Response to Draft Victorian Household Waste and Recycling Service Standard 2024

SECOS Group has submitted a formal response opposing the Draft Household Waste and Recycling Service Standard 2024, which proposes, among other recommendations, to ban the use of certified compostable bioplastic caddy liners in green bins as part of Victoria's new four-stream waste and recycling system.

Certified compostable liners have a vital role to play in the success of Food Organics and Garden Organics (FOGO) programs as evidence indicates that a ban on these liners would lead to a significant reduction in FOGO capture rates, potentially decreasing diversion by up to 30%1. This would undermine Victoria's Circular Economy goals by increasing landfill waste and emissions.

SECOS advocates for the inclusion of certified compostable caddy liners in the list of accepted items for FOGO, or at minimum, granting councils the discretion to decide their use. Certified compostable caddy bin liners cannot be adequately replaced with paper caddy bags, newspaper or paper towels and will result in households having to deal with their wet food waste spilling, leaking, and creating a highly unhygienic process when separating food waste into the green bin. Paper alternatives are also a less environmentally friendly option compared to certified compostable caddy bin liners that are made with corn instead of cutting down trees.

The company remains steadfast in its commitment to supporting sustainable waste management practices and urges a reconsideration of the proposed legislation to better align with environmental objectives and industry standards.

In addition to the formal submission, SECOS has continued to actively engage with the State Government, as well as Members of Parliament from the opposition and cross bench, to advocate for the continued use of certified compostable bags in council green bin programs.

Alongside these government advocacy efforts, SECOS has executed a comprehensive public relations campaign, securing significant exposure across mainstream television, newspapers, radio, and online media. To date, over 80 pieces of coverage have been achieved, including a front-page article in the Herald Sun, prominent prime time segments on Channel 7, Channel 9 and Go! WIN News (regional Victoria), as well as features on 3AW Breakfast and 3AW Drive.










In parallel, SECOS has undertaken a marketing campaign to mobilise public opposition to the proposal through our online petition. This campaign has achieved significant engagement and expressions of support across social media channels, including Linkedln, Facebook and Instagram.



The consultation period for the Draft Service Standard officially closed at midnight on 14 August 2024. The government has indicated they will review the feedback over the coming months, with the final version expected to be published by the end of 2024. SECOS will continue to engage with the Victorian Government as appropriate through this period and keep shareholders informed accordingly.
