

Drilling Commences at Thaduna




Figure 1 - Thaduna Section THD015

Sipa wishes to announce that diamond drilling has commenced on the first of four target areas designed to test primary targets in the Enigma Prospect area. The rig has commenced an initial hole designed to test whether the mineralisation intersected in holes THD12 (63 metres at 1.1% Cu) and THD13 (29 metres at 1.1% Cu) lies over a steeply dipping primary feeder zone (Figure 1).

During 2011 through to 2013 comprehensive Aircore and RC drilling programmes at the Enigma Prospect, within Sipa's 100%-owned Thaduna Copper Project in Western Australia, defined an essentially horizontal secondary copper carbonate mineralised horizon at around 80 to 100 metres below ground surface. The zone is known to extend in a northeast direction in an area of some 5 kilometres by 2 kilometres.

Exploration results for THD 12, 13 and 14 were previously reported in accordance with JORC 2004. Refer ASX announcements dated 21 and 23 September 2013. Sipa states and continues to report exploration results from THD 12, 13 and 14 under the 2004 edition of the JORC



Code. To date, these exploration results have not been reported to comply with the 2012 edition of the JORC Code on the basis that the information has not materially changed since it was last reported.
