# **Quarterly Activities and Cashflow Report**

DomaCom Limited (ASX:DCL) ('**DomaCom**' or '**Company**') is pleased to announce its Appendix 4C cash flow report for the quarter ended 31 December 2024, along with the following financial and operational update.

## **Corporate Update**

- **Executive Changes:** Acting CEO Steve James resigned on 23 October 2024. The Board appointed Darren Younger as the new Acting CEO, effective 1 November 2024. Darren brings extensive leadership experience, having held key leadership positions in the financial and technology sectors. His strategic vision and operational expertise will be instrumental in driving Domacom's next phase of growth and expansion. Darren will be focusing on enhancing investor confidence, streamlining business operations, and accelerating product development initiatives.
- **Funding Facility Secured:** The company secured a further funding facility of \$1.5 million via a debt facility, available if required. This facility, provided by Samagi Capital, enhances the company's financial flexibility and supports its operational and growth objectives. The terms of the facility provide Domacom with the ability to draw down funds as needed, ensuring liquidity to meet both short-term and strategic investment requirements. This funding will assist in expanding key business areas, particularly in scaling the newly launched Homeowner Equity Fund.

## **Shareholder and Capital Structure**

- Extraordinary General Meeting (EGM) Outcomes: All eight resolutions
  presented at the EGM held on 25 November 2024 were successfully
  passed. This marks a significant milestone for Domacom as these
  resolutions pave the way for financial stability and strategic expansion. Key
  resolutions included:
  - Conversion of \$3 million in debt into equity: This move strengthens the company's balance sheet by reducing outstanding



liabilities, enhancing financial health, and improving investor confidence. By converting debt into equity, Domacom is reducing interest-bearing obligations, which frees up capital for further investment.

- Approval to issue up to 250 million new shares: This approval enables Domacom to pursue further capital-raising activities, providing the financial resources required to execute its strategic plans. The ability to issue new shares gives the company greater flexibility to attract new investors and fund ongoing expansion initiatives.
- Private Placement: The quarter concluded with the successful signing of a \$2 million private placement. This placement was secured through via a sophisticated investor who recognizes the company's growth potential. These funds will be allocated towards repayment of the \$1.5mil debt facility, product development, market expansion, and further technological advancements to ensure the company remains at the forefront of its industry.

## **Strategic Developments**

- Exclusive Licence Agreement for Bricklet Homeowner Platform: The
  company signed an exclusive licence agreement for the Bricklet
  Homeowner Platform, which represents a major strategic initiative. This
  agreement will facilitate the deployment of the platform and aid in raising
  funds to support its expansion. The Bricklet Homeowner Platform is
  designed to offer a revolutionary way for potential homeowners to access
  deposit funding via a shared equity program. The agreement grants
  Domacom exclusive rights to leverage this technology in key markets,
  strengthening its position as an industry leader in home equity financing.
- Launch of Homeowner Equity Fund: The company announced its plans to launch a new Homeowner Equity Fund in early 2025. This fund is expected to provide potential homeowners with an innovative solutions, allowing them to purchase their home with little savings. The fund aligns with Domacom's broader mission to enhance property ownership accessibility and financial flexibility for homeowners. It also represents a major growth opportunity for Domacom, positioning it as a leader in the fractional property investment space. The fund will be structured to attract wholesale and institutional investors, ensuring a diversified capital base.



## Outlook

Domacom remains focused on executing its growth strategy, leveraging its strengthened capital structure and funding facilities to drive long-term value creation. The management team continues to explore opportunities to expand its market presence, improve operational efficiencies, and enhance shareholder value. Key priorities for the next quarter include:

- Rolling out the Bricklet Homeowner Platform to new markets and securing strategic partnerships.
- Finalizing preparations for the Homeowner Equity Fund launch and engaging with potential investors.
- Continuing capital-raising activities to support business expansion and technological innovation.
- Strengthening investor relations through clear and transparent communications on financial and operational performance.

In accordance with ASX Listing Rule 4.7C, the Company provides the following additional commentary relating to the financial results included in the Appendix 4C for the quarter ended 31 December 2024.

During the quarter ended 31 December 2024, the payment of remuneration to executive and non-executive directors and their related parties amounted to \$65,000. Furthermore, a net amount of \$208,000 was paid for reimbursable expenses incurred on behalf of the related-party DomaCom Fund.

DomaCom remained focused on monitoring its costs during the quarter. Gross cash expenditure from operating activities were \$698,000 for the quarter ended 31 December 2024, compared to \$856,000 for the quarter ended 30 September 2024

\$650,000 was raised through the issue of Unsecured Convertible Notes on 25 January 2018 to various note holders with an annual coupon of 10% payable quarterly in arrears. The Unsecured Convertible Notes have reached maturity date and are now redeemable.

\$350,000 was raised on 31 August 2023 as short-term unsecured loans from two DomaCom shareholders with an initial interest rate of 15% for 3 months repayable on the completion of the capital raise announced on 10 October 2023. During the quarter, \$350k was repaid, comprising principal and interest. At period end, \$100k of principal remained payable to one shareholder.

\$2,081,000 has been raised through the issue of Tranche 1 secured convertible notes on 17 November 2023 and \$70,000 has been raised through the issue of Tranche 2 secured convertible notes on 12 December 2023 as part of the capital raise announced on 10 October 2023 with an annual interest rate of 12% per annum.

A loan of \$1,500,000 was entered into with Bricklet Ltd as announced on 4 March 2024, with a maturity date of 1 March 2026 and an interest rate of 12% per annum paid quarterly in arrears.

At 31 December 2024, the \$2,500,000 unsecured loan facility with Bricklet Ltd as announced on 16 August 2024, had been drawn down in full. The loan facility has a maturity date of 31 October 2025 and an interest rate of 13% per annum paid quarterly in arrears.

On 31 December 2024, the above \$2,500,000 unsecured loan facility with Bricklet Ltd was overdrawn to the amount of \$110,000.

Loans of \$500,000 were entered into with two investors as announced on 16 May 2024, with a maturity date of 31 October 2025 and an interest rate of 13% per annum paid quarterly in arrears.

An unsecured loan of \$200,000 was entered into with the principal IT service provider through the conversion of a trade creditor balance from 1 July 2024 with a maturity date of 1 July 2026 and an interest rate of 13% per annum paid on maturity.

An unsecured loan of \$125,000 was entered into with a Director of DomaCom on 6 May 2024 with a maturity date of 5 June 2024 and an interest rate of 13% per annum paid on maturity. This remains outstanding at 31 December 2024.
