The Directors present their report, together with the financial statements, on the consolidated entity (referred to hereafter as the 'Group' or 'Dropsuite') consisting of Dropsuite Limited (referred to hereafter as the 'Company' or 'parent entity') and the entities it controlled at the end of, or during, the half-year ended 30 June 2024 ('1H 2024').

Principal activities

During the financial half-year the principal continuing activities of the Group consisted of:

- Cloud-based suite of data backup and archiving solutions for workplace productivity and accounting software; and
- Partner provisioning, reporting, support and billing platform.

Dropsuite's mission, to safeguard data and help businesses stay in business, has never been more prescient at a time when everyone is so dependent on digital information and the need to protect that information from cyber-attack is ever more necessary.

Dropsuite's Cloud platform allows businesses to easily backup, archive, discover and recover their data to protect themselves from all forms of data loss including cyber-attacks, and to help them comply with various regulations. Provisioning onboarding, user management and billing happens seamlessly through our IT reseller partners who have at their disposal extensive APIs and plug-ins to integrate the Dropsuite backup software into their services.

Dividends

There were no dividends paid, recommended or declared during the current or previous financial half-year.

Review of operations

The profit for the Group after providing for income tax amounted to \$273,000 (30 June 2023: \$836,000).

Revenue in 1H-24 increased 34.3% to \$18.9 million (1H-23: \$14.1 million) driven by an increase in user numbers and a slight uplift in average revenue per user ('ARPU'). The Company's annual recurring revenue ('ARR') at 30 June 2024 was \$39.9 million, a 31% increase on a constant currency basis vs 1H-23.

Gross margin contribution increased by 34.3% to \$13.1 million (1H-23: \$9.7 million).

Operating expenses increased through the period reflecting the Company's stated strategy of investment in research and development as well as go-to-market functions in FY24 aimed at driving future growth. Operating expenses, which consist of employee benefits, IT expenses, sales and marketing expenses and administrative and other operating expenses increased by approximately 44.1% to \$12.1 million (1H-23: \$8.4 million). The primary component of the lift in operating expenses was a \$2.1 million increase in employee costs reflecting the increase in headcount from 98 to 134 as at 30 June 2024.

Operating cashflow for the period grew to \$0.93m, an increase of 51% on prior period.

The Company had no debt and \$25.1 million in available cash at 30 June 2024.

EBITDA was \$0.007 million in the half-year ended 30 June 2024 compared to \$0.6 million in the previous corresponding period.

Due to the movements described above, the net profit after tax was \$0.3 million for the half-year ended 30 June 2024, compared to \$0.8 million net profit after tax in the previous corresponding period.

The Company recorded operating cash flow of \$0.9 million for the half-year ended 30 June 2024 compared to \$0.6 million for the previous corresponding period.

At 30 June 2024, Dropsuite held over \$25 million in cash and term deposits.

Operational and product overview

For the half-year to 30 June 2024, Dropsuite continued to invest in internal initiatives such as new product development, increased global sales footprint, and expanded customer service facilities to improve the backup and archive experience for Dropsuite's partners and streamline the support processes for end clients. Key activities during the half-year included:

- Adding 185k paid users in the 1H24, up 30% on 1H23, growing total paid user count to 1.35 million.
- Strong partner acquisition in 1H24, onboarding >90 new direct and >500 indirect transacting Managed Service Provider (MSP) partners, up 39% and 40% respectively on 1H23.
- Launched new backup product targeted at Entra ID (limited access/early release). Entra ID (formerly Azure Active Directory), is Microsoft's cloud-based identity and access management solution providing authentication and authorization to a wide range of Microsoft products.
- Launch of Professional Service Automation (PSA) Integration Marketplace, a centralized hub for partners to seamlessly integrate Dropsuite with their preferred PSA vendor, discover integrations, manage customers, and drive internal operational efficiencies.
- Enhanced data restore capabilities via Point-in-Time-Restore ('PITR') which allows users to restore their mailboxes as they appeared at a specific point in time. This feature, paired with our industry leading continuous backup architecture, gives partners and their clients an ability to restore all data or respond to specific cyber events.
- Dropsuite has made both its backup and archiving product offerings available to verified Not-for-profit ('NFP') organisations which will allow MSPs to provide Dropsuite's solutions to their NFP clients at a discounted price. The special priced NFP products is a common practice with many software companies, including Microsoft, Google and Salesforce.
- Completed Partner Services launch and activation of a fully managed Dropsuite service to help MSPs migrate data from other backup providers into Dropsuite.
- Several updates and feature enhancements to our core email and productivity backup and archiving products.

Outlook

Dropsuite is well positioned to deliver strong annual recurring revenue growth driven by our significant existing partner base and a growing pipeline of new partners. Market tailwinds from data security and regulation in an environment of increasing cyber-attacks are expected to remain, especially bolstered with a growing pool of SaaS applications like Microsoft 365 and Google Workspace providing a continued growth opportunity.

Over the remainder of 2024 the Company will focus on:

- Delivering ARR growth via its existing partner ecosystem, strong sales pipeline and expanded product line.
- Incremental investment in Research & Development and Go-To-Market functions in 2024 to sustain growth momentum.
- Maintaining positive cashflow and profitability performance.
- Driving product innovation to maintain our leading position as a backup vendor of choice.
- Pursuing high conviction M&A opportunities taking advantage of strong market tailwinds around data protection.

Significant changes in the state of affairs

On 21 May 2024, the Company undertook a share consolidation on a ten to one basis with approval of the shareholders.

There were no other significant changes in the state of affairs of the Group during the financial half-year.

Note 1. General information

The financial statements cover Dropsuite Limited as a Group consisting of Dropsuite Limited ('Company' or 'parent entity') and the entities it controlled at the end of, or during, the half-year (together referred to in these financial statements as the 'Group'). The financial statements are presented in Australian dollars, which is Dropsuite Limited's functional and presentation currency.

The financial statements were authorised for issue, in accordance with a resolution of Directors, on 28 August 2024.

Note 2. Material accounting policy information

These general purpose financial statements for the interim half-year reporting period ended 30 June 2024 have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standard AASB 134 'Interim Financial Reporting' and the Corporations Act 2001, as appropriate for for-profit oriented entities. Compliance with AASB 134 ensures compliance with International Financial Reporting Standard IAS 34 'Interim Financial Reporting'.

These general purpose financial statements do not include all the notes of the type normally included in annual financial statements. Accordingly, these financial statements are to be read in conjunction with the annual report for the year ended 31 December 2023 and any public announcements made by the Company during the interim reporting period in accordance with the continuous disclosure requirements of the Corporations Act 2001.

The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year and corresponding interim reporting period, unless otherwise stated.

New or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted

The Group has adopted all of the new or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period. The adoption of these Accounting Standards and Interpretations did not have any significant impact on the financial performance or position of the Group during the financial half-year ended 30 June 2024 and are not expected to have a significant impact for the full financial year ending 31 December 2024.

Any new or amended Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

Note 3. Operating segments

Identification of reportable operating segments

The Group is organised into one operating segment, being the provision of backup services. The determination of this operating segment is based on the internal reports that are reviewed and used by the Board (who is identified as the Chief Operating Decision Makers ('CODM')) in assessing performance and in determining the allocation of resources.

The CODM reviews sales revenue from the provision of backup services over time. The accounting policies adopted for internal reporting to the CODM are consistent with those adopted in the financial statements.

The information reported to the CODM is on a monthly basis.

The reportable segment financial information is therefore the same as the consolidated statement of financial position and the consolidated statement of profit and loss and other comprehensive income.

Note 3. Operating segments (continued)

Intersegment transactions

Intersegment transactions were made at market rates.

Intersegment receivables, payables and loans

Intersegment loans are initially recognised at the consideration received. Intersegment loans receivable and loans payable that earn or incur non-market interest are not adjusted to fair value based on market interest rates. Intersegment loans are eliminated on consolidation.


