Listing Rule 7.1A and for all other purposes, the Shareholders hereby approve for the Company to have the additional capacity to issue Equity Securities under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A of up to 10% of the issued capital of the Company, calculated in accordance with the formula prescribed in ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.2 and on the terms and conditions described in the Explanatory Notes to this Notice of Meeting.”

EXPLANATORY NOTES

The following explanatory notes (including any annexures) have been prepared to provide information to Shareholders about the items of business set out in the Notice of Annual General Meeting and form part of that Notice.

Item 2 - Financial Reports

The Company's 2023 Annual Report, which includes the Financial Report, Directors' Report and Auditor's Report for the financial year ended 30 June 2023, is available on the Company's website at <https://gendevdevelopmentgroup.com.au/shareholder-centre/>. A copy has been forwarded to all Shareholders who elected to receive it.

Shareholders will be given a reasonable opportunity as a whole to ask questions about or make comments regarding the financial reports. The Company's auditor, KPMG will also attend the Meeting and will be available to receive questions.

This item of business does not require Shareholders to vote on a resolution or adopt the received reports.

Item 3 - Remuneration Report

(Resolution 1)

Shareholders are asked to adopt the Company's Remuneration Report, which is set out on pages 18-38 of the 2023 Annual Report. An opportunity will be provided for discussion of the Remuneration Report at the Meeting.

Pursuant to section 250V of the Corporations Act, if 25% or more votes are cast against adoption of the Remuneration Report at two consecutive annual general meetings ("2 strikes"), Shareholders will be required to vote at the second annual general meeting on a resolution ("Spill Resolution") that another meeting be held within 90 days ("Spill Meeting") to consider the re-election of directors.

At the Company's 2022 annual general meeting, more than 75% of all votes cast on the Remuneration Report were cast in favour of its adoption.

The Remuneration Report forms part of the Directors' Report which has been unanimously adopted by resolution of the Board.

The Directors recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 1. The Chairman of the Meeting intends to vote all undirected proxies in favour of Resolution 1.

Item 4 – Re-election of Director

(Resolution 2)

Mr Robert Neil Coombe retires by rotation in accordance with Rule 11.1(d) of the Constitution and, being eligible, offers himself for re-election.

Details of his qualifications and experience are outlined below.

Robert Neil Coombe

Non-Executive Director, Appointed 18 July 2017

Rob has over 40 years' corporate experience in both Australia and Asia, primarily in financial services.

He is presently Executive Chairman of Colonial First State, a leading Australian superannuation and wealth management business. He also chairs Tibra Capital, a privately owned global multi-strategy hedge fund business, and Expert 360, an online talent marketplace. He is also a member of the advisory board of Five V Capital, an Australian private equity manager focused on investing in established growth companies across a range of industries.

On top of Rob's commercial interests, he is Deputy Chair of the Australian Indigenous Education Foundation (AIEF) and Chair of the UTS Foundation.

Between 2013 and 2019, Rob was Chairman and then CEO of Craveable Brands, the largest Australian owned quick service restaurant business. Before joining Craveable Brands, Rob was responsible for all of Westpac's retail, business and agri banking operations throughout Australia. Prior to this role, Rob spent six years as CEO of BT Financial Group, responsible for all of Westpac's funds management, financial planning, insurance, private banking, broking, platform and superannuation businesses in Australia.

The Directors (other than Mr Coombe) recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 2. The Chairman of the Meeting intends to vote all undirected proxies in favour of Resolution 2.

Item 5 - Approval of 10% Placement Facility

(Resolution 3)

Under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A, an Eligible Entity may seek shareholder approval by special resolution at an annual general meeting to issue additional Equity Securities equivalent to 10% of its issued share capital through placements over a 12 month period after the meeting at which approval is obtained, in accordance with the terms set out below ("10% Placement Facility"). The 10% Placement Facility is in addition to the Company's 15% placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and allows the Company to issue up to 25% of its total issued capital.

"Equity Securities" has the meaning given by that term in the ASX Listing Rules.

An "Eligible Entity" for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 7.1A is an entity that is not included in the S&P / ASX 300 Index and has a market capitalisation of \$300 million or less. The Company is an Eligible Entity.

At the Company's 2022 Annual General Meeting (**2022 AGM**), Shareholder approval was obtained regarding the availability of the 10% Placement Facility for the 12 month period ending 21 November 2023. No Equity Securities have been issued under Listing Rule 7.1A in the 12 month period since the 2022 AGM.

The Company is now seeking Shareholder approval by way of a special resolution to have the ability to issue Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Facility for a further 12 months.

As a pooled development fund, the Company continues to explore new investment opportunities. Approval to issue shares under the 10% Placement Facility will enable the Company to raise additional capital to pursue such opportunities without the delay and uncertainty of reverting to shareholders, ensuring that the Company can meet potentially tight funding deadlines for investment opportunities. Funds raised may also be used to meet expenses associated with making new investments and for working capital purposes.

Resolution 3 requires approval of 75% of the votes cast by Shareholders present and eligible to vote (in person, by proxy, by attorney or corporate representative).

The exact number of Equity Securities that could be issued under the 10% Placement Facility will be determined in accordance with the formula prescribed in ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.2.

Additional Information with respect to this resolution is included in Annexure 1.

The Directors recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 3. The Chairman of the Meeting intends to vote all undirected proxies in favour of Resolution 3

No Director or Related Party will participate in any issue under the 10% Placement Facility unless specific approval is obtained, or an exemption applies, for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 10.11.

ENTITLEMENT TO VOTE

In accordance with section 1074E(2)(g) of the Corporations Act and Regulation 7.11.37 of the Corporations Regulations 2001 (Cth), the Board of the Company has determined that a Shareholder's voting entitlement at the Meeting will be taken to be the entitlement of the person shown in the register of members as at 7 p.m. (AEDT) on Tuesday, 21 November 2023. Transactions registered after that time will be disregarded in determining the Shareholders entitled to attend and vote at the Meeting.

VOTING EXCLUSION STATEMENT

Resolution 1

In accordance with the Corporations Act 2001 (Cth), the Company will disregard any votes cast on Resolution 1 by or on behalf of:

- a member of the Company's key management personnel ("KMP"), details of whose remuneration are included in the Remuneration Report for the year ended 30 June 2023; or
- a closely related party of a KMP.

However, the Company will not disregard a vote cast on Resolution 1 by a KMP, or a closely related party of a KMP, if:

- the vote is cast as a proxy;
- the proxy is appointed by writing that specifies how the proxy is to vote on Resolution 1; and
- the vote is not cast on behalf of a KMP or a closely related party of a KMP.

The Chair may also cast a vote as proxy for a shareholder entitled to cast a vote if the proxy is not directed on how to vote on the resolution provided the appointment of the Chair as proxy expressly authorises him to exercise the proxy in accordance with a direction to vote as he decides, even though Resolution 1 is connected directly with the remuneration of a KMP.

Key management personnel are those persons having authority and responsibility for planning, directing and controlling the activities of the Company, whether directly or indirectly. Members of key management personnel include the Company's directors and certain senior executives. A closely related party of a member of the key management personnel means any of the following:

- a spouse, child or dependant of the member;
- a child or dependant of the member's spouse;
- anyone else who is one of the member's family and may be expected to influence or be influenced by the member in the member's dealings with the Company;
- a company the member controls; or
- a person prescribed by regulations (as at the date of this Notice of Meeting, no additional persons have been prescribed by regulation).

If you complete a proxy form that authorises the chairman of the Meeting to vote on your behalf as proxyholder, and you do not mark any of the boxes so as to give him directions about how your vote should be cast, then your proxy will automatically become a directed proxy in favour of Resolution 1 and the chairman of the Meeting will vote accordingly. If you wish to appoint the chairman of the Meeting as your proxyholder but do not want him to cast your votes in favour of Resolution 1, you should complete the appropriate box on the proxy form, directing him to vote against Resolution 1 or abstain from voting on the resolution.

Resolution 3

In accordance with the ASX Listing Rules, the Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of Resolution 3 by or on behalf of:

- any person who may participate in the 10% Placement Facility referred to in Resolution 3; or
- an associate of that person or persons.

However, the Company will not disregard any votes cast in favour of Resolution 3 by:

- a person as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on Resolution 3, in accordance with directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the resolution in that way; or
- the chairman of the Meeting as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on Resolution 3, in accordance with a direction given to the chairman to vote on the resolution as the chairman decides; or
- a holder acting solely in a nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:
 - the beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting, on Resolution 3; and
 - the holder votes on Resolution 3 in accordance with directions given by the beneficiary to the holder to vote in that way.

PROXIES

A Shareholder entitled to attend and vote at the Meeting is entitled to appoint a proxy (who need not be a Shareholder of the Company) to attend and vote in the Shareholder's place. A proxy form accompanies this Notice of Meeting for this purpose.

A proxy form must be signed by a Shareholder or his or her attorney and, in the case of a joint holding, by each of the joint holders.

Shareholders who are entitled to cast two or more votes may appoint not more than two proxies to attend and vote at the Meeting. Shareholders wishing to appoint a second proxy should request an additional proxy form from the Company's share registry – Boardroom Pty Limited. Where two proxies are appointed, both forms should be completed with the nominated proportion or number of votes each proxy may exercise. If no such proportion or number is

specified, each proxy may exercise half of the votes. Fractions of votes are to be disregarded.

Where a Shareholder appoints 2 proxies, on a show of hands neither proxy may vote if more than one proxy attends and on a poll each proxy may only exercise votes in respect of those shares or voting rights the proxy represents.

The appointment of one or more duly appointed proxies will not preclude a Shareholder from attending the Meeting and voting personally. If the Shareholder votes on a resolution, the proxy must not vote as the Shareholder's proxy on that resolution.

Any instrument appointing a proxy in which the name of the appointee is not completed is regarded as given in favour of the chairman of the Meeting.

In the case of joint holders of shares, if more than one holder votes at the Meeting, only the vote of the first named of the joint holders in the share register of the Company will be counted.

To be effective, proxy forms (and the power of attorney or other authority (if any) under which it is signed (or an attested copy)) must be received by the Company at its registered office or delivered in person, by mail or by fax to the Company's Share Registry's office (details below). Proxy forms may also be lodged online by visiting www.votingonline.com.au/gdgagm2023. Completed proxy forms must be received no later than 48 hours before the appointed time of the Meeting, therefore by 12 p.m. (AEDT) on Tuesday, 21 November 2023.

Proxies given by a corporation must be signed either under seal or under the hand of a duly authorised attorney. In addition, should the constitution of a corporation permit the execution of documents without using a common seal, the documents must be signed by two directors or a director and company secretary, or for a proprietary company that has a sole director who is also a company secretary, that director.

If a body corporate is appointed as proxy, please write the full name of that body corporate (eg, Company X Pty Ltd). Do not use abbreviations. The body corporate will need to ensure that it:

- a. appoints an individual as its corporate representative to exercise its powers at meetings, in accordance with section 250D of the Corporations Act; and
- b. provides satisfactory evidence of the appointment of its corporate representative prior to commencement of the Meeting.

If no such evidence is received before the Meeting, then the body corporate (through its representative) will not be permitted to act as your proxy.

CORPORATE REPRESENTATIVES

A corporation, by resolution of its directors, may authorise a person to act as its representative to vote at the Meeting. A representative appointed by a corporation may be entitled to execute the same powers on behalf of the corporation as the corporation could exercise if it were an individual Shareholder of the Company.

To evidence the authorisation, either a certificate of corporate body representative executed by the corporation or under the hand of its attorney or an equivalent document evidencing the appointment will be required.

The certificate or equivalent document must be produced prior to the Meeting.

ANNEXURE 1 – ADDITIONAL INFORMATION REQUIRED FOR APPROVAL UNDER ASX LISTING RULE 7.1A

Class of Equity Securities

Any Equity Securities issued under the 10% Placement Facility must be in the same class as an existing quoted class of Equity Securities of the Company. The Company, as at the date of this Notice of Meeting, has one quoted class of Equity Securities, being shares. As such, as at the date of this Notice of Meeting, the only class of Equity Securities that the Company may issue under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A is shares.

(a) Formula for calculating the 10% Placement Facility

ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.2 provides that Eligible Entities which have obtained shareholder approval at an annual general meeting may issue or agree to issue, during the 12 month period after the date of the annual general meeting, a number of Equity Securities calculated in accordance with the following formula:

(A x D) – E

Where: **A** is the number of fully paid ordinary securities on issue 12 months before the date of issue or date of agreement to issue:

- I. plus the number of fully paid ordinary securities issued in the 12 months under an exception in ASX Listing Rule 7.2 other than exception 9,16 or 17;
- II. plus the number of fully paid ordinary securities issued in the 12 months on the conversion of convertible securities within ASX Listing Rule 7.2 exception 9 where:
 - a. the convertible securities were issued or agreed to be issued before the commencement of the 12 month period; or
 - b. the issue of, or agreement to issue, the convertible securities was approved, or taken under the ASX Listing Rules to have been approved, under ASX Listing Rules 7.1 or 7.4;
- III. plus the number of fully paid ordinary securities issued in the 12 months under an agreement to issue securities within ASX Listing Rule 7.2 exception 16 where:
 - a. the agreement was entered into before the commencement of the relevant period; or
 - b. the agreement or issue was approved, or taken under these rules to have been approved, under ASX Listing Rules 7.1 or 7.4;
- IV. plus the number of any other fully paid ordinary securities issued in the 12 months with approval of holders of shares under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 or ASX Listing Rule 7.4. This does not include an issue of fully paid shares under the entity's 15% placement capacity without shareholder approval;
- V. plus the number of partly paid ordinary securities that became fully paid in the 12 months; and
- VI. less the number of fully paid ordinary securities cancelled in the 12 months.

Note that "A" has the same meaning in ASX Listing Rule 7.1 when calculating an entity's 15% placement capacity.

D is 10%;

E is the number of Equity Securities issued or agreed to be issued under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.2 in the 12 months before the date of the issue or date of agreement to issue where the issue or agreement has not been subsequently approved by the holders of its ordinary securities under ASX Listing Rule 7.4.

(b) ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and ASX Listing Rule 7.1A

The ability of an entity to issue Equity Securities under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A is in addition to the entity's 15% placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

At the date of this Notice of Meeting, the Company has on issue 190,610,251 shares and therefore has the capacity to issue:

- 25,082,911 Equity Securities under ASX Listing Rule 7.1; and
- subject to shareholder approval being obtained under this Resolution 3, 18,887,426 Equity Securities under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.

The actual number of Equity Securities that the Company will have capacity to issue under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A will be calculated at the date of issue of the Equity Securities or date of agreement to issue in accordance with the formula prescribed in ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.2 (refer to section (a) above).

(c) Specific information required by Listing Rule 7.3A

Pursuant to and in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 7.3A, information is provided in relation to the approval of the 10% Placement Facility as follows:

Minimum Issue Price

For the purpose of ASX Listing Rule 7.3A.1, the Equity Securities, if issued, will be in an existing quoted class of the Company's Equity Securities and issued for a cash consideration per security which is not less than 75% of the volume weighted average market price for securities in that class calculated over the 15 trading days on which trades in that class were recorded immediately before:

- I. the date on which the price at which the Equity Securities are to be issued is agreed by the Company and the recipient of the securities; or
- II. if the securities are not issued within 10 trading days of the date contemplated in paragraph I above, the date on which the securities are issued.

Risk of Economic and Voting Dilution

If this Resolution 3 is approved by Shareholders and the Company issues Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Facility, existing Shareholders may be subject to the risk of both economic and voting power dilution from that issue. There is a risk that:

- I. the market price for the Company's Equity Securities may be significantly lower on the date of the issue of the Equity Securities than on the date of the annual general meeting at which approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A is obtained; and
- II. the Equity Securities may be issued at a price that is at a discount to the market price for the Company's Equity Securities on the issue date for the Equity Securities

The table below shows the potential dilution of existing Shareholders on the basis of the market price of Shares of \$1.50 as at 26 September 2023 and the number of ordinary securities on issue as at the date of this Notice of Meeting used for variable "A".

The table also shows:

- I. two examples where variable "A" has increased by 50% and 100%. The number of ordinary securities on issue may increase as a result of issues of ordinary securities that do not require Shareholder approval or future specific placements under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 that are approved by Shareholders; and
- II. two examples where the issue price of ordinary securities has decreased by 50% and increased by 100% as against the current market price.

The table presents theoretical examples only, and has been prepared on the following assumptions:

- I. The Company issues the maximum number of Equity Securities available under the 10% Placement Facility.
- II. None of the Performance Rights that the Company currently has on issue are converted before the date of issue of the Equity Securities.
- III. The 10% voting dilution reflects the aggregate percentage dilution against the issued share capital at the time of issue, assuming variable A is equal to the total issued share capital. This is why the voting dilution is shown in each example as 10%.
