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Quarterly Activity Report: April – June 2024

Highlights:

- Q4 FY24 sales of \$3.57M
- Refurbished tech products surpass \$1 million in total sales within first 7 months
- \$1.0M cash on hand and \$6.2M undrawn on financing facility
- Operational cash flow flat for Q4 and for FY24
- Consistent gross margin % improvement across FY24 compared to FY23, driven by Refurbished and Household categories
- No requirement to raise capital in the foreseeable future

Pure-Play online retailer Harris Technology Group Limited (ASX: HT8) ("Harris Technology" or the "Company") is pleased to provide its activity report for the June 2024 quarter (Q4 FY24).

Operations Update

Harris Technology generated sales revenue of \$3.5M in the June quarter which was in line with reduced purchase of inventory to accommodate a subdued retail market for technology and IT products through continued macroeconomic headwinds.

A net operating cash outflow of \$71K was recorded in the quarter (Q3 FY24: \$582K outflow), delivering a year-to-date operating cash outflow of \$192K.


As of 30 June 2024, inventory on hand was \$3.5M, which was a decrease on the March 2024 value of \$4.2M. This included \$3.2M of purchased inventory during the June quarter, to reflect a pullback in inventory replenishment in line with anticipated demand for new IT products.

Demand for refurbished tech products is proving positive which has seen an increase in warehouse floor space utilised by the refurbishment team. Previously owned products being sourced now include laptops, monitors, routers, servers and docking stations with gross margins outperforming new IT products.

Harris Technology continues to witness sales growth from the refurbished tech products category which surpassed \$1 million in total sales since the business was established at the end of 2023. Continued demand for refurbished tech products is reflective of the current retail environment where these products provide a low-cost alternative to new IT products, enabling Harris Technology to capitalise on its supply chain infrastructure.

The Household category continues to generate consistent sales with seasonal winter products performing well and less impacted by the tough retail environment that has impacted new IT product sales.

Household and Refurbished categories have been reflected in the consistent increase in product margins which have now sustained 11 consecutive months over 20% and averaging 29% across FY24, increasing from 15.5% across FY23.

Harris Technology CEO, Garrison Huang commented, "The past 12 months have again been challenging for Harris Technology but we have remained disciplined in our prudent cash management strategy and allocated resources towards our product categories that return higher margin. The strategy has enabled Harris Technology to maintain cash reserves while identifying an excellent opportunity in the refurbished tech category that is proving very popular among customers keen on high quality tech, without bearing brand new product prices. We have been able to grow our refurbished product sales that has now surpassed \$1 million in total sales and kept going up."
