# Who Dat restarts operations after Hurricane Helene

LLOG, Operator of the Who Dat assets, has advised that the Who Dat Floating Production System (FPS) resumed operations on 27 September 2024 US Central Daylight Time (CDT). Drilling operations on the Who Dat South well have also restarted. This follows a precautionary shutdown of the Who Dat facility and wells (including the Who Dat South exploration well) and evacuation of personnel, due to Hurricane Helene. The hurricane developed into a category 4 storm and made landfall in Florida, well to the east of the Who Dat facility, with maximum wind speeds in excess of 210 km/hr.

The ramp-up of production to pre-shutdown levels is expected to take several days.
